Pastor's Letter

Lent & Easter Season

This week we begin our 40 day Lenten Journey on March 2nd, **Ash Wednesday**. Even in the midst of the pandemic we are called to focus on our spiritual self.

Guidelines for Lent: Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast AND Abstinence. Catholics are called to abstain from eating meat every Friday during Lent. The obligation of **abstinence** (refraining from meat) begins at the age of 14. The rule of **fasting** (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18 and 59. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.

Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:30pm
Every Friday during Lent we will gather in the Church to journey with Christ in the Way of the Cross. This Friday, Resounding Grace is featured. On March 11th, the choir will feature the Taize Stations of the Cross.

Reconciliation (Confession)

Whether you have been away for a long time or obtain these graces regularly, this will be one of the greatest blessings you'll receive while still on this earth. We'll be offering opportunities for Reconciliation every Saturday at 4 pm and special Reconciliation Services the week of April 4-7

Give it up for Lent

Giving up something we like during Lent can be a reminder of the importance of sacrifice in our lives. Every time we refrain from eating candy, going shopping, watching television, drinking alcohol, or doing something else we enjoy, we have an opportunity to express our desire to love and draw near to God.

Do something positive

Lenten penance need not be only a question of abstaining from food or drink. Now is the time to begin or reinforce something positive in your life, like regular prayer or study and prayer with Scripture. Whenever our actions are intended to fulfill the Great Commandment of loving God and neighbor, they help us live as Christians and fulfill our baptismal call. Create time and space in your routine to draw closer to God.

Lent is all about preparation: prayer, fasting, good works. A short daily reflection can be sent to your email box containing daily scripture and context and thoughts.

Where does Lent come from? Lent draws its inspiration from the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert.




Saint James Niland Scholarships



Gospel Meditation

What we say and how we say it reveals the true intentions of our hearts.

The content and manner of our speech is a window into the recesses of our souls. Our consciences, attitudes, sentiments, weaknesses, and motives are displayed. As much as we think we can hide the truth of our lives from others, we cannot. Who we really are is not only expressed on our lips but is written on our faces.

Jesus says precisely this, "For every tree is known by its own fruit." What does the fruit of our lives say about us?

Because we like to play the game of hide and seek with ourselves, in pretending that we are hiding we deflect attention others may give to us by becoming more critical of others. After all, the more time one can spend analyzing others' behavior the less time one has to look at his or herself. Often, the behaviors we abhor most in others are the very ones we are guilty of ourselves. We just don't know it yet. The more we put ourselves in the role of a judge, the more satisfaction and control we seem to achieve. Yet, what about ourselves? In focusing our attention on the beams in others' eyes, the aridity and barrenness of our lives goes unchecked.

St. Ambrose reminds us that "no one heals himself by wounding another." Bringing our brothers and sisters down by being overly critical, serves no positive purpose.

But the one who knows how easy it is to fall into sin and weakness and how quickly errors in judgment can be made, knows the depth of true compassion, mercy, and kindness.

Having recognized our own poor choices, misguided opinions, negative emotions, and ability to do horrendous things, we can be more sympathetic and understanding of where others may be.

We are designed to be mentors and guides to one another. In walking the journey together, we can help each other become the best we can be.

Catholic Q & A

This Week's Topic: "Spiritual Reading."

Monsignor Mike gifted St. James Parish with this year's volume of spiritual reading, *Life Is Messy*, by Matthew Kelly. This book is described in summary as urgent, heart-wrenching, frustrating and, "The right book at the right time."

Kelly's story and guiding philosophy found within the pages of this book are meant to assist the reader in navigating life situations through days of wonderful abundance as well as times of "misalignment." These writings personalize aspects of faith that go to real-life issues of brokenness and the potential of redemptive horizons.

Q: What other spiritual book offers validation of Kelly's writings as it explains what the Church offers, believes and celebrates?

A: Drawing on the Bible, the Mass, the Sacraments, Church Tradition and teaching, and the lives of the saints, *The Catechism Of The Catholic Church*, a contemporary map for our spiritual journey, presents challenges, guidance and answers for believers. Here is one brief summary within this powerful book that addresses some of Kelly's topics:

"By her very mission, the Church travels the same journey as all humanity and shares the same earthly lot with the world...the soul of human society in its renewal by Christ..."

Grounded in the catechism and scripture in directly applying Catholic faith to daily life, Pope St. John Paul II wrote:

"People today need to turn to Christ once again in order to receive from him the answer to their questions. Christ is the teacher who is always present in his church and in the world. True holiness lies in the effort to incarnate the gospel in everyday life, in the family, at school, and at work..."

Along these lines of thought, Reverend Butler, in his, *Lives Of The Saints*, writes:

"Jesus. The one true guide in all matters."

As we continue to question and navigate life's challenges we may recall the scene in Mark's Gospel when the Messiah enlightens his disciples as he restores the sight of a blind man just outside the village of Bethsaida, asking the broadly multi-faceted question:

"Do you see anything?"

Psalm 36, about Jesus: "In your light we see the light." A favorite verse in Ephesians 1 provides one of those redemptive horizons, clearly visible, even when life gets messy:

"May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our hearts, that we may know the hope that belongs to His call."

As the Holy Father directed in answer to the question, "Do you see anything? - Turn to Christ once again to receive from him the answers to our questions.


