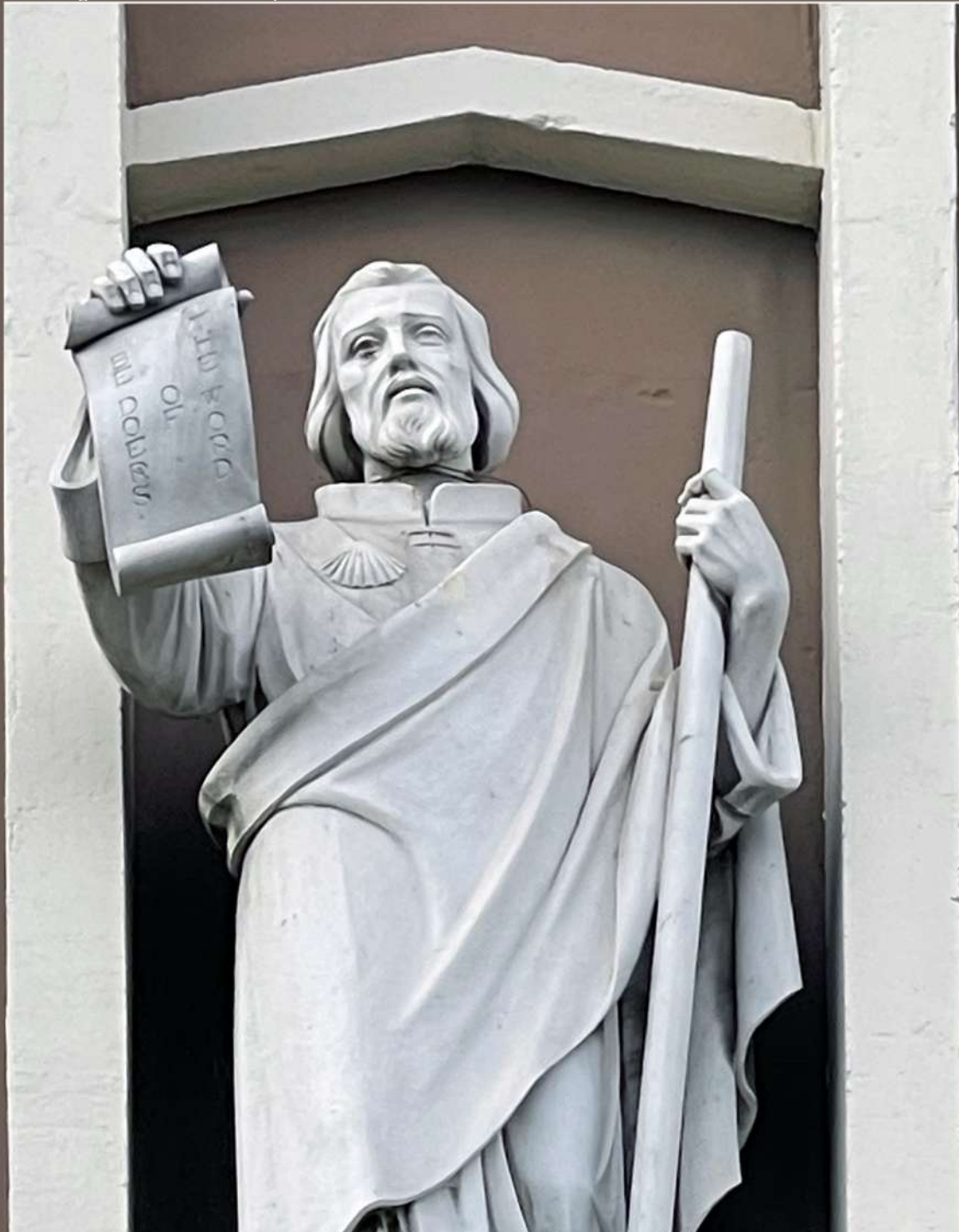

Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

Feast of St. James

Monday, June 25th is the Feast of St. James and since he is the patron of our parish, we are celebrating his Feast this Sunday at all our Masses.

St. James, also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater, born in Galilee, Palestine—died 44 AD, Jerusalem; one of the Twelve Apostles, distinguished as being in Jesus' innermost circle and the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament (Acts 12:2).

He and his brother John (who was also the writer of the Fourth Gospel) were early disciples of our Lord and left their father, Zebedee and his fishing business to follow Jesus along with their companions Peter and Andrew.

As Jesus gave the command to the apostles to proclaim the gospel to the ends of the earth, James was given that honor by the early church as having gone to Galicia, to the very northwest corner of Spain—thought to have been the westernmost point of continental Europe—and the 'end of the earth' to proclaim the gospel. That place is marked by the cathedral dedicated to him, known as Santiago de Compostela. During the 10th to 12th centuries Compostela began to be a site of pilgrimage after the bishop claimed to have found the burial site of St. James there. It soon became the most popular pilgrimage site after Rome and the Holy Land.

Jacob in Hebrew, became Jacobos (Iakobos) in Greek and Iacobus (Iacomus) in Latin and shortened to Gemmes in French and then to James in English. Jaime (Spanish) Jakob (Danish, Polish), Yakov (Russian) and Iago (Portuguese).

The scallop shell, which was common along the shore of Spain soon became a symbol and prized proof of having made the pilgrimage to Santiago. Today it marks the many pilgrimage routes through Europe to Compostela and continues to be a prized possession from making the pilgrimage.

Our church dedicated to St. James is filled with the scallop shell, from the front steps to holy water fonts, baptismal font, altar, ambo and framework of the shrines and crucifix. The shells remind us of our connection not only to St. James, but to Santiago de Compostela and James' mission, and our mission with him, to proclaim the gospel to the end of the earth.

Today as we celebrate the life and ministry of our patron, St. James, may each of us be filled with his zeal and love for living and proclaiming the gospel by our own lives.

The St. James Tuesday Night Bible Study group is currently studying "**Acts: The Spread of the Kingdom**" by Ascension.

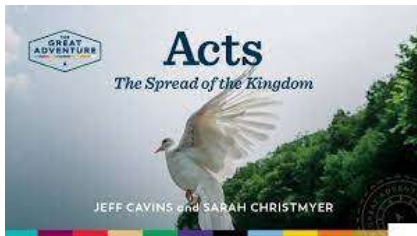

This weeks Topic: "The Basics"

Q: *Catechism*. What is that?

A: That word "catechism" means instruction, or teachings about the Catholic faith; instruction that addresses questions and answers about Church doctrine. The word, catechesis, refers to religious instruction associated with the catechism.

Q: What specific teachings are in *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*?

A: Within the pages of this book you'll find a summary of the main points of what Catholics believe.

Q: Which main points?

A: The main points include: the Creed; the Sacraments; the Commandments; Prayer; the Bible; the Mass; Sacred Tradition; and the teachings of the "divinely appointed authority to teach the truths of religion" - the Magisterium of the Church.

Q: Are there Saints and Angels in the *Catechism* ?

A: Yes, they are part of what we believe and pray. The *Catechism* writes about the mystery of the Catholic faith and describes itself as a kind of map to help navigate a journey of faith.

Q: Can you read this book like a "regular" book?

A. This is a reference book with many subject sections. It includes an index which can help to locate specific topics of inquiry as well as additional areas of general reader interest.

Q: Thirty years after the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, (Vatican II), the Synod Fathers, in concert with Cardinals and Bishops, wrote this updated *Catechism* which was compiled over a period of six years. How did Pope John Paul II describe our *Catechism*?

A: The Holy Father wrote: "In reading *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, we can perceive the wonderful unity of the mystery of God, his saving will, as well as the central place of Jesus Christ...[it] is a statement of the Church's faith and of Catholic doctrine...I declare it to be a sure norm for teaching the faith...offered to all the faithful who wish to deepen their knowledge of the unfathomable riches of salvation..."

In his closing remarks within the document presenting the *Catechism*, the Pope called for the intercession of Mary: "I beseech the Blessed Virgin Mary...Mother of the Church, to support with her powerful intercession, the catechetical work of the entire Church...at this time when she is called to a new effort of evangelization..."

It is said that the catechism presents, "the riches of salvation." Another crucial aspect of the catechism is that it honor what the Apostolic Constitution calls the Fidei Depositum: The Deposit Of Faith.

Pope Francis, in speaking about the Word of God, and the proclamation of the Word of God, adds to our appreciation of the value of catechesis, the Catechism, and their place in our faith: "*Catechesis*, he said, *is the echo of the Word of God.*"

What the Church believes, what the Church teaches...the *Catechism*...part of the riches of salvation.

Meister Eckhart asks, "Who is the man whose prayers God always hears?"

He answers, "God hears the man who appeals to God as God. When, however, man appeals to God, hoping for some worldly good, he is not appealing to God at all, but to what he is asking of God. He is trying to make God his servant. On this point, St. Augustine says: 'You pray to what you love, for true whole prayer is nothing but love!' Thus, we pray to what we love, and no one rightly prays to God but he who prays for God and has nothing on his mind but God." We struggle with what we want God to do and how we want our prayer validated. Meister Eckhart is correct. We often want God to be our servant. We further struggle with trusting that God knows what we need and that His will is best.

God's will is not some predetermined outcome of events that we must simply suggest. "Thy will be done" is not an invocation beckoning us to accept a particular state of affairs passively. Rather, it is the humble and confident placement of ourselves in the presence of the God we seek, whom we call "Father." We must remember that God is the God of life and light. It is from nothing that God brings something and from the darkness that God brings life. Prayer allows us to seek the One we love with the assurance that all will be well regardless of what course the events of our lives take. God is not about passive submission but the humble trust of love.

That's what makes the Lord's Prayer the perfect prayer. It provides us with proper disposition and focus, putting in line all of the essential relationships of our lives. It celebrates and fosters the ever-deepening relationship of trust we have with our Creator. It also calls us to keep open the doors of love between our brothers and sisters with the power that comes with forgiveness. If in one's darkest hour they can find the resolve to fervently pray this perfect prayer of Jesus' conviction, then there is no doubt that God will hear their plea, reach out in love, and bring them ever closer to His heart. What more does one need to weather the storms of life besides faith, hope, and love? These are God's most perfect gifts and all we really need.

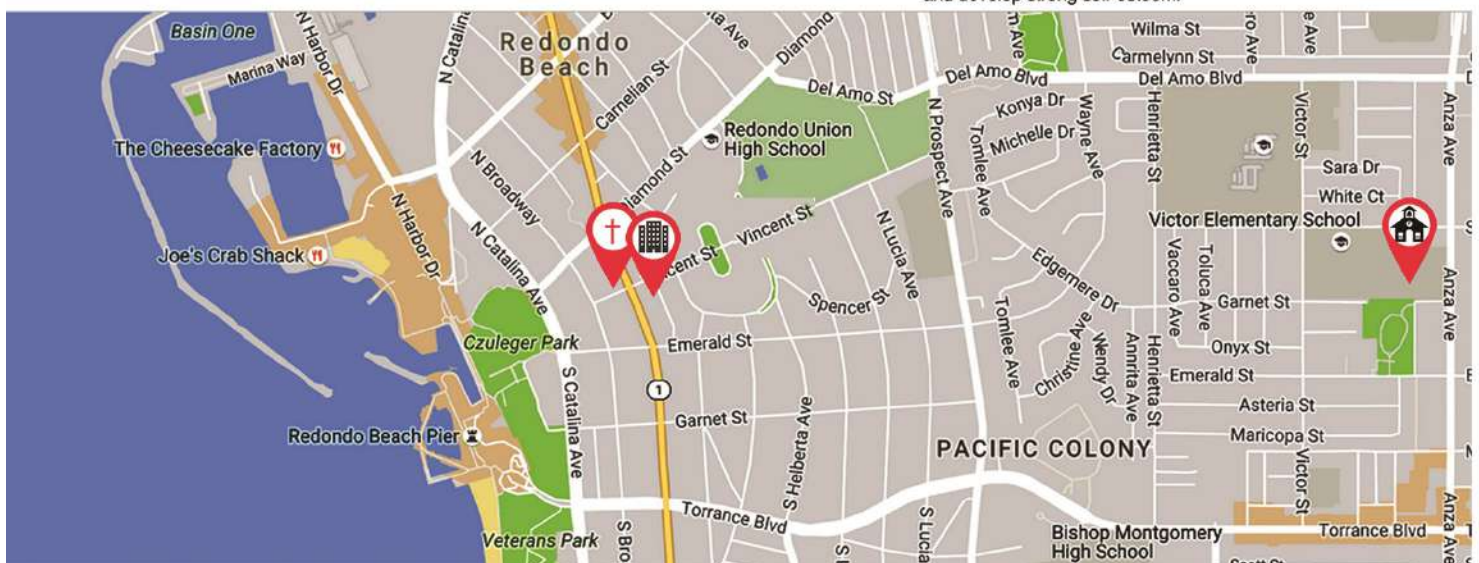
