Pastor's Letter

Ukraine, Confessions & Palm Sunday

We would like to thank everyone who responded to the **special collection for Ukraine** over the last 2 weekends. Your loving generosity brought in just over **\$10,000** from the in-pew collections which have been sent into the Mission Office at the Archdiocese. I know that many others used the information in the bulletin to send support directly to the Mission Office. All funds are immediately forwarded to the U.S. Bishops Conference for distribution to assist the people in Ukraine and the millions of Ukrainian refugees who have fled the country.

While we have watched so much hostility between people in the last 2 years and pray for world peace, we also realize that any change must begin from our own hearts.

This week we have **3 local Penance Services** where we can initiate that change of heart and reconciliation to begin that transformation.

Monday, April 4th at 7:30pm at American Martyrs Church, Manhattan Beach

Tuesday, April 5 at 7:30pm at St. James Church, Thursday, April 7 at 7:30 pm at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, Hermosa Beach

You can attend any evening and there will be many priests hearing Confessions on each night.

Palm Sunday on April 9-10, begins our Holy Week services. As we have done in the past 10 years, we will have large 10-12 foot palm branches to use for the Palm Blessing and 'Entry into Jerusalem' at the beginning of each Mass. We need 24 volunteers to hold the palms at each Mass, so we ask you to arrive a few minutes early and notify one of the ushers of your readiness to help. A parent and child can even team together to hold one branch and make it a family event. Red is the color of the day and remember to get your personal palms at the door of the church as you enter.

We are accepting applications for the 2022 – 2023 school year! Plan early to visit St. James and discover the difference.



This Week's Topic: "Choices"

Life is full of choices.

Q: What about spiritual choices?

A: Amid the season of Lent, and within sight of the promise that is the saving gift of Easter, the *Catechism* presents teachings about those choices that guide us toward "spiritual progress." Paragraph #543 offers a brief summary:

"All Christians are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity. The way of perfection passes by the way of the Cross. There is no holiness without renunciation and spiritual battle."

That imagery of renunciation and spiritual battle takes us back to those forty days in an arid desert which provided the setting of that particular interaction between the forces of good and of evil. The season of Lent centers Jesus as the exemplar, par excellence, of spiritual choice and the way of perfect holiness.

Pope Francis spoke at a Mass in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem in the winter of 2000. In his homily he talked about the importance of spiritual choices:

"To respond to God's voice and to **choose to do good** is the most sublime use of human reason. It is, in a real sense, to make the choice between life and death."

The *Catechism* offers the lives of the saints and the choices they made as another source to be mined for spiritual guidance:

"Thus, the holiness of the people of God will grow in fruitful abundance, as is clearly shown through the lives of so many saints. The saints had to bear sufferings and temptations far greater than yours. How did they overcome them? By the love of Christ. Nourish this pure love by meditating on the mysteries of Christ's life, and above all by devotion to the Holy Eucharist, which is the antidote against sin and the pledge of eternal life"

Church history teaches that the saints ultimately chose holiness with amazingly zealous virtue against trials and challenges to their faith. Another example of spiritual choices made along the way of the Cross by those who are saintly and otherwise can be found in Hebrews Chapter 12 which references that enduring spirit, everpresent in the face of trials:

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith."

Spiritual choices. They seem more critically acute during the season of Lent.

Responding to God's voice by choosing to do good...

Gospel Meditation

We love to make examples out of those who have erred and done wrong.

Publicly punishing others serves as a means of demonstrating the consequences for what is deemed inappropriate or wrongful behavior. While this may appear an effective way of achieving conformity to established rules, it runs the real risk of distorting motivation. Obviously, we want people to do what is right and pursue healthy, virtuous behaviors and ideals. But is fear of punishment ever the best motivation for avoiding one action in favor of another?

Doing something out of fear is never healthy. Focusing exclusively on our behavior and what others expect or think, leads to living life with a selffocused superficiality. We become more concerned about protecting ourselves from something negative and unpleasant, than investing ourselves in the freedom, wonder and awe of being human! We can still find our way to the unacceptable or inappropriate behavior as long as we do not get caught! Being a whole, focused, and God-centered



human being requires more. It demands an investment of the heart. Virtuous, moral, and mature lifestyles reflective of the Gospel necessitate love.

When we experience and recognize love, God's unconditional love, in the depth of our soul, we fall in love with what we have found. We then find ourselves leaving destructive and sinful actions behind in search of something more holy, dignified, true, integral, and loving. This is really "mercy realized." God's tremendous, loving, eternal forgiveness and willingness to bring us back to something more real and tender is transformational. The respect for myself that I receive from God is so life changing that it causes me to run quickly away from anything sinful and self-destructive to things that are whole and holy.

There are many people who want nothing more than to judge or criticize us. What would actually stoning the woman caught in adultery really accomplish?

Nothing more than the inflation of the already self-righteous egos of a few men who think they have power. They have no power because they are sinners too, just like everyone else. What all of us have is the humble ability to express sorrow for pursuing destructive thoughts and actions and receive the power of God's mercy. Then, Jesus' request to "go and sin no more" will be one we proudly heed and follow


