St. James Synod Sessions

Pope Francis has summoned the Church to participate in a worldwide synod.

Instead of an assembly of bishops in Rome only, Pope Francis invites the whole People of God to participate in the synod—to "journey together" with our brothers and sisters in Christ along the path of renewal, guided by the Holy Spirit. Every parish—everywhere in the world.

St. James' Synod Sessions **'Walking With Jesus'**, will begin **next Sunday afternoon (March 27) and everyone is invited to come join us.** We encourage all to participate: young adults and seniors, active parishioners and those who have drifted away, as well as those who feel marginalized from the Church. By sharing our faith stories we will listen to each other and reflect together on how the Holy Spirit is calling our parish and the Universal Church to move forward. It is our time to speak—and to listen to each other.

Our reflections will become part of a report sent to the U.S. bishops and then, on to Rome and the Pope, but the real impact will be for **US** at St. James as we discern how we can be 'church' better together.

Carrying the Cross

Bat noon darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And at three o'clock, Jesus cried out In a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lena sabachthani?' which is translated, "my God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" Some of the bystanders who heard it said, "Look, he is calling Elijah." One of them ran, soaked a sponge with wine, put it on a reed, and gave it to him to drink, saying "wait, let us see if Elijah comes to take him down." Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. -Mark 15:33-37

In trying to understand the true power of stewardship, we need not look any further than the cross. It serves as a tremendous example of giving everything away freely for God and the people of God. Jesus answered the call, regardless of the cost, and the cost was life itself.

Most of us will never have to sacrifice our lives in response to God's call. But there are Christians all across the globe that do every day. Missionaries have died due to violence or disease. Activists stood up for the basic rights of others and have lost their own right to live. Men and women who swore to keep the peace or rescue others from disaster have traded a lifetime with family and friends for the sake of the vulnerable. These people answered that call and responded with courage and commitment.

But even though our sacrifice might not be as great, it does not diminish the power of the response. Perhaps through our small everyday actions, someone will be touched by God and then transformed. It is not the size of the3 sacrifice that counts, but the complete willingness to give that sacrifice. Jesus' Sacrifice is sufficient for the salvation of all humanity. Now, we are called to translate that reality into our somewhat simple lives.

On those days when being a good steward seems too difficult, look to the cross and find strength in a God who knows how hard this earthly life can be at times. Look to fellow stewards who are carrying their crosses and find empathy and companionship. Reflect on the liuves of saints and those who gave their lives be3cause of their love of God. Then go forth into a world that so badly needs Jesus and give thanks for knowing how hard the day otherwise would be without him.

Gospel Meditation

Deserts can be lonely, isolated, and treacherous places.

When a person wanders in a desert, they can easily get disoriented, dehydrated, confused, lost, and vulnerable. Temptation is at its peak, especially when confronted with something that may offer some respite or relief, even a mirage.



Deserts can bring us to our weakest moment and tempt our faith. The Christian journey can be described as a desert experience as we vacillate back and forth, falling victim to the

mirages of our lives versus the true, life-giving water offered by God. We need a burning bush experience in our lives that convinces us of the power of God and reveals Him as the "I am" of all existence.

Moses was leading his flock across the desert when he found himself at Mount Horeb. Mountains give us a fuller perspective of life, a panoramic view of what would otherwise be hidden from the limitations of our sight. That's when Moses met God. We have to find our way to a mountain experience where our vantage point can take on a wider view of life. Many things can do this for us: the birth of a child, the death of someone we love, the joy that comes from marveling at the beauty of God's work, the pondering of life's mysteries, and the ache of longing found deep within our souls. There are many things in life that can wake us up, give us a clearer, better view of things and become occasions where a bush may burn and God's presence as the eternal uncreated One is revealed.

God is very patient and gives us the time and space we need to figure things out and bear some good fruit. He doesn't rush to cut us down or get frustrated with our barrenness. But we have to remember that the desert journeys of our lives come with some risks. The major risk is that we will mistakenly believe that the mirages are real. Thus, we fall victim to thinking that the respite and refreshment we seek is discovered in a place other than where it actually is. Our faith and the life of the Church are the safeguards we need to keep us properly orientated so that we don't get lost or confused and stay on course.

'Do not fear, for I am with you; Do not be afraid, for I am your God.

I will strengthen you, I will also help you, I will also uphold you with My righteous right hand.'

This Week's Topic: "The Guidance of the Good News"

In his homily on the first Sunday of Lent, Father Jim underscored the value of the scripture readings on that day, pointing out that within the liturgy we turn to the scriptures for direction. What follows is comfort and illumination along this journey of faith. In a Lenten Season, a season of prayer, one can truly experience a renewed appreciation of sacred scripture and sacred tradition amid the good news that is the gospel of the Lord.

Q: What else does the Church teach about the guidance of the good news?

A: The Catechism of the Catholic Church contains many entries about prayer and sacred scripture.

"The Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures..."

Here the *Catechism* quotes Psalm 119, echoing Father Jim's emphasis on scriptural direction,

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

The Catechism describes the "senses" of scripture:

The *literal* sense; the *spiritual* sense; the *allegorical* sense; the *moral* sense;

and finally in validation of our theme of directionality: the *anagogical*, (Greek), sense, meaning in a way that leads us.

In this discussion about the profession of faith, the *Catechism* quotes St. Therese of Lisieux. "The Little Flower" speaks about her prayerful way and about that aspect of illumination:

"But above all it's the Gospels that occupy my mind when I'm at prayer; my poor soul has so many needs...I'm always finding fresh lights there..."

Paragraph 104 in the catechism stands out as instructive by way of wonderfully sublime imagery: "In Sacred Scripture, the Church constantly finds her nourishment and her strength for she welcomes it not as a human word, but as what it really is, the word of God. In the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet his children, and talks with them." It may be fitting to close this discussion of Lenten prayer, and the guidance of the good news, with the words of Pope St. John Paul II who spoke at the World Day of Prayer in 1995:

"Sacred scripture is a sure guide, when it is read, welcomed, and meditated upon in the church. Coming to know the events involving the major figures of the Bible and, above all, the reading of the gospels provide moments of unexpected insights."




