### **Potential Sale of St. James property on the East side of Pacific Coast Hwy to fund purchase and development of new "Broadway" property.**

As you are aware, St. James Church purchased (through the Archdiocese) the old South Bay Christian Church at 128 N. Broadway Avenue, Redondo Beach in 2019 at a cost of \$9M. The new property enables us to move our ministries to one side of Pacific Coast Highway which provides us with the security of not having to cross PCH. It ensures parking for the parish will always exist. It creates for us a unified and connected campus and it is the last chance we will ever have to provide for this kind of development of the parish.

We made an initial down payment of \$2M using our funds held at the Archdiocese and selling the condo residence formally used by the nuns who were teaching at St. James School. Our Capital Campaign pledging was only at \$3.5M when Covid hit and stopped our efforts. Since that time we have paid \$1,114,000 towards the principal, \$440,000 in interest and \$375,000 in campaign and other expenses. We have \$59,000 in the account. The stalled capital campaign and the \$180,000/year interest we are currently paying is daunting.

As Covid continues we have been forced to take a new look at our remaining \$6M mortgage in addition to our Called to Renew goal of \$875,000 (half of this is returned to us for deferred maintenance projects) and our options to move the parish forward as soon as possible.

In February, 2021, I began meeting with Dan Young, a church architect and parishioner at St. James and a couple other parishioners to consider the possibility of selling the small 'upper' parking lot on our eastern side of Central Court. When that option was blocked by legal issues with city zoning I formed a larger, more serious effort in May, 2021, to consider our future property development.

The 'experts' were realtors, architects, developers and members of the Parish Finance Council to undertake a study of the parish and its finances, the status of the Community Campus property and to see if they could develop viable opportunities to move the parish forward.

We discussed the reality of our financial situation: even IF we could raise \$1M per year, it would take us at least 8 to 10 years to pay the mortgage and then we would still have to start to pay Called to Renew and raise money for rehabilitating the new (Broadway) property. Waiting 12-15 years before we could begin to use the Broadway property was not in the best interests of the parish and not an option we felt that we could consider.

As we discussed the options that the new Broadway property (1.18 acres) on the west side of Pacific Coast Highway gives for the development of the parish we unanimously agreed that the property on the east side of Pacific Coast Highway (1.25 acres) which now contains the Parish Office, Parish Center (Religious Ed and Adult Ed classrooms) and our Preschool might not be needed as those facilities would be relocated to the new property. There was a real concern that the Preschool would need a lot of space and we would have to be creative to find a place for it.

The expectation of our study group was that the sale of the property could net enough to enable us to pay off the mortgage, pay our portion of Called to Renew, and significantly enable us to rehabilitate/replace the facilities at the new property to move all our ministries to that location.

The work of our study group involved a consideration of: Parking requirements of the city for the parish with property purchase and sale; Refining the potential marketability of the eastside property; the Remodel vs Replacement costs of the Broadway buildings; facilities needed for the future development of the parish and property and Conceptual costs. With the age of the current buildings on the property the committee also recommended that we would be best served for the future by replacing the buildings rather than remodel.

The study group then met with Bishop Marc Trudeau in October to discuss the situation of parish finances, the Capital Campaign, Called to Renew and the possibility of selling the parish property to fund the development of the new property. He understood our situation and we received his support and recommendation to continue with the project through the Archdiocese.

In November we met with 35 current and past members of the Pastoral Council from the last 10 years and the Finance Council to discuss the findings of the study group. The reality we had to face was that financially, we cannot keep both properties. There was a unanimous decision that for the future of the parish we needed to keep the newly purchased property and pursue the sale of our property on the east side of Pacific Coast Highway. The only real concern was for the Preschool and our need to try to find a way to keep it.

In December we met with 30 leaders of ministries and Capital Campaign volunteers to share the same kind of discussion. As they realized the need to sell the property there was again a big concern to do whatever we can to continue with our Preschool.

Any sale and development of property needs to be discussed with several departments of the Archdiocese and have their support and approval. The first step is with the Real Estate department, which is where we are today. They are working on the valuation and marketability of the property and they should be reporting

their findings and recommendations in the next month or so. If the report is positive, it will then need the authorization from other consultative bodies for the Archbishop and need his approval. Finally a sale of this kind needs the approval from Rome.

In a few weeks if we receive an affirmative report from the Real Estate department we will be able to shift gears to create a Master Plan for moving St. James into the future.

I am so thankful for the study group who worked so hard to investigate and research all the facets of our situation and developed options for us. I look forward to working with all the parish ministries and groups as we create together a Master Plan for St. James.

If we are able to sell the property there will be a number of ministries affected. Most, if not all the groups using the Parish Center (Religious Education, RCIA, Baptism Classes, Adult Confirmation, etc.) will be able to use the classrooms at St. James School.

The Preschool presents a bigger challenge for the facilities they need. When we receive authorization to sell we should be able to create a more accurate timeline to help us plan through the transition. Certainly we will pursue a lease-back option with the buyers. We also realize that any school needs firm commitments and being in a time of so many variables will create hardships for everyone. Mrs. Bell and I will continue to work together to try and create viable options for the Preschool.

Projects of this nature always have unexpected things happen—and some of them are opportunities. We pray for the opportunities. Blessings,

Yard Patrol (4-5:15pm).


Please consider if you could give a little of your time to help ensure the safety of all of our children.

St. Oscar Romero (1917-1980) was a "Salvadoran Roman Catholic archbishop who was a vocal critic of the violent activities of government armed forces, right-wing groups, and leftist guerrillas involved in El Salvador's civil conflict (Encyclopedia Britannica)."

As a voice of the voiceless, he was an outspoken champion of the poor who were the ones most affected by the civil unrest and violence. His advocacy provoked several attempts on his life. Nonetheless, St. Oscar Romero was convinced that before all else his faith in the resurrected Christ and the values of the Gospel trumped any earthly concern or worry. He walked with complete confidence and trust. On March 24, 1980, St. Oscar Romero was assassinated while celebrating Mass. Such is often the fate of those who challenge the socio-political agendas of the day.


We may look at the example of witness of St. Oscar Romero as something extraordinary. In one sense it is. Through the power of God, an ordinary human being did extraordinary things. But, in and of himself, St. Oscar Romero was simply a humble, loving servant of God. Oscar knew not only the power of love but the risk that comes when loving unconditionally. The beauty of God's message was able to shine in and through him because he was able to step out of the way and be a vessel. One can assume that for St. Oscar Romero, one's earthly life has no merit when faith, integrity, conviction, zeal and love are jettisoned. Fear and apprehension had no grip on this man who not only saw but spoke the truth.

Do we speak the truth?

It makes us feel good to speak of God as love. But have we ever considered the ramifications of this radical message? There are assaults on human life occurring daily. More and more the value and worth of a human being is being reduced and minimalized. We are becoming widgets in the production of life. In our whole simple humble ways, we too are called to be prophets.

Knowing who you are and what is within your means to do, how can you make God's love real, stand up for what is right, and give witness to the sacredness of all that is around you?

### This Week's Topic: Conversion

**Q:** In a hymn of discipleship, our St. James Choir highlights one of the ongoing components of the Catholic faith. What is that component?

**A:** That component or element of faith is conversion.

The choir sings:

*"Break the chains that bind us,  
speak your healing word,  
and where you lead we'll follow;  
Transfigure us O Lord..."*

Those musical strains echo our faith as part of an evolving establishment of the function, formation, and the inherent character, outlook, word, and deed which are constituent parts within a process of conversion.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, in its Index, lists the many aspects of conversion, including:

- contrition
- compunction
- penitence
- remorse
- repentance
- confidence in God's grace
- first act of the penitent
- hope for God's Mercy
- the work of God
- the parable of the prodigal son
- almsgiving
- fasting and prayer
- imperfect contrition and
- perfect contrition.

The Catholic calendar marks the feast day of the conversion of St. Paul, the miraculous event which has been on the church calendar for more than 1,500 years as an unmovable feast, always on January 25<sup>th</sup>:

*"His radical transformation is demonstrative of the extraordinary redemptive power of the Gospel. As a zealous Jewish scholar he had persecuted countless Christians including the first martyr for Christ, Stephen. After his encounter with Christ, however, he became an unstoppable force for the kingdom of God."*

The *Catechism*, and the reverberating lessons to be discerned from the events that occurred on that long ago dusty road to Damascus illustrate that anyone can be created anew by the power of our living Savior.

Where you lead we'll follow, transfigure us, O Lord, to become part of that unstoppable force for the kingdom of God.


