Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends and Families of St.James,

During this past week I have had a chance to meet with the Archbishop at the Council of Priests Meeting as well as participate in a web meeting of the Archbishop with all the priests of the Archbishoese.

While the timeline for opening our churches all depends upon the status of COVID-19 and policies put in place by the State and Counties, we did talk about the process that we need to prepare for as things slowly open up.

It is obvious that our churches will open slowly as well, in various stages.

Stage 1:

Our first move is to work for the ability to unlock the doors of our churches for personal prayer. Because our first priority is to ensure the safety and health of our parishioners, we will do so with volunteer monitors in the church to greet everyone, to make sure hands and church are sanitized, masks worn and everything proper. Our Pastoral Council recommended this week that when we initially open it should be for 2 hours a day to get our procedures in order and then as volunteers are available, to expand to more hours. Hopefully we can unlock the doors within the next 4 weeks.

During this stage, depending upon the number of persons we are allowed to have in the church, we hope to be able to consider SMALL events such as small weddings, funerals, baptisms.

Stage 2:

As everyone is allowed to open facilities and businesses to greater numbers our next goal is to begin to celebrate Daily Mass. Such things as sanitizing, masks and distancing will still be a priority. The number of people able to attend will depend on the established percentage of the occupancy of the church. I expect this would go on for some weeks/months, gradually increasing occupancy.

Stage 3:

When the occupancy percentage becomes large enough, we can consider beginning to celebrate Mass on Sundays. Distancing will be the norm and I expect that sanitizing and masks will still be required. The number of people in the church and the number of Masses we celebrate will be determined by the policies in place at that time and our ability to sanitize the Church between Masses. Because this timeline is unknown, the Archbishop has extended the dispensation for attending Sunday Mass until further notice. This is especially true for our Seniors, as the most vulnerable, who may not be able to attend Mass for many months.

Throughout all of this, monitors will be needed, so the

number of volunteers we have will be important. We all know that many of our people in ministries are our seniors, who are the most vulnerable. The commitment of our younger parishioners, young adults and college students to step up will be critical.

We will continue to update you as we receive information from Archbishop Gomez.

May the Lord continue to bless you and keep your families safe..



Church Support Drops by 50%

At our recent Priest Council Meeting with Archbishop Gomez, he asked us how the pandemic is affecting the parishes.

All 20 pastors at the meeting, including me, reported that their Sunday Offertory collection was at 50% to 60% of normal, and all of them were becoming very worried about how their parish would survive financially through the pandemic and what would happen to the parish staff if they needed to be laid off.

At St. James we are trying our utmost to reduce our expenditures, which will enable us to make it financially to the end of June, but then the parish will have depleted all its funds.

(The monies collected for Our Faith. Our Future. are held in a Restricted Account and cannot be used for parish operating expenses.)

The parish staff is continuing to call parishioners to see how you are doing and are continuing to provide spiritual enrichment through daily Masses and messages posted on our website: SaintJames.church.

Thank you for the many calls of appreciation that we can still be together as a parish family as best we can with this outreach.

How to make a Spiritual Communion when no public Mass is available

For various reasons we may be prevented from receiving the Eucharist at Mass. At these times the Church calls us to make an act of "spiritual communion," where we unite ourselves to God through prayer. It is a beautiful way to express to God our desire to be united with him when we are unable to complete that union in the reception of Holy Communion.

As Public Masses are banned throughout the country, literally thousands of Masses are celebrated each day and, in addition to watching them on television or computer screens, the faithful can receive "spiritual Communion."

Pope Francis, after reciting a live-streamed Angelus prayer March 15, told people, "United to Christ we are never alone, but instead form one body, of which He is the head. It is a union that is nourished with prayer and also with spiritual communion in the Eucharist, a practice that is recommended when it isn't possible to receive the sacrament."

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Catholics are encouraged to continue to pray at home with their families and join to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. We are also encouraged to participate in the Holy Mass via the Internet or television. The Archdiocese will provide a livestream of non-public Masses celebrated by the priests from the Cathedral of Our Lady of Angels daily.

- **St. Jean-Marie Vianney** said, "If we are deprived of Sacramental Communion, let us replace it, as far as we can, by spiritual communion, which we can make every moment; for we ought to have always a burning desire to receive the good God".
- **St. Thomas Aquinas** described Spiritual Communion as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him."
- **St. Teresa of Jesus** wrote, "When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice, by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you."
