

Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,





This Week's Topic: Easter!

"This is the Night...O truly blessed night..."

These lyrics, mystically echoing once again among the gathered faithful, flow from an Easter sacramental. It's the solemn, majestically dramatic song of the Exsultet.

This song of vigil is described as being reflective of,

"The anticipatory fulfillment of Old Testament theology, highlighting the life-giving Eucharist in proclamation of the resurrection of our Lord."

The spiritual and temporal themes of darkness and light are part of a vigil that, by its very definition, is a call to "watch and pray."

Q: What further illuminative spiritual insight is present amid the flickering flame of the Paschal candle?

A: The Catechism, among its broad range of teachings about the transcendent events of Easter, states:

"Christ's Resurrection is the fulfillment of the promises of both the Old Testament and of Jesus himself during his earthly life. The Paschal Mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life."

St. John Paul II remembered the women present in the events leading up to and including the Resurrection and its aftermath:

"He has risen This is the heart of our faith. Mary was a silent witness of all these events. Let us ask her to help us also to receive the fullness of this Easter message."

A Jesuit resource looks beyond the linen wrappings of the empty tomb to ponder and treasure life among the living:

"Let him say not merely, "Christ is risen", but "I shall rise." Our Lord has written the promise of the resurrection, not in books alone, but in every leaf in springtime. Easter is meant to be a symbol of hope, renewal and new life.

Easter taught us this -

that life never ends and love never dies."

May we proceed now to sing the Alleluia with joyful faith renewed during these 50 days of Eastertide, culminating at Pentecost, and throughout our faith journey.

Gospel Meditation

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

There are many stones in our paths that keep us from truly living and being free.

Some of these boulders have been there for a very long time. They have been there so long that they have even settled into the soil of our lives with other weeds, vines, and compacted soil keeping them firmly in place.

We find them hard to move and trying to do so can be exhausting. What are these suffocating albatrosses that keep us so tethered and immobile? They are many things.

They are past childhood wounds and hurts that stem from disappointment, rejection, or abuse. People may have told us we were unwanted, that the world is frightening, that there are only some acceptable feelings you can have and others you cannot.

We may have tried to love someone or struggled to figure out how and were met with rejection. Maybe we trusted someone completely and were betrayed. We come to life collecting barnacles that begin to attach to other barnacles and before you know it, we have a mass of solid matter blocking our vision and keeping us from moving.

We live in fear.

We are afraid of losing what we have, afraid that the future will be empty, afraid that we won't succeed and even more afraid that we will not be loved. There is so much fear. Didn't Jesus tell us not to worry and to not be afraid? Either we believe in the message of Easter, or we don't!

Go confidently into the night. Walking with God you will find the light and strength you need. Often without even knowing, God will move those boulders and stumbling blocks that bind us and, with putting one foot in front of the other and looking forward, we will move.

The resurrection of Christ is really all about receiving the gifts of trust and faith and doing new things. The rocks that bind us keep us spinning the same wheels and doing the same things.

When was the last time you threw caution to the wind and actually did something totally out of character and different?

This is where we find God, in the spontaneous, the adventurous, the fun, and the creative choices we make!

God is not boring and stuck.

God is exciting and engaging.

Jesus Christ is risen from the dead!

Find a way to trust that this is true and live.


