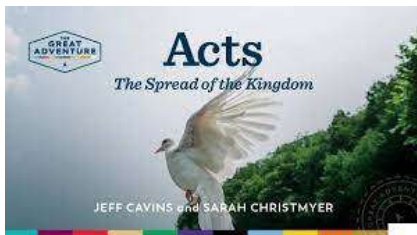

This weeks Topic: Eucharistic Celebration

July's calendar includes the observance of the memorial of 11th century Franciscan Bishop and Doctor of the Church, Saint Bonaventure.

We are blessed to have the "good fortune" (or in his Italian language, "buona fortuna"), to benefit from his wisdom. In addition to his piety and good works, this Saint spoke strongly against earthly ways and about the futility of focusing primarily on those things in life which are merely transitory. In no uncertain terms he continues to admonish the faithful from across the centuries:

"Transitory things are the true seeds of sins."

Now, foregoing the transitory, and in honor of what the Church celebrates as supremely enduring, the Bishops of the United States, have marked a three -year celebration of the revival of the redemptive spirit of the Eucharist. This observance began this year at the feast of Corpus Christi.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says: "...from the beginning Christians have celebrated the Eucharist because we know ourselves to be bound by the command the Lord gave,

"Do this in remembrance of me."

Some essential elements of the Paschal Banquet are reviewed in the Catholic Herald by Father Noah Morey of Arlington, Virginia:

Q: What is the Ciborium? **A:** The receptacle that holds the bread.

Q: What is the Purificator? **A:** It is the cloth used to clean the chalice, ciboria, and patens.

Q: What is the Paten? **A:**The plate that holds the communion wafers.

Q: What's the Corporal? **A:**The cloth that is placed beneath the chalice and paten to catch bits of the Eucharist. When not in use it's folded into thirds to symbolize the Trinity.

Q: What about candles? **A:** At least two are present. Candlelight was necessary in the setting of early Masses celebrated in the Roman catacombs, but they also symbolize Jesus as the light of the world. Father Morey offers a beautiful summary:

"When a person says "Amen" to the words "Body of Christ," they are affirming not only their belief in the Eucharist, but in the totality of the church's teachings" Our Choir sings about the communion of "Our Blessing Cup."

Q: "How shall I make a return to the Lord for all He has done for me?"

A: The spiritually enduring answer to that can be found within the Liturgy of the Eucharist, by which we affirm our belief.

What makes us feel secure?

Many people look to tangible forms of security that will safeguard their livelihood and prepare for their future. We tend to associate security with things: the accumulation of goods and possessions, retirement funds, savings accounts, and substantial incomes.

While acquiring these promises a life with less anxiety and worry, we actually find ourselves more preoccupied and consumed with their growth and preservation. We worry more! We can easily become quasi-hoarders, consumed with obtaining more tangible crutches.

Our minds and hearts are always restless, and we never seem to be at peace. Why do we so easily give our self-worth, value, and sense of security over to things?

God certainly does not deny us the pursuit of a productive and enjoyable life but where do we draw the line?

A sense of well-being and happiness can easily get deferred to sometime "in the future" while we continue to wrestle with the toils of today. There is no guarantee that there will be an earthly tomorrow and all of the frenzy we bring to securing our state in life will be for naught. When we are called from this world, will we even know where to begin to look for the tranquility and repose our souls so desperately need?

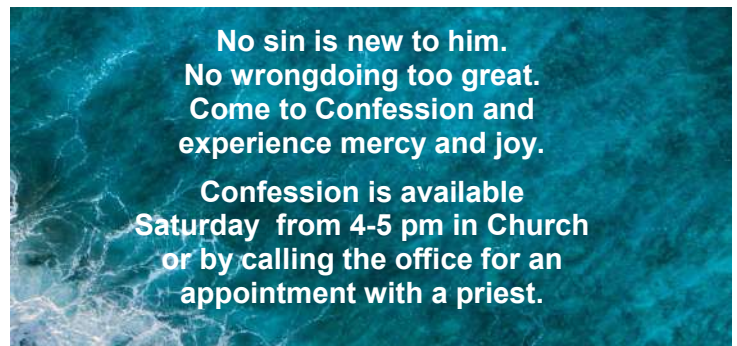
We cannot be hoarders, pursuers of vanity, or greedy

They just don't work as they are too dependent on things that can fall apart. Rather than always feeling the need for more, we need to learn how to be grateful for what we have. By learning to look inward we can learn how to live lives of faithful service to others.

"Happiness can only be achieved by looking inward and learning to enjoy whatever life has, and this requires transforming greed into gratitude (St. John Chrysostom)."

We all need to be good stewards of what has been entrusted to our care.

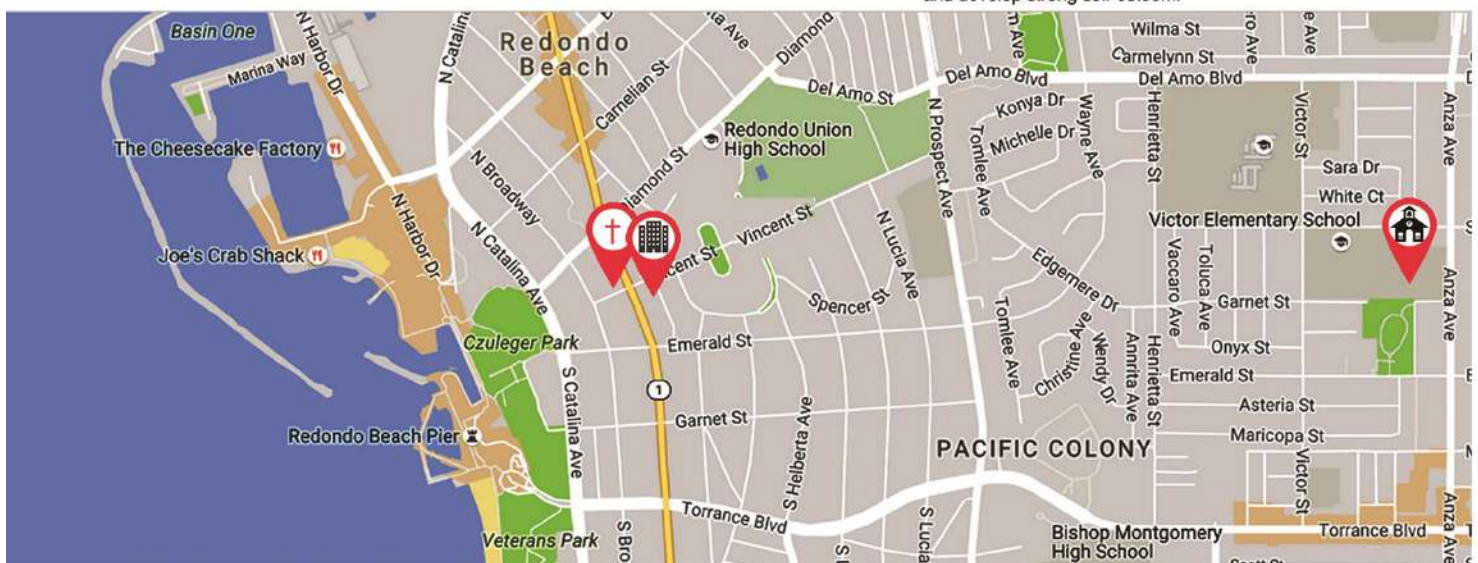
