

Pastor's Letter



Together In Mission Campaign

The Archdiocesan 'Together In Mission Campaign' provides for the basic needs of our poorest parishes and schools in the Archdiocese. Many of these are in the 'inner city' where life is complicated by so many other issues such as gangs, drugs, inadequate public schools and poverty.

Our goal at St. James for the 2022 Campaign is \$111,637. So far we have received pledges of \$60,700 but that is only 55% of our goal. We are renewing our effort to reach out to you to make a pledge at this time.

There are envelopes in the church for you to use. Your gift does not have to be large and it can be paid in installments throughout the year. St. James has always been a strong and generous supporter of this campaign, but it takes all of us working together to make it happen. Each parish's goal is big, but the need to make sure the gospel is preached in the poorest and most oppressed areas of the archdiocese is vital.

Thank you for your continued generosity in supporting the mission to spread the Good News of Salvation to members of our poorer communities in LA.







This Week's Topic: Persevere, Listen, Hope

"Speak, O Lord, your servant is listening..."

We sing this beautifully plaintive acclamation at Mass, the same acclamation voiced originally long ago by the young prophet Samuel, who listened to God and was able to persevere in faith during those calamitous times that marked the rise and diminishment of Saul and the emergence of David.

Q: What aspects of listening to God and holding fast to our faith journey are evident to this day?

A: In recent homilies by Father Thaddeus and Deacon Bob we've been enlightened and challenged to actively listen and to always persevere in our own particular faith efforts, remaining earnest and steadfast in acting upon the guidance of the word of the living God, whose unwavering presence is at the heart of our faith.

That verb, *persevere*, was prominent within themes highlighted by Pope Francis in his continuing catechesis:

"...each person must strive to maintain the perseverance and consolation of God, which not only gives us the strength to keep going, but also to help others who are in difficulty...whatever difficult circumstances come our way, we can practice perseverance knowing in faith that God is walking with us."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in Paragraph 162 states:

"To live, grow, and persevere in the faith...we must nourish it with the word of God...abounding in hope..."

Scripture readings this week included Acts Chapter 14, where we find Paul and Barnabas encouraging the spirits of their own disciples, that they may,

"...persevere in the faith..."

We are blessed at St. James to have Monsignor Mike, Father Jim, Father Thaddeus, Deacon Bob and Deacon Mark. They persevere in their benevolently pastoral shepherding of the congregation, observing a faithful scriptural base and a reverence for sacred tradition; always honoring the teachings of the Holy Church.

And, as Hebrews Chapter 12 admonishes in its good-willed fashion:

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden, and sin that clings to us and *persevere* in running the race that lies before us."

So we remain, with plaintively listening hearts, abounding with hope in God, who is always walking with us.

Gospel Meditation

Jesus tells his disciples,

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

Not as the world gives do I give it to you."

The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of war, conflict, or affliction. The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering and hardship, not necessarily in their absence.

St. Teresa of Avila offers us a bit of wisdom regarding peace:

"May today there be peace within.
May you trust God that you are exactly
where you are meant to be.
May you not forget the infinite possibilities
that are born of faith.
May you use those gifts that you have received and
pass on the love that has been given to you.
May you be content knowing you are a child of God

pass on the love that has been given to you.

May you be content knowing you are a child of God.

Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love.

It is there for each and every one of us."

In order for us to experience the divine peace that Jesus offers, we have to allow God's presence to settle into our bones!

It is only when this happens that we can be truly taught by the Holy Spirit to discern the true path to peace and find ourselves with untroubled hearts. The world and our lives are so unpredictable and changeable. If we look for a source of lasting and real peace only there, our search will never be satisfied. Something will always unsettle and disturb us. The Jewish disciples could really relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They already knew that it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing than anything else.

Wholeness and wellbeing are precisely what is uncovered when we begin to really see and know the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise.

The elegance of God's Divine life flows through our blood and the marrow in our bones.

It is that close and deep. As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in the midst of intense conflict, persecution, suffering, rejection, and even death.
