Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

At our Baptism, a priest anointed us with sacred chrism and said that we were now identified with Jesus in his roles as priest, prophet, and king. As a priest, we are to offer sacrifice and we do this by participating in the Eucharist, offering both ourselves and the sacrifice of Jesus to the Father. As a prophet, we are to witness to the good news bringing peace and justice to all we meet. And as a king, we are to share in Jesus' role of ordering all things toward the Father in the Holy Spirit. This honor applies to all the baptized and is often referred to as the priesthood of the faithful. It points to the dignity all share as children of God.

On July 16th, 2012 Fr. Thaddeus received the Sacrament of Holy Orders, granting him special graces and the ability to act in the person of Christ to offer the Mass. Please join me in celebrating his **10 year anniversary of his priestly ordination** next weekend.



Since Holy Orders is a sacrament, Jesus has promised to be active in the lives of the ordained. Like marriage, in which Jesus is present throughout the life of the couple to strengthen and assist the man and woman as husband and wife and as parents, Jesus is with the ordained to assist and guide them in their minis-

tries. The roles of both marriage and family and of Church leadership are important and essential to the full operation of society and the Church. God, as it were, is saying that he wants to be there too assist. So, again like marriage, the Sacrament of Holy Orders is a sacrament of vocation.

I am also happy we are able to celebrate Fr. JohnPaul's 40th birthday on Tuesday, July 12th here at St. James.

We are blessed to have these men who have dedicated themselves to building up the body of Christ here on earth and to serve as a faithful witness to the true teachings of the faith. By their example, teaching and service, we are better able to serve the spiritual needs of the community. Together they are helping us to become the holy, healthy and vibrant people that God created us to be.





Catholic Q & A

This Week's Topic: The Power of Forgiveness

This past week as we moved along our holy Catholic faith journey we encountered thought-provoking scripture readings that touched us intellectually and viscerally. We were also part of the celebration of a Sunday Mass, highlighted by Father John Paul's moving homily about the saving grace found in the Messiah's presence as well as in the very powerful essence of His holy name; a name we repeated with honor and glorious praise. Such worship and praise may prompt us to think about some of the guiding precepts of the Church that move us to be a part of that kind of fulfilling faith, experienced last week and every week.

Q: In that context, what is one of those precepts that we may think about, appreciate, and act upon?

A: A precept is defined as a commandment, or instruction. It is an ordering, intended as an authoritative rule of action. It is a principle; a direction. A religious precept includes moral conduct, part of the "core curriculum" of the Catholic Faith.

One precept discussed in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* is also found within the pages of scripture, amid the rites of the Mass, and as part of the epitome of the example set by Jesus. It is the saving grace of the gift of *forgiveness*.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches about forgiveness. Here in Paragraph #2227, a real-world admonition:

"Each and everyone should be generous and tireless in forgiving one another for offenses, quarrels, injustices, and neglect. Mutual affection suggests this. *The charity of Christ demands it.*"

Pope Francis wrote: "Always forgive. Don't put it off. Please, always forgive,"

The St. James Choir sings many hymns centered on the concept or precept of forgiveness. One of those hymns is drawn from the Book of Hosea. The song is called Hosea, or "Come Back To Me." Hosea was a prophet who, scripture shows us, used a marriage imagery of dissolution, followed by (forgiving), reconciliation. We see that his book also utilized a narrative theme of Israel's guilt, punishment and (forgiving), restoration. The song is inspired by Hosea's words about faithfulness and forgiveness:

"Come back to me with all your heart, don't let fear keep us apart..."

"Long have I waited for your coming home to me and living deeply our new life..."

As Hosea Chapter 14 states with the heading: "Sincere Conversion and New Life" :

"Return , Israel to the Lord, your God, Forgive all iniquity...for my anger is turned away from them..."

We are blessed with the gift of the guiding, saving, and actionable precept of forgiveness; the charity of Christ.

Gospel Meditation

We can learn a great deal from Mister Rogers.

Remember him? He was the gentle soul who found his way into living rooms worldwide starting as far back as 1968. Mister Rogers' Neighborhood was a beloved program that celebrated and exalted people, especially children. He taught us that we are neighbors and that everyone has a place. Everyone matters. He had a vision, born of his relationship with God that highlighted every human life's innocence, beauty, and uniqueness. To that end, he called us to be responsible for each other, saying nothing different than what Jesus said. Viewers quickly learned that life is not just about me.

"We live in a world in which we need to share responsibility. It's easy to say, 'It's not my child, not my community, not my world, not my problem.'

Then there are those who see the need and respond. I consider those people my heroes (Fred Rogers)."

It is so easy to look the other way. After all, I'm not the one who needs to leave home out of fear and try to find somewhere safe. I am not the one who is hungry and without shelter or food. I am not the one who has a child being bullied or ridiculed because of the way they dress or act. I am not the one being threatened with violence or unable to find meaningful work. The distress and agony of our neighbors are our distress and agony. We cannot walk by it with an attitude of indifference, especially if we call ourselves believers. When we no longer care, we have suffocated our souls. This is a great sin.

God's law "is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out."

We all have a need for love and acceptance. That's why Mister Rogers' television show was so popular. It spoke to something deeper, something sacred about humanity. God didn't give us his law in a book. He wrote it on our hearts. We know what we need to do. It's a matter of choice. Love is sacred. When we love another human being, especially without regard for ourselves, it is a holy moment. These moments are often missed due to our self-serving agendas and rules.




