Divine Mercy of Jesus

'But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. Instead, one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once blood and water came out.' Jn. 19:33-34

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina

in her convent cubicle and directed her to "paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You" (Diary of St. Faustina, 47-48)

"The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. These rays shield souls from the wrath of My Father. Happy is the one who dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him." (Diary 299)

"Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet" (Diary 699). In her Diary, Jesus told Sr. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

When Pope John Paul canonized Sr. Faustina he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day for the entire Church. The feast day falls on the Second Sunday of the Easter season. On that day, Pope John Paul II declared, "This is the happiest day of my life."

Jesus told her that he would make her a missionary of his Divine Mercy to the world. As part of that mission, He gave her the prayers for the Divine Mercy novena, a nine -day prayer that begins on Good Friday of each year and ends on the Sunday after Easter Sunday. What makes this novena unique is that Jesus himself composed it and each day a prayer can be offered for one specific group of souls such as children, priests and religious, lukewarm souls, fallen-away Catholics, and so on.



Cardinal McIntyre Fund

The goal of the Cardinal McIntyre Fund for Charity is service to the "neediest of the needy," those for whom no other resources exist. Provision of food, shelter, one-time assistance to families in crises: such as assistance with medical, funeral expenses, are appropriate as funds allow and as recommended by those who are familiar with the area/persons.

In other words, the "Fund" provides emergency help to persons who have nowhere else to go. The Fund is not a replacement or supplement for welfare or other forms of public assistance. It does not support persons' living needs on a continuing basis. Rather the Fund acts to solve immediate, pressing problems. Food and milk for three days. Lodging for the night. Emergency medical care. Rent to tide over a financial crisis. A utility bill to keep the water or heat turned on for the week.

Catholic Q & A

This Week's Topic: Holiness

Perhaps reflecting on the redemptive events of an Easter gone by, Pope John Paul II wrote in 2001:

"In whatever condition we find ourselves, we can always open ourselves to conversion and receive forgiveness for our sins. On Calvary, by the supreme sacrifice of his life, the Messiah will seal for every man and woman the infinite gift of God's pardon and mercy."

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* in the section called The Profession of Faith, also teaches that the Church is the place where along a progression of faith we, "...know the Holy Spirit in the witness of saints through whom he manifests his holiness and continues the work of salvation."

Q: In the spirit of the Easter gift of mercy, can we really strive to live virtuous lives of exceptionalism, lives zealously elevated to the worthiness of a saint?

A: The Scriptures tell us in many places, such as the Book of I Peter:

"But as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in every aspect of your conduct, for it is written: "Be holy because I am holy."

Pope Saint John Paul II added to this call to holiness amid the Eastertide: "The world needs the witnesses of "new men and "new women" who, in word and deed, make Christ present in an ever more powerful way, for Christ is the only complete and superabundant answer to the longing for truth and happiness in the human heart."

The St. James Choir often sings a litany of the saints: "All you holy men and women pray for us." Sources tell us that there are over 10,000 Saints, with about 37 of them designated as Doctors of the Church by virtue of their insightful gifts of writings and doctrinal, directional theology.

The Saints are an amazing "cloud of witnesses". From St. Athanasius, who stood against a fierce Arian heresy in the second century, to St. Wulfran, who lived in the years of the sixth century, a man characterized by biographer Rev. Alban Butler as,"daily advancing in virtue." Without question, the saints remain examples of steadfast devotion to God, offering a measure of hope to each of us.

As a prominent doctor of the Church and spectacular symbol of conversion, St Augustine of Hippo wrote in expressly insightful and accessible terms:

"When the Saints pray in the words which Christ taught, they ask for little else than the gift of perseverance." Perseverance; one of those precious gifts of Easter, wrapped in God's pardon and mercy.

Another gift is the virtuously attainable holiness which serves to continue the work of salvation, at Easter, and beyond.

Gospel Meditation

Even Thomas struggles to remove his boulder!

Being very pragmatic and determined, he wants to see the risen Christ for himself!


Thomas's boulder is heavy with mistrust. Many of ours are too. A certain amount of skepticism is good, as it can save us from being duped or misled. But we can become so skeptical of things that it erodes our ability to trust anything we see or hear. Skepticism can actually be a well-disguised defense mechanism that we use to prevent us from being hurt or perceived as a fool. Having too much ego protection is a real risk. Thomas, because of the boulder blocking his vision, could not even trust the word of his friends.

Boulders are hard to move.

It's difficult to seek change or take a risk, especially when we are so afraid to be vulnerable or reluctant to trust another's word. When we are closed minded, overly pragmatic, unwilling to see things in a different way, stubborn or defensive, it is difficult to be surprised by God and stretched. We need to be less guarded, self-assured, and self-absorbed. God cannot break into the ordinary moments of our lives and inspire us when we cling to doubt. If we are going to discover resurrection faith, we have to believe that what the witnesses say is true, especially when they are credible. We also have to trust that the risen Christ is alive in us, too!

While the first witnesses to the resurrection have faded into history, there are many others who have come after them. They continue to inspire by walking the talk of faith. They are the martyrs who offer their lives for the Gospel, the simple holy people in our communities who cling so steadfastly to their faith, those who have touched despair and found new hope and the ones who, even in spite of ridicule, still pursue their hunger and thirst for God. They are our friends, acquaintances, biblical heroes, and saints, and many others who are convinced that they have seen the Lord!

The risen Christ may not surprise us with the same kind of visit as he did the first disciples, but God finds other



ways.

All we have to do is open our eyes, remove whatever is preventing us from seeing and believing and exclaim:

"My Lord and my God!"




