

Catholic Q & A

This Week's Topic: Faith in Action

On a humid evening in late August, a newly-acquired relief pitcher for the Los Angeles Dodgers stepped onto the mound, looking to close out a ninth inning lead. Visible on his glove as he leaned in to take a sign was a handwritten notation of a Bible verse. It was **Romans 8:39**, drawn from Paul's longest letter to the Christians in Rome, all about foundational faith and the saving power of God for all believers.

Q: What is the significance of Paul's letters from circa 56 A.D. referenced on a baseball glove in Citi Field, Queens, New York City, more than one thousand nine hundred years after they were received in Rome?

A: *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches about the enduring Good News, wherein the believer's act of faith:

"...permit us to express the faith and to hand it on, to celebrate it in community, to assimilate and live on it more and more. Faith is an authentically human act; trusting in God and cleaving to the truths he has revealed...possible only by grace and...the Holy Spirit.

Pope St. John Paul II wrote in the winter of 2000: "We must tell the good news to all who are willing to listen."

Now of course, baseball is not actually found in the Bible, though in Genesis 1 we find what happened *"In the big inning..."* Seriously, in the Book of Job we find in Chapter 9:33 that good and well-tested man of God asking about an arbiter to stand between himself and his God. In some versions of that passage, the word, "arbiter" is replaced by the term, *"umpire."* It really is.

In the *Catholic New American Bible Revised Edition,* (available in our Gift Shop), Job 9:33 says "arbiter."

In the One Year Bible Catholic Edition, which includes the New Revised Standard Version, Job 9:33 actually says, "There is no umpire between us..." Another reading has it as: "Would that there were an umpire."

Well, our pitcher's fidelity to the Word in his evangelical messaging amid an athletic setting promotes the Good News in a unique setting. This particular part of the Bible reflects not only the staunch drive and unwavering focus and dedication of an athlete, but reflects an even higher dedication to persevere in a faith that offers eternal life. That chapter and verse on the glove from Romans 8:39 says:

"For I am convinced that neither death nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

The Catechism teaches that we can celebrate and cleave to the revealed word of God individually, or in an ecclesial setting, or even among a community of baseball fans. Go Dodgers!

Gospel Meditation

Since God created human beings, we have struggled to keep our focus on God. We wrestle with the question of "who is God" and foolishly believe some of God's job description can be better completed by us. We wander in different directions, lose our way, think that happiness can be found elsewhere and even construct golden calves to worship. Are we simply too independent or just blatantly stubborn? It's a good question to ask. Even with all of our silliness and distractions, God compassionately and patiently waits. He lets us assert our wills and knows that perhaps one day we will actually wake up and realize how lost we are.

"Since happiness is nothing other than the enjoyment of the highest good and since the highest good is above, no one can be made happy unless he rises above himself, not by an ascent of the body but of the heart. But we cannot rise above ourselves unless a higher power lifts us up ... Divine aid is available to those who seek it from their hearts, humbly and devoutly; and this means to sigh for it in this valley of tears, through fervent prayer (St. Bonaveture)." One of the biggest human struggles is discerning what, exactly, is the highest good. We are ordered to achieve it but if we pursue it with clouded vision, we will never truly find it.

One of the greatest obstacles to God's power and love is a stubborn, closed heart of stone. When we are fiercely determined to set our sights elsewhere for happiness or simply ride the popular currents of the day, we will never satisfy the deep ache and longing within. We know that ache well. It is precisely why we scurry all over the place, attempting to find the next best thing to take away its pain. Nothing in the created world ever can or will. We continue our journey. One day, people may wake up and realize that they are grazing in the wrong pasture and putting themselves in harm's way. When this awakening occurs, it will be a most joyous day as we will see God's wide-open arms waiting to receive us. "Lead me, Lord, in your path, and I will enter in your truth. Let my heart rejoice that it may fear your name (St. Bonaventure)." ©LPi




