Pastor's Letter

Lent Season

This Sunday is the 1st Sunday of Lent and challenges us to pay more attention to what is happening in our heart and soul. We are called to focus seriously on our spiritual self, having been reminded on Ash Wednesday that 'you are dust and unto dust you shall return' so we must 'turn away from sin and believe in the holy gospels'.

Guidelines for Lent: Abstinence

Catholics are called to abstain from eating meat every Friday during Lent. The obligation of **abstinence** (refraining from meat) begins at the age of 14. The obligation is 'in general', meaning that if for some good reason you are not able to abstain from meat on a particular Friday in Lent, you may choose to abstain on another day or perform some other act of penance or charity.

Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:30pm Every Friday during Lent we will gather in the Church to journey with Christ in the Way of the Cross.

Reconciliation (Confession)

Whether you have been away for a long time or obtain these graces regularly, this will be one of the greatest blessings you'll receive while still on this earth. We'll be offering opportunities for Reconciliation every Saturday at 4 pm and special Reconciliation Services the week of April 4-7

Give it up for Lent

Giving up something we like during Lent can be a reminder of the importance of sacrifice in our lives. Every time we refrain from eating candy, going shopping, watching television, drinking alcohol, or doing something else we enjoy, we have an opportunity to express our desire to love and draw near to God.

Do something positive

Lenten penance need not be only a question of abstaining from food or drink. Now is the time to begin or reinforce something positive in your life, like regular prayer or study and prayer with Scripture. Whenever our actions are intended to fulfill the Great Commandment of loving God and neighbor, they help us live as Christians and fulfill our baptismal call. Create time and space in your routine to draw closer to God.

Lent is all about preparation: prayer, fasting, good works. A short daily reflection can be sent to your email box containing daily scripture and context and thoughts.





A Guide for Confession

The basic requirement for a good confession is to have the intention of returning to God like the "prodigal son" and to acknowledge our sins with true sorrow before the priest.

Sin in my Life

Modern society has lost a sense of sin. As a Catholic follower of Christ, I must make an effort to recognize sin in my daily actions, words and omissions.

The Gospels show how important is the forgiveness of our sins. Lives of saints prove that the person who grows in holiness has a stronger sense of sin, sorrow for sins, and a need for the Sacrament of Penance or Confession.

The Differences in Sins

As a result of Original Sin, human nature is weakened. Baptism, by imparting the life of Christ's grace, takes away Original Sin, and turns us back toward God. The consequences of this weakness and the inclination to evil persist, and we often commit personal or actual sin. Actual sin is sin which people commit. There are two kinds of actual sin, mortal and venial.

Mortal sin is a deadly offense against God, so horrible that it destroys the life of grace in the soul. Three simultaneous conditions must be fulfilled for a mortal sin: 1) the act must be something very serious; 2) the person must have sufficient understanding of what is being done; 3) the person must have sufficient freedom of the will.

Remember

If you need help-especially if you have been away for some time-simply ask the priest and he will help you by "walking" you through the steps to make a good confession.

Before Confession


Be truly sorry for your sins. The essential act of Penance, on the part of the penitent, is contrition, a clear and decisive rejection of the sin committed, together with a resolution not to commit it again, out of the love one has for God and which is reborn with repentance. The resolution to avoid committing these sins in the future (amendment) is a sure sign that your sorrow is genuine and authentic. This does not mean that a promise never to fall again into sin is necessary. A resolution to try to avoid the near occasions of sin suffices for true repentance. God's grace in cooperation with the intention to rectify your life will give you the strength to resist and overcome temptation in the future.

Examination of Conscience

Before going to Confession you should make a review of mortal and venial sins since your last sacramental confession, and should express sorrow for sins, hatred for sins and a firm resolution not to sin again.

A helpful pattern for examination of conscience is to review the Commandments of God and the Precepts of the Church:

- 1. Have God and the pursuit of sanctity in Christ been the goal of my life? Have I denied my faith? Have I placed my trust in false teachings or substitutes for God? Did I despair of God's mercy?
- 2. Have I avoided the profane use of God's name in my speech? Have I broken a solemn vow or promise?
- 3. Have I honored every Sunday by avoiding unnecessary work, celebrating the Mass (also holydays)? Was I inattentive at, or unnecessarily late for Mass, or did I leave early? Have I neglected prayer for a long time?
- 4. Have I shown Christlike respect to parents, spouse, and family members, legitimate authorities? Have I been attentive to the religious education and formation of my children?
- 5. Have I cared for the bodily health and safety of myself and all others? Did I abuse drugs or alcohol? Have I supported in any way abortion, "mercy killing," or suicide?
- 6. Was I impatient, angry, envious, proud, jealous, revengeful, lazy? Have I forgiven others?
- 7. Have I been just in my responsibilities to employer and employees? Have I discriminated against others because of race or other reasons?
- 8. Have I been chaste in thought and word? Have I used sex only within marriage and while open to procreating life? Have I given myself sexual gratification? Did I deliberately look at impure TV, pictures, reading?
- 9. Have I stolen anything from another, from my employer, from government? If so, am I ready to repay it? Did I fulfill my contracts? Did I rashly gamble, depriving my family of necessities?
- 10. Have I spoken ill of any other person? Have I always told the truth? Have I kept secrets and confidences?
- 11. Have I permitted sexual thoughts about someone to whom I am not married?
- 12. Have I desired what belongs to other people? Have I wished ill on another?
- 13. Have I been faithful to sacramental living (Holy Communion and Penance)?
- 14. Have I helped make my parish community stronger and holier? Have I contributed to the support of the Church?
- 15. Have I done penance by abstaining and fasting on obligatory days? Have I fasted before receiving communion?

Gospel Meditation

One of the greatest temptations human beings face is leaving the truth of who they are, where they came from and who created them in pursuit of more personal satisfactions.

When we consider all that desires our attention in a given day, there are many lures that attract us to illusions about ourselves. We can easily find ourselves distracted or tired, preoccupied with preserving our status in life, social relationships, current trends, and corporate demands, and intrigued by pursuing what we perceive to be the "path of least resistance."

The daily concerns of life can quickly take our eyes off of our truth, making the empty promises of worldly accomplishments and ideologies seem so attractive.

What is at risk in giving into this temptation?

We cease giving thanks to and worshipping our Creator as we pursue our own self-sufficiency, power, and prestige.

We replace the true God with a "pet" one. While many do not totally dismiss the idea of God and pretend to remain at least remotely connected, they do not invest themselves heart, mind, and soul in the relationship either. That is why we are so easily swayed.

If something attractive comes along, we lunge for it. After all, having a position above and over everyone else is a good thing, isn't it? In more honest moments, many have to admit that they believe this to be true. The Evil One is very convincing. But he can only gain control if we allow him to.

About temptation, St. Basil remarks,

"As the pilot of a vessel is tried in the storm, as the wrestler is tried in the ring, the soldier in the battle and the hero in adversity, so is the Christian tried in temptation."

And here is found the reason for Lent. It is a wonderful opportunity to get a handle on the attractive lures of illusion that easily captivate us and bring us off track. It is also a time for some honest reflection rooted in prayer, fasting, and selfless giving that can bring us to temptation's remedy: love. Love of his Father gave Jesus resistance. It can do the same for us.

Catholic Q & A

This Week's Topic: "The Season of Lent."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church clarifies the foundational and abiding tenets of faith, such as: Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, and the teaching arm of the Church- the bishopric Magisterium. And now, once again, the season of Lent enjoins those essential elements. Along these lines, Pope Francis reminds the faithful that the Gospel proposes what he calls, "the three steps of Lent."

Q: What are the three steps of Lent?

A: The three steps are: *Prayer*, which reunites us with God; *Almsgiving*, (Charity), which reunites us with our neighbor; and *Fasting*, which reunites us to ourselves.

The Catechism presents these components as steps toward conversion by their sacred nature, reflective of, the saving role of prayer, the merits of self-denial, and the loving care of the poor.

Pope Francis said:

"Let us put the word of God at the center of the Church's life and pastoral activity. Let us listen to that word, pray with it, and put it into practice."

The *Catechism* venerates the 46 books of the Old Testament and the 27 books of the New Testament, additionally citing the four Gospels as occupying a central pace because

"Christ Jesus is their center."

Christ was at the center of the life of St. Serenus, a second century martyr, outlined in Butler's *Lives of the Saints*. St. Serenus is also known as a cultivator of the earth; a gardener. That imagery of tillage and growth and conversion in the garden has Lenten thematic parallels of prayerful, virtuous perseverance.

Reverend Butler writes:

"The garden affords a beautiful emblem of a Christian's continual progress in the path of virtue. Plants always mount upwards, and never stop in their growth until they have attained to that maturity which the Author of nature has prescribed. So in a Christian, everything ought to carry him toward that perfection..."

The choir sings a Lenten Hymn, "Turn to Me" about the expectancy of Lent, wherein the savior says,

"I call your name..."

Pope St. John Paul II wrote:

"Lent invites us to follow Christ in the mystery of his prayer...

Lent. A special time when we listen across the ages with truly searching hearts, seeking to put that prayer into practice as we walk the path of virtue that leads to perfection.


