Pastor's Corner

No Church Gatherings Extended to May 15

It has been a very different experience recently with having everything on hold beyond 2 or 3 weeks—and with those dates constantly extended. Archbishop Gomez has been working closely with Los Angeles leadership and the Health Department to respond appropriately in our parishes. With the support of the Priests' Council, he has extended the Safer at Home policy for the Church to May 15th and extended his dispensation for the Sunday obligation through that time.

The extension into May means that our First Communions scheduled for May 9th and our Confirmation with Archbishop Gomez on May 16th are both being postponed until such time as we can gather again in the church. One thing we've been challenged to deal with is 'flexibility'—which is much easier for some than for others—but we'll all get through this…and do it with a peace of mind and joy of heart that only Christ can give in these sacramental moments. The social distancing also puts on hold baptisms, confessions, weddings and funerals.

Thank you for your continued financial support

Thank you so much to those who have begun to use *Faith Direct* for your online financial support of the parish. It currently provides 27% of our Sunday collection and has been a lifeline for us during these past 6 weeks. Parishioners have also started using the *BillPay* feature of their banks for automatic payments of parish support or *mailed* or *brought their Sunday envelopes* into the *office* or *rectory mail slot*. To all of you, THANK YOU. Even while being closed to the public, the parish staff is busy keeping up with work that needs to be done.

After this weekend we will have a chance to see the finances for April and get a better idea of where we are. The Easter collection, normally \$45,000 was only \$14,000 this year, so we know we are in a deficit situation, relying on our operating reserves. We continue to reduce all of our expenses as we can.

May the Lord continue to bless you and keep your families safe.

Church Support Drops by 50%

At our recent Priest Council Meeting with Archbishop Gomez, he asked us how the pandemic is affecting the parishes.

All 20 pastors at the meeting, including me, reported that their Sunday Offertory collection was at 50% to 60% of normal, and all of them were becoming very worried about how their parish would survive financially through the pandemic and what would happen to the parish staff if they needed to be laid off.

At St. James we are trying our utmost to reduce our expenditures, which will enable us to make it financially to the end of June, but then the parish will have depleted all its funds.

(The monies collected for Our Faith. Our Future. are held in a Restricted Account and cannot be used for parish operating expenses.)

The parish staff is continuing to call parishioners to see how you are doing and are continuing to provide spiritual enrichment through daily Masses and messages posted on our website: **SaintJames.church.**

Thank you for the many calls of appreciation that we can still be together as a parish family as best we can with this outreach.

How to make a Spiritual Communion when no public Mass is available

For various reasons we may be prevented from receiving the Eucharist at Mass. At these times the Church calls us to make an act of "spiritual communion," where we unite ourselves to God through prayer. It is a beautiful way to express to God our desire to be united with him when we are unable to complete that union in the reception of Holy Communion.

As Public Masses are banned throughout the country, literally thousands of Masses are celebrated each day and, in addition to watching them on television or computer screens, the faithful can receive "spiritual Communion."

Pope Francis, after reciting a live-streamed Angelus prayer March 15, told people, "United to Christ we are never alone, but instead form one body, of which He is the head. It is a union that is nourished with prayer and also with spiritual communion in the Eucharist, a practice that is recommended when it isn't possible to receive the sacrament."

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Catholics are encouraged to continue to pray at home with their families and join to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. We are also encouraged to participate in the Holy Mass via the Internet or television. The Archdiocese will provide a livestream of non-public Masses celebrated by the priests from the Cathedral of Our Lady of Angels daily.

St. Jean-Marie Vianney said, "If we are deprived of Sacramental Communion, let us replace it, as far as we can, by spiritual communion, which we can make every moment; for we ought to have always a burning desire to receive the good God".

St. Thomas Aquinas described Spiritual Communion as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him."

St. Teresa of Jesus wrote, "When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice, by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you."

The Newest Liturgical Guidelines and How They Affect St. James

The Archbishop in consultation with the Auxiliary Bishops and the Council of Priests have established liturgical accommodations in response to keeping everyone safe. These guidelines will remain in effect during the pandemic crisis.

CHURCHES

- Parish churches are closed to the public until May 15th, 2020 or until further notice.
- Church offices closed to the public. Parish staff members will answer telephones and answer emails.

MASS

- The priests at St. James will celebrate daily Mass for the intentions of the parish each day. These Masses can be viewed on the parish website: <u>www.SaintJames.church</u>
- The Mass from the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angles may also be viewed via livestream. The weekday and Sunday Mass will be livestreamed via the LA Catholics Facebook page (facebook.com/ lacatholics). For more information on additional Mass broadcasts on TV and radio, visit: lacatholics.org/emergency. We are reminded to keep the Lord's Day holy.
- Some ways to do this include: reading the Gospels, praying with your families, and to joining yourself to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion.

RECONCILIATION/CONFESSION

All regularly scheduled confession times are cancelled.

Pope Francis reminded us in his homily on March 20, 2020, the faithful who are physically unable to attend individual Reconciliation of the Church's teaching on Perfect Contrition. Such contrition arises when the penitent expresses a love of God above all else, the sincere desire for forgiveness, and firm resolution to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation as soon as possible when available. Perfect contrition obtains the forgiveness of sins, both venial and mortal. (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)* 1452) Priests may offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation only in danger of death or extremely extraordinary situations.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Priests will continue to attend to the needs of those who ask for the Anointing of the Sick.

For the safety of the homebound, sick calls and distribution of Holy Communion are reserved to priests and only in serious need.

BAPTISM

Unless an emergency, the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism is to be postponed.

WEDDINGS

All Weddings until **May 15th, 2020** or until further notice, are to be postponed.

FUNERALS

Funerals may take place only in the form of "The Rite of Committal with Final Commendation" (also known as the "Graveside Service").

A memorial Mass can be scheduled appropriately at a later date.

CONFIRMATIONS AND FIRST COMMUNIONS

Confirmation at St. James is **postponed**. First Communions at St. James are **postponed**.
