My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

My name is Fr. JohnPaul Igbokwe. In 1982, Pope John Paul II was in Nigeria on the day I was born (July 12th) and so my parents named me in his honor. It is humbling now to be named after a saint!



I am a diocesan priest from the Archdiocese of Owerri. Fr. Emmanuel Konyeaso and Fr. Thaddeus Agbasonu are also from Owerri. Fr. Uche Onyekwelu was my roommate when I first entered the seminary in 2004, so in many ways I already feel very connected to St. James.

I was ordained in 2014 and after serving one year as an Associate Pastor I was assigned to be the Vice-Rector of a spiritual formation program for young men aspiring to become priests.

After 4 years in this formation program, I was assigned as pastor of a parish.

Then in 2021, my bishop asked me to come to the United States to pursue a degree in Mass Communication to be able to help the Archdiocese develop their media communications programs.

I am studying at St. Cloud State University, Minnesota. Upon completion of my Bachelor's degree I will continue my studies for a Master's degree before returning to Owerri.

I am excited to be at St. James during my summer break and plan to be here until July 31st.

I look forward to meeting many of you and experiencing the wonderful community of faith you are at St. James.

Again we thank you in advance for your generosity in allowing us to keep our homeless community fed and healthy.

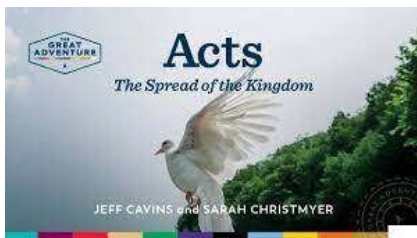

This Week's Topic: The Virtue of Charity

When we hear that the Society of St. Vincent de Paul collection truck is scheduled to be in the St. James parking lot, it's recognized that the truck is emblematic of works of charitable mercy, works that help to facilitate the virtues of the Church.

Q: What additional spiritual cargo is contained within the essence of that Catholic conveyance?

A: Among the entries in the *Lives of the Saints* we find a paragon of charitable practice, St. Vincent, who was born in France in the late 14th Century.

In his youth he tended his father's pigs. After his education and ordination he was captured by pirates and carried into



Barbary, escaping to France where his sublime charity was extended to: prisoners, the poor, the leprosy, the young, the old, the foundlings on the cold Paris streets, as well as to those

desolated by civil war.

Additionally, it is said, tellingly, about St. Vincent that he was not only a savior of the poor, but also of the rich, for he taught them to do works of mercy.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church has extensive teachings about charity. Paragraph 1822 sets the foundation of that Christian teaching:

"Charity is the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God."

The *Catechism* teaches that a virtue is a habitual and firm disposition to do good. That sounds like St. Vincent.

The *Catechism* index pointedly lists this subject as *Virtue: See Love*. That sounds like St. Vincent.

Reverend Alban Butler says about the example and value of the Saints which the Church honors:

"They are witnesses to and exposition of the Catholic faith."

That sounds like St. Vincent and his ongoing mission groups and the Sisters of Charity who continue to assist the workings of the mercy of God and His Church in action; true exposition of the Catholic faith.

And to another he said, "Follow me."

In every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling us. We can easily get distracted and not hear it or simply ignore it, pretending it wasn't even heard. When we do hear it and favorably respond, there are some conditions that must be met. Jesus makes it clear that once we say yes to his invitation, we must stay focused and forge ahead. We cannot keep looking behind or worry about unfinished business. There are some tasks, and discipleship is one, that require our full devotion.

There are many "masters" vying for our attention. We need something or someone to give us direction. Human nature requires it. Our motives and actions reveal what has our allegiance. It is tempting to give ourselves to masters that lure us with intriguing promises. When given the choice between a "master" that promises worldly success, abundant wealth, status, privilege, and security versus a "master" that asks for self-sacrifice, hardship, suffering, ridicule, and death, to whom do we go? While the promise of immediate pleasure is enticing, there is always a catch. For all that secular masters can promise, they always keep us looking behind, checking on ourselves, second guessing choices, calculating options, and being slaves to excessive worry. Our guard can never come down. Only one master really promises life: Jesus Christ. Hearing his call, we either trust him or we don't.

Saying yes to following Christ does come with a risk. But it also comes with the brightness of future hopes and dreams. There is no need to keep looking behind. Sins are forgiven and regrets serve no effective purpose. God is not there. He's moved beyond all that stuff. God is in the today and the tomorrow and what he can continually do with our daily affirmation to follow Him. All we need to do is be obedient. St. Gianna Molla is credited with saying, "The stillness of prayer is the most essential condition for fruitful action. Before all else, the disciple kneels down." Begin with prayer. We will not only hear God's call but find the courage to trust that He will guide us where we need to be. God uses us in the most ordinary of ways through the simple daily expression of our lives.

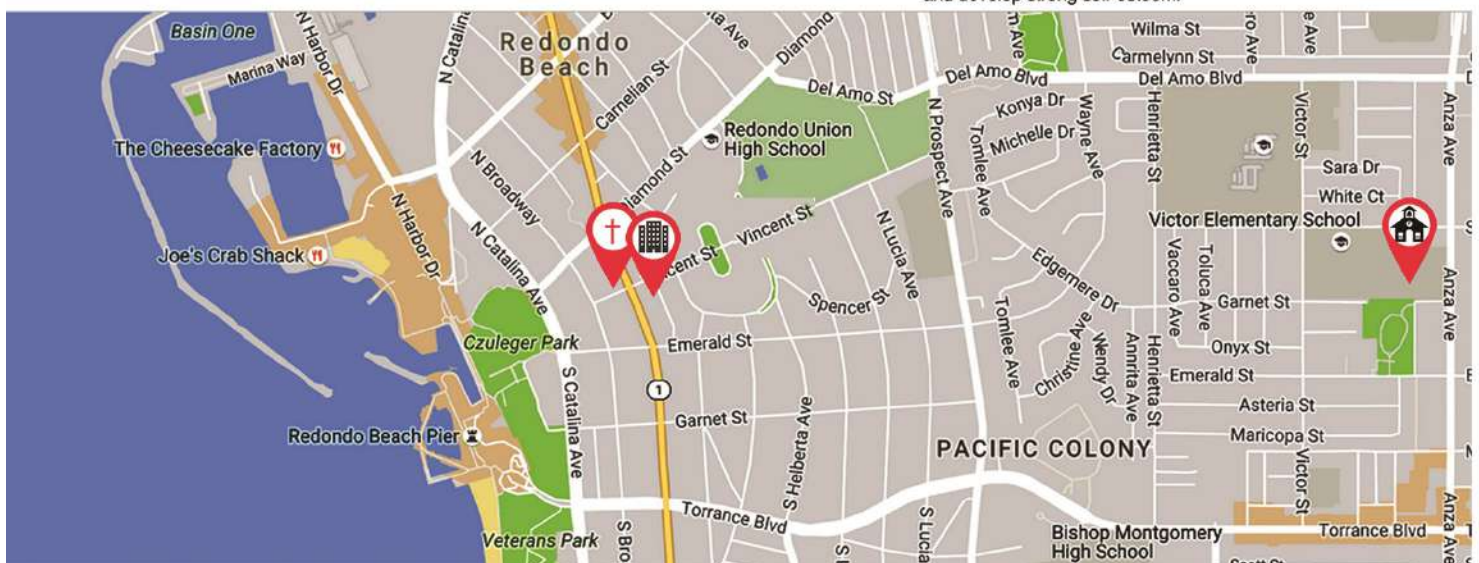
