Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

We thank Fr. Rudy for being with us recently and for sharing the important work that is being done in his parish to minister to the spiritual and temporal needs of his parish in Mexico. To support his ministry you may still simply write your check to: St. James and in the memo line put: "Mission Appeal" and we will send one check from the parish to the Mission Office for Fr. Rudy's work.

Last week, Archbishop Gomez has called all of the incardinated priests of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles to join him for a Convocation, 4 days of reflection, discussions and fellowship. Fr. Jim and I joined Archbishop Gomez with about 300 other priests of the Archdiocese from Monday thru Thursday.

An 'incardinated' priest is one whose 'official bishop' is the bishop of Los Angeles. Fr. Jim and I are incardinated priests of Los Angeles. Fr. Thaddeus belongs to a religious community, the Sons of Mary, Mother of Mercy, SMMM. and Fr. Paul is a diocesan priest but is incardinated in the Diocese of Damongo in Ghana and the bishop of Damongo is his superior.

The last time we were together with Archbishop Gomez united as the priests of the Archdiocese was 3 years ago, in 2019. Since then, Covid has isolated us from each other and our parishes have struggled. Each of us have committed our whole lives to the building up of the Church in Los Angeles and obedience to the Archbishop. These days are so important for us as our own parish ministries often keep us apart. We are not priests of individual parishes. We are priests of the Archdiocese, each called in various ministries, but united always in one brotherhood of priests in service to the entire Faithful of Los Angeles under the guidance of the Archbishop.

Your prayers and support of the Convocation for the good of the archbishop, the clergy and all of our parishes and ministries are so appreciated.

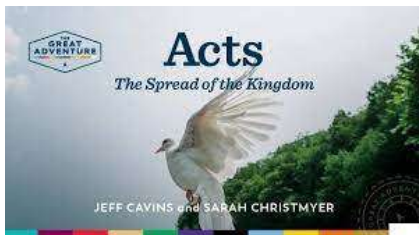

This Week's Topic: Vocations

Q: There is a word that encompasses a person's employment, main occupation, trade, or profession, characterized by strong feelings of suitability and dedication for a particular career or occupation. What is that word?

A: That word is *Vocations*. The word "vocation" comes from the Latin "vocacio" which translates as "to call." In one vocational setting the Church honors, encourages and faithfully develops discernment structures for those that consider answering the call to the Priesthood. *Angelus Magazine* often features information about the nature, goals, events and offerings of the Office for Vocations.

But the concept of vocations is also a broadly-based set of realities for a wide range of people. Recently the *Angelus* gave us a profile of a particular vocation fulfilled by the venerable Vin Scully; someone who most certainly was suitable, worthy, and supremely dedicated to his occupation for 67 years at the mic for the Dodgers with a grace that touched many lives.

Pope Francis wrote about the concept of vocations in the Church and those of the secular world:

"In the diversity and the uniqueness of each and every vocation, personal and ecclesial, there is a need to listen, discern, and live this word that calls us from on high, and while enabling us to develop our talents, makes us instruments of salvation in the world and guides us to full happiness."

Paul, in writing to the settlement in Corinth wrote:

"Everyone should live the life that the Lord gave him and to which God called him."

The Bible readings this week include Corinthians, touching on the underpinnings of vocation:

"There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord."

Ephesians 4 describes love and fraternity as a common denominator of all true vocations. Paul urges the Ephesians to:

"live in a manner worthy of the call you have received with all humility and gentleness...through love..."

The *Catechism* includes, in its teachings about the call of vocations, a beautiful commentary by St. Therese of Lisieux:

"Love, in fact, is the vocation that includes all others..."

The Saint James Choir sings about the gifts of vocations:

"We are many parts, we are all one body, and the gifts we have we are given to share."

That spirit of sharing, fraternity, and love are prerequisites for all vocations, which offer happiness and which are a part of the grace that leads to ultimate salvation.

People who are concerned with their own advancement and agenda have little room for anyone else.

With an almost addictive pursuit of esteem and acknowledgment from others, they become little more than entitled embodiments of the vice of pride.

Public humiliation or embarrassment can hit them hard. While avoiding humiliation and embarrassment may be advantageous to obtaining worldly success, they are much less desirable motivations for entering the Kingdom of God. Avoiding embarrassment is a self-serving motivation.

Pride and all of its manifestations have no place on God's agenda, neither do worldly success and fulfillment. In fact, we have been clearly told that if we love our lives, we will lose them.

Therefore, if you really want to find your true station in life, learn to give yourself away.

While this may sound foolish to secular ears, it actually makes perfect sense. God, who is love, makes each of us in His image. Love, and therefore God, is in our DNA. That being the case, love is never love if it is kept to oneself or hoarded. Love needs to be shared and given away. Therefore, it is the only proper motivation for entering the Kingdom of God. The door to happiness is only opened when we realize that all we are and all we have is due only to God's grace. Without God we are nothing.

Love is the remedy for pride and protects us from ourselves. God asks us to be humble. Only when we are free from the traps of pride and arrogance that we can begin to follow the path to true humility. Only one who is humble can rightly love and be of service to God.

"God makes use only of the humble as his instruments (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)." The humble one does not need others to give them worth and value. Their self-esteem comes from the much more secure foundation of God. Only those who are entirely free can give themselves freely to others. Love must always be our motivation for doing all things. Be content that God has invited you to the banquet of life. Concern yourself with accepting the invitation, and don't worry about where you will sit. ©LPI

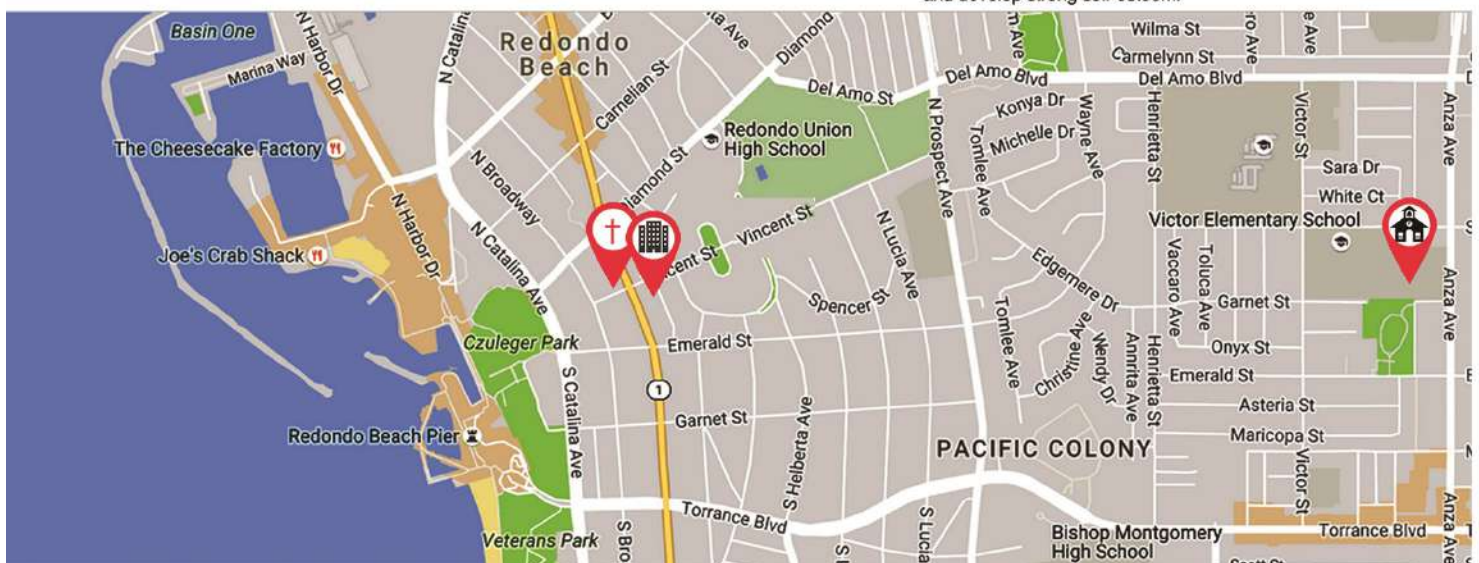
