St. James Welcomes Archbishop José Gomez for Confirmations

We are very honored this year that Archbishop Gomez will be here this Friday evening to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation for our youth and adults at 7 pm.

This will be the second time that Archbishop Gomez will be here since he began as the Archbishop of Los

the Archbishop of Los

Angeles in 2011. He was here to celebrate with us at our 125th anniversary as a parish in July, 2017. As the Archbishop of Los Angeles he oversees 288 parishes and is constantly visiting parishes, so we are excited that he will be here.

This year there will be 81 of our teens and 8 adults confirmed with the Holy Spirit as they continue their journey of faith with Christ. Under the direction of our youth minister, Gretchen Nobleza and her team of adult leaders and our confirmed Teen Disciples, they have courageously weathered through the pandemic and continued their program of formation and fraternity.

We are blessed with the commitment of 52 of our teens who have been confirmed in the last 2 years who continue as Teen Disciples to minister as leaders and mentors for our youth in their 2 year program of preparation for Confirmation.

It is amazing to watch their gifts and talents develop and the joy they share as they open their hearts to the gospel and Christ's life.

In spite of the pandemic restrictions our teens found ways to live their faith by supporting our Feed the Needy program, hosting Sunday coffee & donuts, lead prayer nights with peers, tutoring and coaching peers, assisting ministries with other events, beach clean-ups, school festival, care packages for soldiers on deployments and more. Many of the teens to be Confirmed are also committing themselves to continue in the program as Teen Disciples, using their gifts and talents to help other teens grow in faith. Congratulations to all.





This Week's Topic: The Virtue of Charity

The week's scripture readings once again prompt wonder, faith awareness and additional consideration across a life-long spiritual journey. Among those readings, Psalm 113:

> "He raises the needy from the dust, [and] lifts the poor from the ash heap."

To sort out this verse we can turn to the Catechism. It is fitting that the word catechism means "instruction." The Catechism of the Catholic Church, "offers answers for all those interested in learning about the mystery of the Catholic faith."

Q: What answers does the Catechism address in its discussion of the glorious mystery that is interwoven amid the virtue of charity as reflected in that Psalm?

A: The Catechism begins its discussion about the virtuous Christian life by citing a beautiful verse in Philippians 4 which describes instructions for a faith community that lives in concord, joy and peace:

"...whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things."

In thinking about these things we may ask:

Q: What is a virtue?

A: The Catechism defines a virtue as an habitual and firm disposition to do good.

Q: What is the goal of a virtuous life?

A: Quoting St. Gregory, the catechism says that the goal of a virtuous life is "to become like God."

Q: What is charity?

A: "Charity is the theological virtue by which we love God above all things...and our neighbor as ourselves..."

Q: How does Jesus make charity the new commandment?

A: "By loving one another, the disciples imitate the love of Jesus which they themselves receive."

Q: The apostle Paul speaks, in 1 Corinthians. What does the Catechism highlight from Paul's words?

A: "If I have not charity, says the apostle, I have nothing...I gain nothing."

And so we read the scriptures and we have the teachings of the catechism for further clarification and insight.

Here, that insight and illumination may help us to better see that:

Whatever is just... by loving one another... with charity...thus he raises the needy.

Gospel Meditation

Unity and diversity can exist together.

Our western minds have a grave difficulty seeing unity without conformity. We tend to believe that unless everyone believes the same thing, assents to the same body of truths, styles, and opinions, unity is not possible.

Jesus, in today's Gospel, expresses a tenderness and an intimacy that the disciples actually can witness. This same tenderness and love are also reflected in his desire for unity and oneness. Jesus passionately wants all to be one. It is very clear that the success of Jesus' mission and the advance of the Gospel rises or falls with whether this unity is achieved. And it is a unity that is achieved around a person and not particulars.

Our church is extremely divided.

These divisions all center on various theologies, philosophies, structures, and styles. We allow these particular concerns and interpretations, valid as many can be, to drive wedges between us and put us at odds with each other.

They enrage us and cause us to lash out at other members of the Body of Christ. Differences are bound to exist in any group. We are unique and diverse people. Staunchly clinging to particular agendas and ideologies while waving the "we're right, you're wrong" banner as we forge ahead in battle does little to advance the real mission of Christ. We are perceived as weak, fractioned, self-focused and serving, and lacking empathy and love.

How can the work of salvation be accomplished like this?

We sacrifice our credibility. For what?

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end."

These words describe exactly who the glorified Christ really is.

Jesus wants us to see this glory!

Believe this! This is the unifying principle that draws the Body of Christ together as one, not our particular preferences of worship! We give too much power to our preferences, and all too easily forget that the real mission of Christ is much more than that! If we can work at truly loving each other as members of Christ's Body despite the differences that can so quickly divide us, then maybe we'll a bit more convincing to those who do not believe. The Risen Christ comes to us through the Eucharist. It doesn't matter where or how.

Gather wherever you can and receive. We cannot substitute Jesus' passion with our own. We are one.
