Pastor's Letter

Ukraine Support

The recent collection taken up in the parishes of Los Angeles for the support of the people of Ukraine in response to the devastation of their lives and country has brought in \$1.1 million. In the Council of Priests meeting with Archbishop Gomez this past week he shared with us that 100% of all the money collected will be sent to the Bishops' Conference in Ukraine for the support of the people. The collection at St. James was \$9,300, but that was only the funds received at the Masses and many people contributed directly to the Mission Office. We want to thank all of you for your generosity and compassion in responding to this great humanitarian crisis.

Property Development

Our request to sell the Parish Center property is in the final stages through the various oversight and leadership offices at the Archdiocese and we hope to receive final approval in the very near future.

The preliminary work for the development of the new 'Community Campus' continues on pace. At this stage there are meetings of groups with common ministries/ activities in the parish to identify their needs, such as space needed, activity areas, food service, A.V. technology, storage, days and times. One of the main groups to meet were our children's ministries, such as the Preschool, Religious Education, Sunday School, Children's Liturgy, Toddler Time, Vacation Bible School, Mom's Group, and SPED (Special Education). We have also met with our Adult Education groups, our Committees/Councils and Parish Organizations. This week we will be meeting with our Youth Ministry/ Confirmation program and the Support Ministries.

Once we have gathered all the information from those groups we can begin to look at how we can best design the facilities for the needs of our parish now and into the future.

Dan Young, a parishioner at St. James and an architect for church facilities for the last 30 years who is part of the Property Planning committee, has facilitated these meetings and has been a tremendous help in getting us started and sharing the vision with all our leaders.

We welcome 56 children of our children who are receiving Eucharist for the first time. What a joy to celebrate as a parish the outpouring of God's love and mercy upon our children as they continue to grow in their life-journey of faith. Thank you for your love and support of them.

Cardinal McIntyre Fund

The goal of the Cardinal McIntyre Fund for Charity is service to the "neediest of the needy," those for whom no other resources exist. Provision of food, shelter, one-time assistance to families in crises: such as assistance with medical, funeral expenses, are appropriate as funds allow and as recommended by those who are familiar with the area/persons.

In other words, the "Fund" provides emergency help to persons who have nowhere else to go. The Fund is not a replacement or supplement for welfare or other forms of public assistance. It does not support persons' living needs on a continuing basis. Rather the Fund acts to solve immediate, pressing problems. Food and milk for three days. Lodging for the night. Emergency medical care. Rent to tide over a financial crisis. A utility bill to keep the water or heat turned on for the week.





This Week's Topic: The Word of God

The ancient West Bank city of Jericho, known for being one of the first walled cities, (as Joshua and the Israelites would attest), sits low in the Jordan Valley. Many sources agree that Jericho is in fact the oldest continuously settled and geographically lowest city on Earth; a remarkable place.

Also remarkable is Luke's Gospel, which relates a parable that occurred just outside this historic settlement, when a blind man repeatedly cried out in absolute desperation to Jesus of Nazareth who was passing by. We know the unfolding sequence of events. Hearing the persistent pleas, the Savior asks, "What do you want me to do for you?"

By his insistent, unwavering, immutable belief, the man received his sight. "Your faith has saved you." The scriptures, the inspired word of God, continue to speak to us across millennia, offering good news, guidance, and the means of salvation, particularly in evidence now ,within the season of the path to life that Easter represents. Pope John Paul II wrote: "Sacred scripture is a sure guide, when it is read, welcomed, and meditated upon..."

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, whose 270 members or so, each reportedly average 2 hours of prayer each day give us, as part of their discussion of the Bible, this week's essential inquiry: **Q:** What is God saying to me?

A: The Bishops, as part of their "joint exercise of pastoral functions on behalf of the Christian faithful" say that the books of the Old and New Testaments "shed light on each other". "Together, these Testaments help us to understand God's plan for human beings."

Pope Francis reminds that "The *Catechism* affirms that prayer should accompany the reading of Sacred Scripture."

He called the collaborative action of the Bible and prayer,

"...a dialogue with God. God passes continually, and through the scripture..."

Just as He passed by the blind man on the road to Jericho.

Gospel Meditation

Could it be that God's image has become so soiled and distorted that it is hard for us to see it?

Our self-serving agendas have done a great job twisting God's image into what profits us. We want our agenda to be God's agenda and use prayer as the convincing leverage we need. Worse still, our success and egocentric agenda often erases God's image completely, replacing it with our own. St. Oscar Romero instructs us that the Son of Man "dies on the cross to cleanse God's image, which is soiled in today's humanity, a humanity so enslaved, so selfish, so sinful." Striving to preserve control of our destinies at all costs, we fail to see the risen suffering servant, the Christ, standing right beside us.

Jesus, who suffered and died on a cross and was raised from the dead, corrects our soiled image of God. He shows us God as God is, not who we want to make God to be. God is the God of the poor, the weak, and the marginalized. He is the God who tenderly caresses us when we are suffering and hurting, assuring us that all will be safe and well. He is the God of equity, peace. justice, and compassion who wants happiness for each of His children, desiring their wellbeing and success. God goes where men and women are afraid to go, sitting with the lost, the broken, and the sorrowing. St. Oscar Romero challenges us to illuminate with "Christ's light ... even the most hideous caverns of the human person: torture, jail, plunder, want, chronic illness. The oppressed must be saved." The resurrection calls us to be God's microphone, a messenger, and a prophet (St. Oscar Romero).

Using eyes that see beyond the limited constructs and desires of our world, we can see the true and real Jesus standing before us, calling us to transformation and change. Asking us more than once, "do you love me?" We are beckoned to give an answer. Answering in the affirmative, it is now our task to feed the sheep and the lambs who belong to God. In short, equipped with the power of the resurrection and a corrected image of God our task is to make things better, brighter, holier, more life-giving, and just for all of God's children. Considering our choices, our interactions, our philosophies, and aspirations, how can we do this?

Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.


