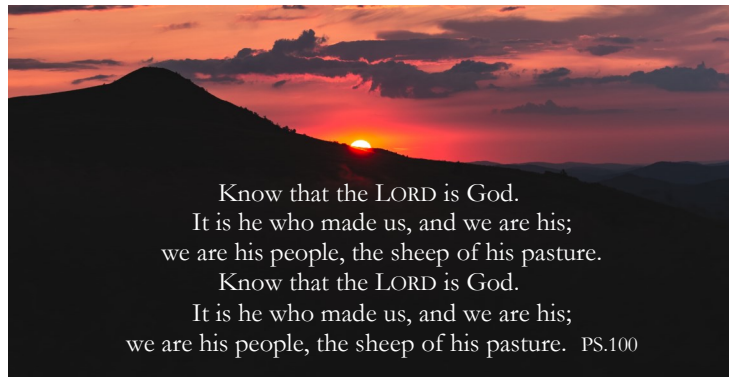

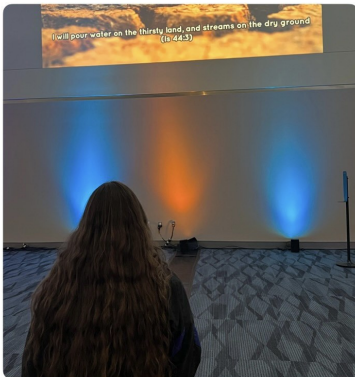

This Week's Topic: "Walking With The Lord"

The Catechism is described as a map for our spiritual journey toward transformation.

That map often unfolds along roads marked by scriptural epiphanies of striking realization. For example, there is Saul's conversion on the road to Damascus. And there's the Samaritan who travelled along the road from Jerusalem to Jericho, illustrating who our neighbor is.

And now we've reached the road to Emmaus
With an abundance of theological reflections, Luke's gospel is called,

"The longest single post-resurrection narrative in the gospels"

That prompts the immediate question:

Q: "What are you discussing as you walk along?"

A: Luke Chapter 24 relates that the resurrected Jesus put that question to Cleopas and a second disciple on the road to Emmaus, who, with burning hearts, later had their eyes opened in the breaking of the bread. Within that particular communion, those disciples recognized in the resurrection what the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* calls,

"A transcendent event. An event that surpasses history, that, we too, might walk in the newness of life."

Pope Francis called the events discussed on the road to Emmaus,

"A symbol of our path to faith."

Speaking from the window of the Vatican Apostolic Palace in 2014, the Holy Father spoke to pilgrims, themselves on their own roads of discernment:

"The Scriptures and the Eucharist are the indispensable elements for the encounter with the Lord.

Often, we too arrive at Sunday Mass with our worries, our difficulties and our disappointments.

Life at times wounds us and we proceed sadly towards our "Emmaus", turning away from God's plan. We drift away from God. But the Liturgy of the Word accommodates us. Jesus explains the

Scriptures to us and reignites in our hearts the warmth of faith and hope; and in Communion he gives us strength."

In that Communion, and with the promise of the Passover fulfilled, the Choir sings a song of communion called *"Taste and See":* "

With one voice, O people, rejoice in our God."

And in a song of petition and prayer called, *"Open My Eyes,"* we sing:

"And we'll see God's face, in places we never knew; Open my eyes Lord, help me to see."

Walking with the Lord, and with burning hearts,
our eyes are open...

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Pope St. John Paul II rightly taught,

"To believe in Jesus is to accept what he says,
even when it runs contrary to what others are saying.
It means rejecting the lure of sin,
however attractive it may be,
in order to set out on a
difficult path of Gospel virtues."

Acceptance, rejection, suffering, betrayal, fear, reluctance, persecution, and painful, undeserved and unjust death are all played out in dramatic fashion today.

Jesus spoke of God's unconditional love, mercy, and forgiveness. Who doesn't like hearing about love, especially God's? Jesus did not have backs turned on him, face intense suffering, and succumb to a horrific death because he spoke of God's love. All of those things occurred because of the implications of actually believing in God's love.

God's love comes with an intimate and equal bond with love of neighbor. This moves the believer outward to truly see their brothers and sisters as equals and compels them to work for a world that mirrors God's kingdom: a world based on justice, peace, mercy, and forgiveness. Sometimes, people want to keep God's love to themselves and use it solely for their own benefit. When they only want to use God's love to justify their own intentions and for their own projects, problems occur.

Sin makes something hurtful, destructive, and self-serving look very attractive and justifiable. The lure of sin creates friends who begin to believe the lie that the sin expounds. This is what happened on Calvary. When you begin actually doing what Jesus is saying and translate love into action, it inevitably will upset popular and longstanding conventions and structures. Many of these serve to protect status, foster personal gain and success, and further divide those who have from those who do not. Most people who hear the Gospel are attracted to what they hear, at first. When they realize that it means standing apart from popular opinion, even if that opinion is against the Gospel and sinful, they cower back in fear and join the throngs shouting,

"Crucify him!"

There is an ambivalence found in many believers as they struggle with whether their belief is strong enough "to set out on the difficult path of Gospel virtues."

It takes a lot of courage to admit that the system is broken. It takes even more courage to point out the sin. And it takes an unbreakable love of God to then accept the consequences of doing so.

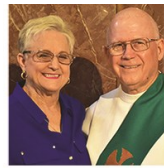

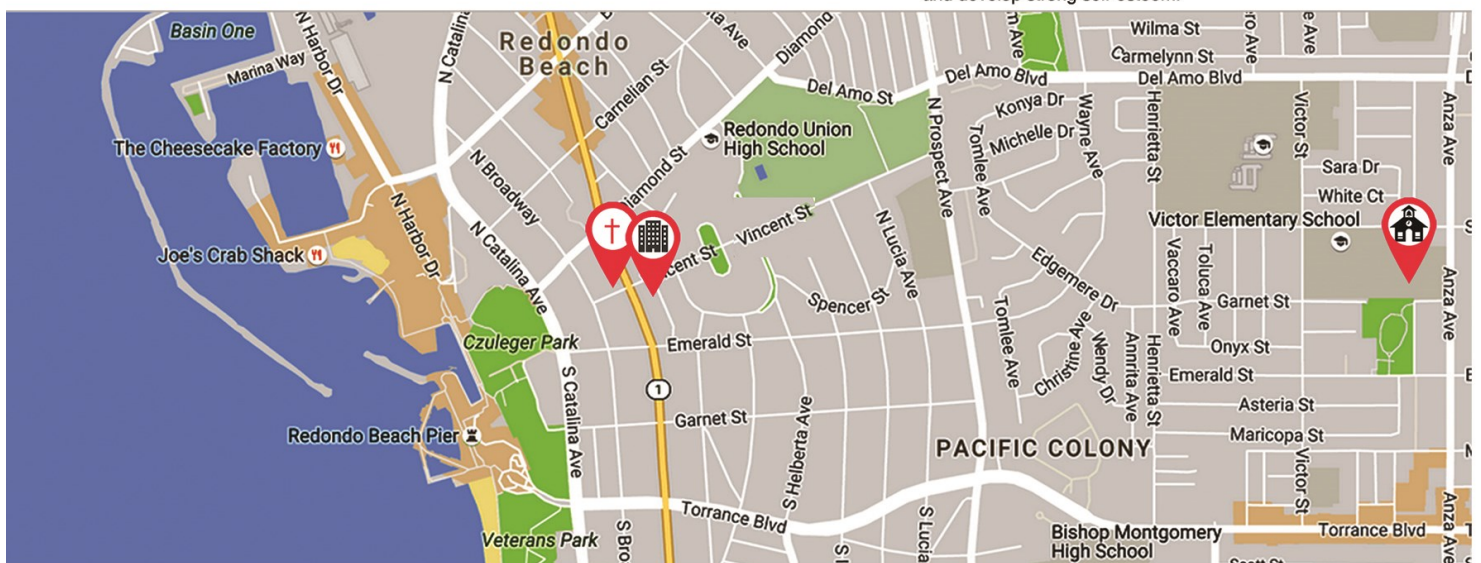
