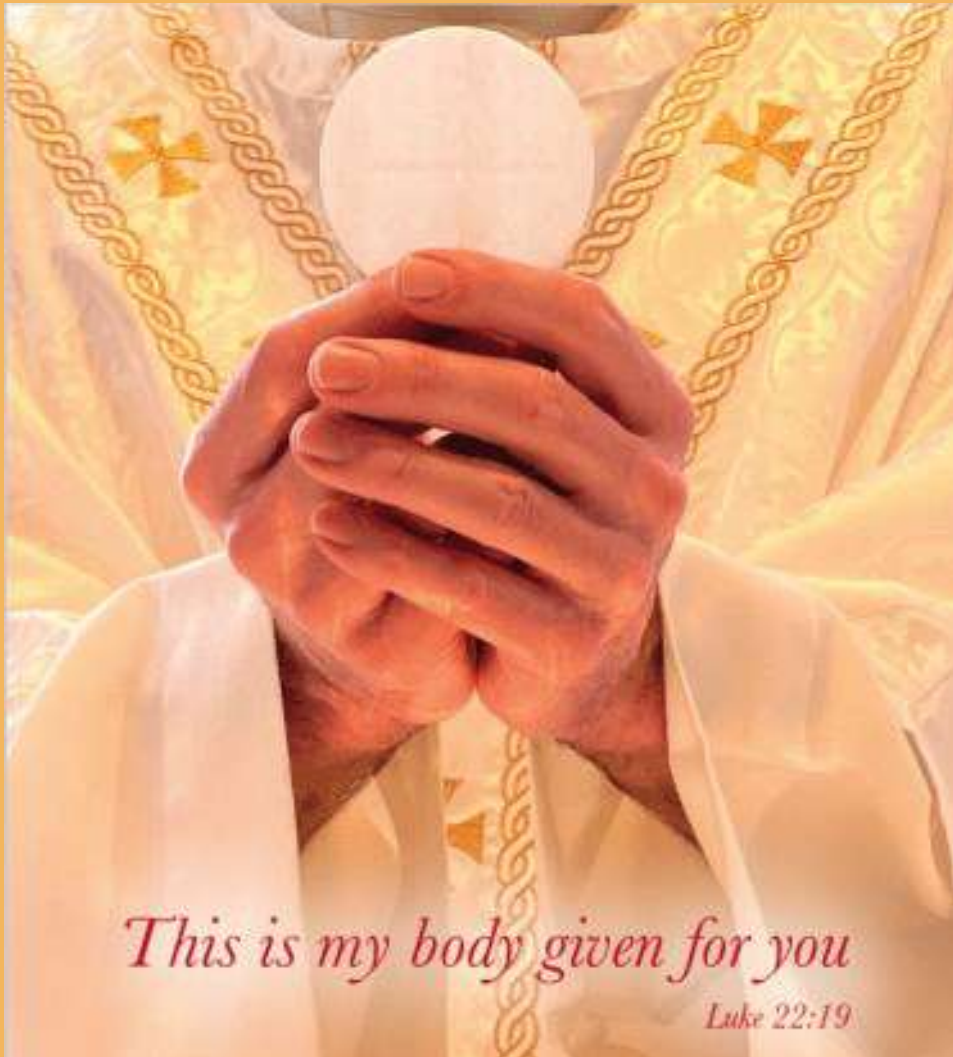

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

This week I will be leading a pilgrimage to Oberammergau, Germany for the **Passion Play** which has been performed there since 1634, since it was spared from the Black Death plague which killed about 60% of the population of Europe and the rest of the world. The play is performed every 10 years, but was delayed because of our own Covid plague.

There will be 43 pilgrims joining me, many of them from St. James. We look forward to this unique and moving event as we experience in a special way so many people in the gospels whose lives were changed because of their encounter with Christ.

We will be attending the play on Thursday, September 29th and returning on October 1st. Please keep our pilgrimage in your prayers.

This Week's Topic: Listen

Prepping for the first day of yet another school year, the teacher duly posted the Classroom Rules:

*Listen;
Give Your Best Effort;
Mind Your Manners.*

Effort and proper etiquette are fairly straightforward concepts, easy to grasp, but students would sometimes question the placement, value, and emphasis of that first classroom rule. The teacher explained that often the difference between an A student and a B student could be attributed to a qualitative measure of active listening skills; skills invaluable throughout life, and immediately necessary in working toward increased student achievement.

Q: How does the Church define what it means to truly listen, as part of a more fully-formed structure of faith?

A: Luke Chapter 8 says: "Take care then, how you hear..." In the First Letter of James, the author says that before one can be a doer of the word, that one should be, "...quick to hear..."

The Catechism says: "...a dialogue takes place between God and man, for we speak to him when we pray; we listen to him. Knock, in mental prayer, and it will be opened to you by contemplation."

It is said about St. John Vianney, the patron Saint of parish priests, that he fully embraced the priesthood as a way to listen to others, whether in the confessional or with a humble heart to listen to God's plan for himself. Pope Francis called this priestly function "the apostolate of the ear...listening in the attitude of a disciple."

The Pope also noted that people are quickly losing the ability to listen to one another. He asks that we engage in listening with the "ear of the heart" saying, "Fundamentally, listening is a dimension of love."

The Catechism, from Paragraph 144: To obey, from the Latin *ob-audire* (to "hear or listen to" in faith) is to submit freely to the word...The Virgin Mary is the most perfect embodiment.

St. Paul said that "Faith comes through listening." "Students listen to their parents and teachers, as parents and teachers reciprocate. Pastoral leaders humbly hear our petitions. The faithful hear the Word, and seek to listen to their neighbor. And we appreciate, always, that it is our God about whom it is said, "inclines his ear" to us.

Pope Francis relates a story about a respected Doctor who was asked about the greatest need of human beings. The Doctor's answer to that question: "The boundless desire to be heard."

Speak O, Lord, your servant is listening...

"You cannot serve both God and mammon."

Merriam-Webster defines mammon as material wealth or possessions, especially having a debasing influence. While God does not take issue with our need to use money for the business of our lives, there can be a problem with the attitudes we bring to it. We can easily become so preoccupied and obsessed with money that it becomes the real "god" we worship. Do we serve mammon instead of God? In their book, *Wealth, Riches and Money*, Craig Hill and Earl Pitts outline symptoms of mammon's influence in our lives. Some of these are worry and anxiety over money, money mismanagement, fear over "never having enough," an "I can't afford it" mentality, impulse buying, stinginess, greed, debt, and discontent.

Many of the things on that list can consume us to the point that we are distracted from what we really need to be doing. Many people spend an inordinate amount of time worrying about money and it becomes the source of their worst fears. If we are honest with ourselves, we need to admit that we place far more emphasis on our material securities than we ought. In fact, we have actually convinced ourselves that we cannot live without it. Are we that certain about the presence of God? Many of the world's problems, especially those involving inequity and injustice, result from conflicts about money. Many equate money with happiness. Those successful in accumulating large amounts of it quickly realize just how wrong they are.

"Your ultimate allegiance is not to the government, not to the state, not to nation, not to any man-made institution. The Christian owes his ultimate allegiance to God, and if any earthly institution conflicts with God's will it is your Christian duty to take a stand against it. You must never allow the transitory evanescent demands of man-made institutions to take precedence over the eternal demands of the Almighty God (Martin Luther King, Jr.)." This is the point Jesus is trying to make. Unfortunately, when we look around our man-made kingdoms are far more prevalent than God's kingdom. When we start seeing greater evidence of justice, equity, dignity, respect, opportunity, gentleness, holiness, solidarity, honesty, simplicity, care for creation, and a decrease in ambition, then we will know that God's kingdom is being served. We will be doing what we are supposed to do. ©LPi

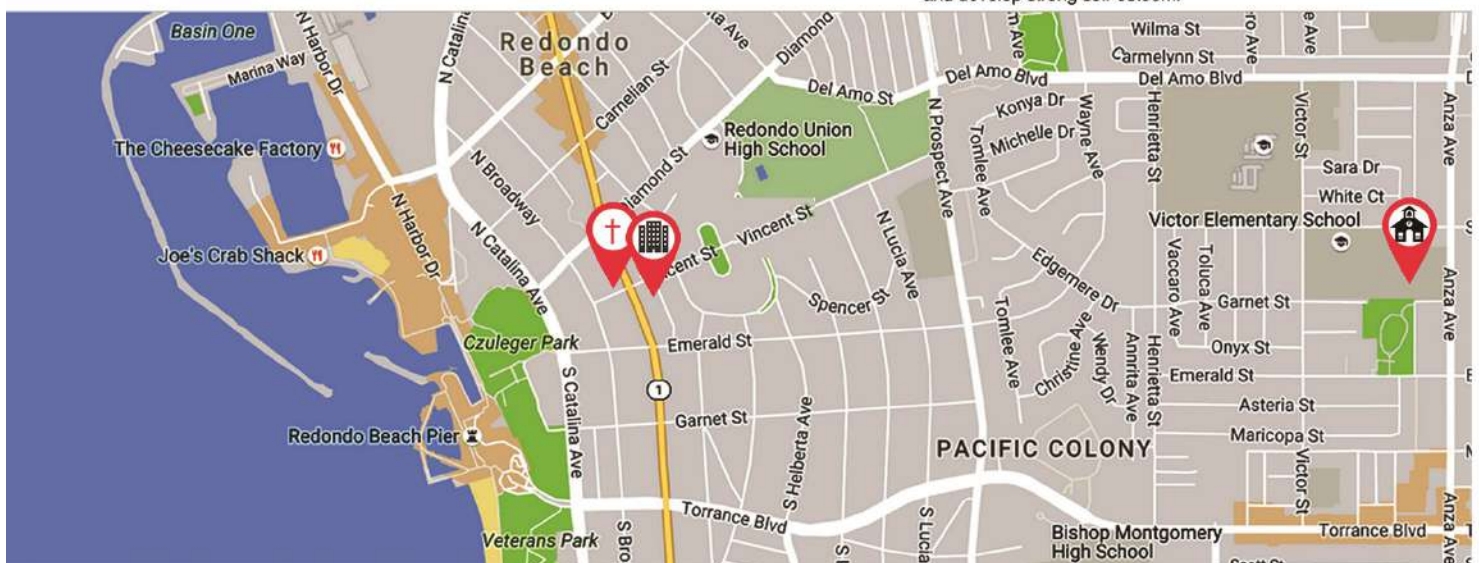
