### **Gospel Meditation**

Sometimes, Jesus' teachings don't seem to make practical sense.

When we hear things like love your enemies and do good to them, turn the other cheek when struck, give to anyone who asks, do to others as you would have them do to you, be merciful, stop judging, forgive, and give to others, we get a bit unsettled.

After all, it's okay for God to do all of these things, but does He really want us to do them, too? Many good-hearted Christians really draw the line with some of these ideals and say, "No way!" They even remark that if someone did something hurtful to someone they loved, they would have no reservations seeking severe retribution. There is still this persistent thinking, even among those who consider themselves Christian, that a violent action deserves a violent response. Somehow, we continue to justify this.

Yet, it is most clearly against the very grain of the Gospel. Part of our difficulty has more to do with understanding God's love. We wrongly think that sinful or hurtful actions and evil people somehow are seen as lesser in God's eyes. They are not. God loves the sinner as much as He does the saint.

And, both of these inclinations exist in every human being, even those who consider themselves holy. Both the capacity for good and the disposition toward evil exist in every one of us. Viktor Frankl has this to say when reflecting on the Holocaust:

"Our generation is a realistic generation because we have learned what a human being really is. When all is said and done, man is that same creature who invented the gas-chambers of Auschwitz; but he is also that being who walked upright into those chambers with the prayer 'Shema Yisrael' on his lips."

If we believe in God, we have to act like God.

Whether we like that idea is another issue. If we don't then perhaps, we need to reconsider our faith and whether we really believe in Jesus Christ. We are made in the image of God, not the image of ourselves.

The Christian must, at all costs, leave resentment and the need for retaliation behind, lose defensiveness and bring into the mind and heart the realization of who we represent in this world.

### Catholic Q & A

#### J.P. Alegria

This week's Topic: "Keeping Christmas Well"

In the final pages of Dickens' classic, "A Christmas Carol", we read that it was always said about the newly-reformed Scrooge: "...he knew how to keep Christmas well."

Now that we are well into the first quarter of the new year, and the diminishing and discounted secular trappings of Christmas languish on store shelves, the world seems to have moved on from Christmas; its spiritual significance just a faint echo, like a discarded carol.

**Q:** How does the Church present the spiritual mystery of the Nativity of the Lord as a moveable feast that endures all the year round within the hearts of those with goodwill?

A: In *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* we read: "We have been made sharers in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share our humanity. The Church never tires of singing the glory of this (Christmas) night."

Pope Saint John Paul II in an address in January, 2004: "The celebration of Christmas has just reminded us of God's tenderness for humanity, manifested in Jesus, and he has made the ever-new message of Bethlehem ring out once again."

A Holiday Children's Choir sings: "Christmas time and the year will soon be leaving, cloaked in time 'til it's just a memory, Christmas stays if we don't forget its meaning, days go quickly by, years they multiply, we go searching for thee. And the dream is still alive, from that first December morning, and it always will survive, as long as we can see, That the dreams that we find in life are the dreams we tend to seek;

And Christmas has its promises to keep."

In Betty Smith's classic coming of age novel, A Tree Grows In Brooklyn, protagonist Francie Nolan, in a portrayal of a Christmas eve setting, essentially remarks:

"Did you see the faces of our neighbors and feel the kindness and joy of it all? Why can't people be like that all the time, not only at Christmas?

Pope Francis, in a Christmas message from the Vatican: "Let us go back to Bethlehem. Brothers and sisters let us rejoice together, for no one will ever extinguish this light of Jesus. Everything is unified when Jesus is at the center. God wants to inhabit our daily lives."

Christmas stays if we don't forget its meaning.

Let's keep Christmas well.




