Pastor's Letter

Sr. Mary Margaret Sentencing Update

On February 7th, Sr. Mary Margaret Kreuper appeared before the Federal Judge for sentencing after pleading guilty to charges of money laundering and wire fraud while principal of St. James School from 1990 to 2018.

Judge Wright of the Federal District Court sentenced her to one year and a day in Federal prison, followed by two years of supervised probation. He issued the sentence after hearing from attorneys for both the government and Sr. Mary Margaret as well as impacted individuals and Sr.Mary Margaret.

The Judge confirmed that in her plea agreement Sr. Mary Margaret had agreed to make restitution to the school for \$835,000, but recognized that as a religious sister she will never have the ability to pay that amount in any meaningful way. The Archdiocese is working with our insurer in a claim for payment and reimbursement for the loss.

This has been a difficult time for many of our school families and for the many students who attended St. James while Sr. Mary Margaret was in leadership. As the current Pastor of St. James, I am deeply sorry for the hurt and betrayal that you have felt. While many of the financial procedures have changed since the arrival of Mrs. Maricich, we have all learned that strict oversight is essential when any finances are concerned.

As for each of our lives, our weakest moments do not define who we are. St. James continues to provide the highest level education for our children and promotes the values of honesty and integrity for all of us. Thank you for being part of our St. James family and making us a community where God's love for each of us is enriched by his mercy.

These annual scholarships are offered to promote the involvement of young people in St. James Parish ministries.


In accordance with the terms of the **Niland Endowment**, the scholarships are offered primarily based upon need, service to the

1000 men surveyed about abortion

Men are generally the primary influencers when it comes to abortion decisions. Nearly four in ten post-abortive men with a partner (wife or girlfriend) told researchers that they had been the main influence when it came to deciding whether or not to abort their baby.

They are fathers not at birth, but at conception. Once their partner is expecting a baby, it is *their* son or their daughter as much as it is hers. Abortion culture has given many men the impression that they still have an "out" prior to birth if they can only persuade their wife or girlfriend to visit an abortion clinic or take an abortion pill.

The study also reaffirmed that it is often men who are pushing for abortion in the first place. A full 42% of men "suggested" or "strongly urged" that their partner abort their baby, with a mere 8% "strongly urging" against abortion. This means that *less than 10% of men* are willing to stand up for their baby in a life and death scenario when a decision is being made. Another 31% said they gave their partner no advice whatsoever. We know from other surveys that women often interpret this silence as an indicator that they are supposed to "take care of it," and that they are waiting for men to stand up and promise support.

Of the unmarried men surveyed, 40% indicated that they didn't want to get married in the future and another 24% said that either they or their partner didn't want marriage. Thirty-four percent of surveyed men were married when their partner got an abortion, and another 29% were cohabiting and another 29% were "seeing each other."

The stability of these relationships contributed to how men felt when discovering that they were expecting a partner with their child. Just over half said they felt nervous when they found out, with 42% saying they were scared, 30% being happy, and 28% saying they were excited. Relatively low numbers were "embarrassed" — only 14% — and only 14% said they were "angry."

Gospel Meditation

What has been the most difficult challenge you faced in your life?

Many difficult human experiences can "turn up the heat" in our lives, causing us to question the why of things or even fall into despair. Some people just somewhat passively accept what life brings, even death, and chalk difficult experiences up to happening "because they do." They seemingly endure and move on. Taking life at face value, there really is no ultimate meaning to things. It's easier to ignore that inner prompting calling us to understand why. It's there whether we admit it or not. To question or not to question — that is the question! People sometimes give up the God search because it causes too many questions. Once we open the door to the possibility of God's existence, then all of the awkward, challenging, and tragic pieces of life have to find their place.

It gets messy. But the search is so important to living. We can easily dry up and become arid, abandoning any hope for purpose and meaning because it's too difficult and non-rational at times. In searching for answers to the how and why of life, human beings also embark on a search for God. When one finally stumbles upon the real living tangible presence of God, then that discovery allows life's ironies and tensions to be held side by side with the all-encompassing totally unconditional, unmerited love of God! Then when life's heat gets turned up, difficulties and challenges abound, dryness and heartache become the norm, the soul remains in joyful repose. There is no fear.

The beatitudes celebrate life's ironies and tensions, holding them all together in the Kingdom of God. Poverty, hunger, weeping, being insulted and hated are not things we would normally associate with being God's friends. But they are! In fact, those who experience these uncomfortable realities of life are actually better off than those who do not. This is what makes Jesus' message so intriguing! Don't give up questioning. Questioning the apparent inequities and polarities of human experience will certainly challenge one's faith. But it's the only way to deepen it.

This Week's Topic: "Prayer"

The Choir sings a prayerful song, "Beyond The Days":

"Beyond the days of hope and mystery
we see a light of faith renewed,
and in our longing we look for guidance, t
o walk with you day by day.
May your presence be felt
in the whisper of your voice."

Those lyrically beautiful words are part of the language of prayer.

These days, our thoughts are filled with the usual daily challenges, now further infused with the uniquely stubborn presence of viral realities, (Oh, gosh,where is my mask?) It certainly seems that the necessity and value of prayer becomes ever more precious. "Lord, teach us to pray." That ancient spirit of needful prayer still echoes with hungry resonance today.

Q: How does the Church present the "many wellsprings" of prayer?

A: The Catechism of the Catholic Church says,
"We pray as we live, and we live as we pray...
prayer is less a function and more a disposition.
Prayer is a vital and personal relationship
with the living and true God."

The *Catechism* goes on to devote its entire fourth section to the many forms of Christian prayer, including **prayers of petition; intercession; adoration; meditation; and thanksgiving,** among the essentials of prayer as a dialogue with God.

Pope St. John Paul II beautifully captured the ethos of prayer in an Angelus Address in March 2004:
"To pray means to be spiritually immersed in God, in an attitude of humble cohesion to his will. The interior light that transfigures the human person comes from this trusting abandonment to God..."

Prayer, aside from its grace, guidance, comfort and deliverance can also bring a smile. Humor, after all, is His creation, too. There's an old joke about prayer that The Catholic Standard publication tells us goes something like this:

"One day a man prayed to God and asked, "How long is a million years to you?" The Lord replied, "About a minute." The man then asked, "How much is a million dollars to you?" God answered, "About a penny." Seeing an opportunity, the man then asked, "Well then, may I have a penny?" And God said, "In a minute."

We need not wait a million tears to say, let us pray. And we continue to do so. We pray for each other, and in times of loss; we pray for our Church; and we pray for answers, all with a humble appreciative heart, abandoning ourselves to God; a light of faith renewed.


