

Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

It is with broken hearts that we have locked the doors of the church to the public. It is overwhelming as we know that the church is a place of hope and prayer for us, especially in difficult times such as the pandemic with COVID-19 that is upending our lives. Most of us have never experienced a time in our lives when our churches have been locked and such a familiar and consoling place is unavailable.

It is not out of fear of the virus and what is upon us that the doors have been closed. It is out of love for each other that we are agreeing to be church in a different way during these weeks. It is a challenge for us to reimagine how we maintain our faith and relationship with God without the community gathering together to share in the Eucharist, the Scriptures and our love for one another.

So what do we do?

We go back to the basics! Our Catholic roots of 2,000 years started in times much more difficult than this. We started with 250 years of persecution. We focused on Christ as our Lord and Savior calling us to a new understanding of ourselves as created by God in love through baptism. We listened to the stories of Jesus and his teachings captured for us in those early days and preserved in the Gospels and other writings of the New Testament. We have learned to love God with all our mind, heart, soul and strength and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

We learned to live in hope and love in spite of the obstacles of life and the world. We have set our hearts on God's love and healing grace for each one of us and the Kingdom we are called to.

Read the Scriptures, especially the New Testament. Keep Holy the Sabbath. Set your priorities in your own heart and make the time you need—each day—and especially on Sunday to read the Scriptures and open your hearts in prayers of love, gratitude, petition, thanksgiving, trust and hope. Let Christ and the Holy Spirit he has given us touch your hearts deeply. Stay united to the Church and to the community at St. James, even if we aren't able to sit in the pews for a few weeks.

With our technology today, we have the Mass available to us. At St. James the priests and deacons continue to gather daily as representatives of the whole church to celebrate the Mass and share Christ in the Eucharist for all of us. These Masses are on video and posted on our website. They are powerful ways to keep our faith strong.

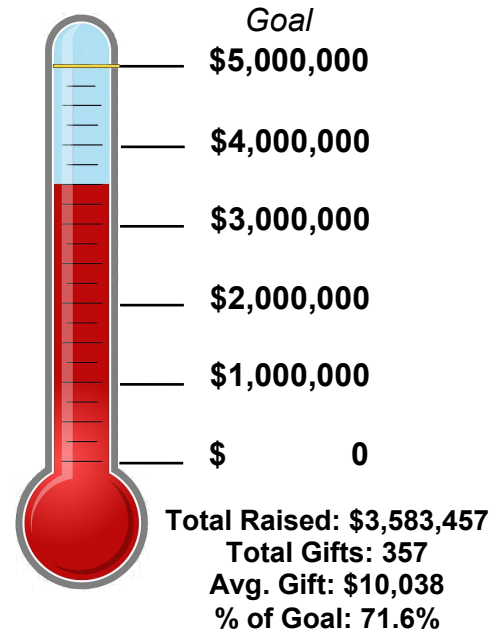

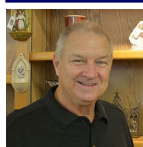

The Newest Liturgical Guidelines and How They Affect St. James

The current public health emergency has brought about fears and anxiety in the hearts and minds of many people. However, it has also unified us as a people seeking the good for the other. In these trying times, faith is to be lived with reason, prudence, and wise judgment.

The Archbishop in consultation with the Auxiliary Bishops and the Council of Priests have established liturgical accommodations in response to keeping everyone safe. These guidelines will remain in effect during the pandemic crisis.

CHURCHES

Parish churches are to be closed to the public effective March 24, 2020 until April 19, 2020 (inclusive), or until further notice.

Church offices are to be closed to the public. Parish staff members may continue working to answer telephones, answer emails, process payroll.

MASS

The public celebration of Mass has been suspended in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles until April 19th, or until further notice.

The priests at St. James will celebrate daily Mass for the intentions of the parish each day.

These Masses can be viewed on the parish website: www.SaintJames.church

The Mass from the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels may also be viewed via livestream. The weekday and Sunday Mass will be livestreamed via the LA Catholics Facebook page (facebook.com/lacatholics). For more information on additional Mass broadcasts on TV and radio, visit: lacatholics.org/emergency.

We are reminded to keep the Lord's Day holy. Some ways to do this include: reading the Gospels, praying with your families, and to joining yourself to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion.

RECONCILIATION/CONFESSION

Parishes are to suspend all regularly scheduled confession times and cancel all Lenten penance services

Pope Francis reminded us in his homily on March 20, 2020, the faithful who are physically unable to attend individual Reconciliation of the Church's teaching on Perfect Contrition. Such contrition arises when the penitent expresses a love of God above all else, the sincere desire for forgiveness, and firm resolution to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation as soon as possible when available. Perfect contrition obtains the forgiveness of sins, both venial and mortal. (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)* 1452) Priests may offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation only in danger of death or extremely extraordinary situations.

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ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Priests will continue to attend to the needs of those who ask for the Anointing of the Sick.

For the safety of the homebound, sick calls and distribution of Holy Communion for the homebound are reserved to priests and only in serious need.

BAPTISM

Unless an emergency, the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism is to be postponed.

WEDDINGS

The celebration of the Sacrament of Matrimony from now until April 19, 2020 (inclusive), or until further notice, are to be postponed.

FUNERALS

Funerals may take place only in the form of "The Rite of Committal with Final Commendation" (also known as the "Gaveside Service"). A memorial Mass can be scheduled appropriately at a later date.

CONFIRMATIONS AND FIRST COMMUNIONS

All Confirmations from now until April 19th are postponed. Confirmation at St. James is scheduled for Saturday, May 16th and so is not currently postponed.

First Communion at St. James are scheduled for Saturday, May 9th, and so are not currently postponed.

HOLY WEEK

Holy Week Services at St. James (Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday) will be celebrated privately for the parish by the priests and the video posted on our website: www.SaintJames.church Easter Vigil baptisms have been postponed.

The Archbishop will celebrate privately the Chrism Mass in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels on April 6, 2020. Instead of attending, priests and the faithful are encouraged to view the Cathedral's livestream of the Mass. Additionally, the Archbishop will celebrate the liturgies of the Sacred Paschal Triduum at the Cathedral, which will also be livestreamed.

A MEDITATION BEFORE JESUS IN THE BLESSED SACRAMENT



Come Visit Me In The Blessed Sacrament:
Won't You, Please?

O SACRAMENT MOST HOLY, O SACRAMENT DIVINE,
ALL PRAISE AND ALL THANKSGIVING BE EVERY
MOMENT THINE

MY CHILD, you need not know much in order to please Me: only love Me dearly. Speak to Me as you would talk to your mother, if she had taken you in her arms. Have you no one to recommend to Me? Tell Me the names of your relations, of your friends: after each name add what you wish Me to do for them. Ask a great deal: I love generous hearts that forget themselves for others.

TELL Me about the poor whom you want to help, the sick whom you have seen suffer, the sinner whom you would convert, the persons who are alienated from you, and whose affections you wish to win back. For all recite a fervent prayer. Remind Me that I have promised to grant every prayer that comes from the heart; and surely the prayers are heartfelt which we say for those whom we love, and who love us.

HAVE you no favors to ask for yourself? Write, if you like, a long list of all your wishes - all the needs of your soul - and come and read it to Me. Tell Me simply how self-indulgent you are, how proud, how touchy. how self-ish, how cowardly, how idle; ask Me to help you to improve. Poor child! Do not blush! There are in heaven many saints who had the same faults as you; they prayed to Me, and, little by little, they were cured.

DO not hesitate to ask for the goods of body and mind - for health, for memory, for success. I can give everything, and I always give when the gifts would make souls more holy. What do you want today, My child? Oh, if you knew how I long to do you good!

HAVE you no plans to interest you? Tell me about them. Do they concern your vocation? What do you think of? What would you like? Are you planning some pleasure for your mother for your family, for your guardian? What do you wish to do for them?

AND have you no thoughts of zeal for Me? Are you not anxious to do a little good for the souls of your friends, for those whom you love, and who, perhaps, forget Me? Tell Me who interests you, what motives urge you, what means you wish to take.

CONFIDE to Me your failures. I will show you the cause. Whom do you wish to see interested in your work? I am the master of all hearts, My child, and I lead them gently where I please. I will place about you those who are necessary to you; never fear!

HAVE you nothing to annoy you, My child, tell Me your annoyances with every detail. Who has pained you? Who has wounded your self-love? Who has treated you contemptuously? Tell Me all, and then say that you forgive and Forget; and I will give you My blessing.

DO you dread something painful? Is there in your soul a vague fear which seems unreasonable, and yet torments you? Trust fully in My providence. I am here, I see everything; I will not leave you.

ARE there about you friends who seem less kind than formerly, who neglect you through indifference or forgetfulness without your having consciously done anything to wound them? Pray for them, and I will restore them to you, if their companionship is good for you.

HAVE you no joys to tell Me? Why not confide to Me your pleasures? Tell Me what has happened since yesterday to console you, to make you look happy, to give you joy. An unexpected visit has done you good: a fear has been suddenly dispelled: you have met with unlooked-for success; you have received some mark of affection - a letter, a present; some trial has left you stronger than you supposed. All these things, My child, I obtained for you. Why are you not grateful? Why do you not say 'I thank you'? Gratitude draws benefits, and the benefactor loves to be reminded of his bounty.

HAVE you no promises to make Me? You know I read the very bottom of your heart. Men are deceived, but not God: be frank.

ARE you resolved to avoid that occasion of sin, to give up the object which leads you astray - not to read the book which excites your imagination, to withdraw your friendship from that person who is irreligious, and whose presence disturbs the peace of your soul? Will you go at once and be kind to that companion who annoyed you?

WELL, My child, go now and resume your daily work. Be silent, be honest, be patient, be charitable: and tomorrow bring Me a heart even more devoted and loving. Tomorrow I shall have new gifts for you.

How to make a Spiritual Communion when no public Mass is available

For various reasons we may be prevented from receiving the Eucharist at Mass. At these times the Church calls us to make an act of “spiritual communion,” where we unite ourselves to God through prayer. It is a beautiful way to express to God our desire to be united with him when we are unable to complete that union in the reception of Holy Communion.

As Public Masses are banned throughout the country, literally thousands of Masses are celebrated each day and, in addition to watching them on television or computer screens, the faithful can receive "spiritual Communion."

Pope Francis, after reciting a live-streamed Angelus prayer March 15, told people, "United to Christ we are never alone, but instead form one body, of which He is the head. It is a union that is nourished with prayer and also with spiritual communion in the Eucharist, a practice that is recommended when it isn't possible to receive the sacrament."

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Catholics are encouraged to continue to pray at home with their families and join to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. We are also encouraged to participate in the Holy Mass via the Internet or television. The Archdiocese will provide a livestream of non-public Masses celebrated by the priests from the Cathedral of Our Lady of Angels daily.

St. Jean-Marie Vianney said, “If we are deprived of Sacramental Communion, let us replace it, as far as we can, by spiritual communion, which we can make every moment; for we ought to have always a burning desire to receive the good God”.

St. Thomas Aquinas described Spiritual Communion as “an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him.”

St. Teresa of Jesus wrote, “When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice, by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you.”

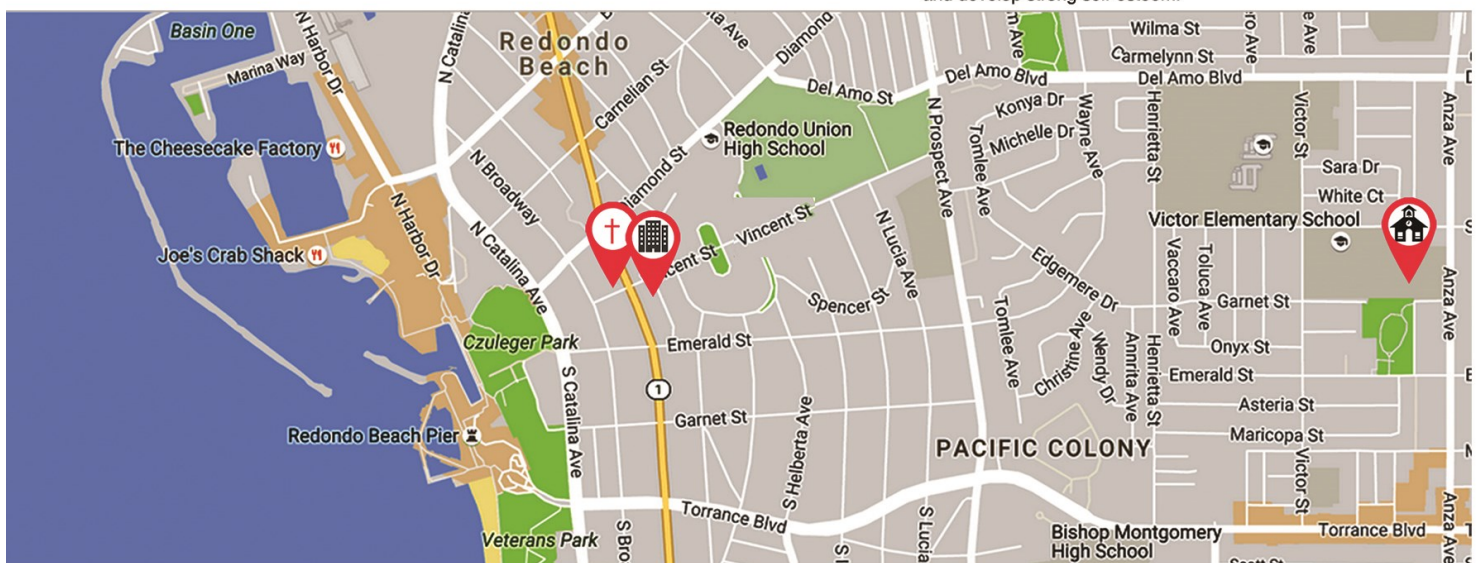
