Children's Liturgy of the Word

We encourage you to worship together as a family on Sundays during our 10am Family Mass. CLOW uses the Children's Lectionary (shorter, simplified readings tailored to little listeners!) and features a homily specifically addressed to young people.

CLOW will start again on October 9th.

About Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word will be available at the 10am Masses in the Parish Hall. This important ministry invites children to participate in Sunday worship and hear a reflection at an age appropriate level.

Children, ages 4-8, are invited to attend. Children's Liturgy of the Word is considered "church" even though the children are dismissed from the larger congregation for the Liturgy of the Word.

We provide sacred space for them to worship together with their peers. The children learn how to walk in a procession, sit quietly to listen to the Gospel story, prayerfully reflect on God's Holy Word with the adult leader, and then offer their own Prayers of the Faithful.

They, then process back into church to sit with their family for the rest of the Mass.

Process during Mass

After the opening prayer at Mass, the Presider will invite the children to the front of the church for a blessing. The children process from Mass to Kavanagh Hall. Parents are always welcome to attend with their children.

Leaders

We are currently looking for leaders and teen volunteers to help with this ministry. The leaders for the Liturgy of the Word for children receive special training and resources. We will have two adult leaders who prepare for this special ministry with children.

Each Liturgy of the Word leader must have a current VIRTUS certificate prior to working with the children and must be fingerprinted by the Archdiocese.

Children's Liturgy of the Word is offered on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month at 10am Mass.

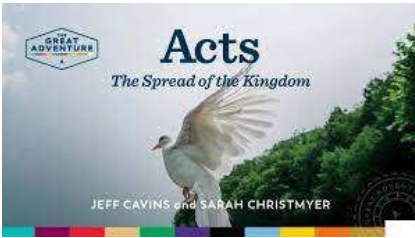

Please Vote "No" on Prop 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars.

Prop 1 isn't needed. Sadly, California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation, but with reasonable limits on late-term abortions — which will still be allowed without the amendment for the life and health of the mother. Prop 1 destroys this common-sense limit.

California does not limit state spending on abortion, and with thousands more traveling from other states, the cost will be in the hundreds of millions. Don't hand lawmakers a blank check to pay for abortions, and don't let them make California an "abortion sanctuary."

Common Myths About Proposition 1

Q: Will a "No" vote on Prop 1 end abortion in California?

A: NO, it will keep all abortion laws as they are.

Q: Will Prop 1 preserve our current common-sense limits on late-term abortions?

A: NO, all limits will be removed, even moments before birth!

Q: How much will Prop 1 cost me as a California taxpayer?

A: Hundreds of millions and counting.

Q: Does Prop 1 give equitable support for women to continue their pregnancy?

A: NO, not at all

This Week's Topic: Essential Elements

The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls it: "The raising of one's mind and heart to God; an act of the moral virtue of religion; part of a vital and personal relationship with the living and true God; the lifeblood of faith, without which your faith will die."

Catholic theologians identify it as, "a part of the cardinal virtue of justice; expressed vocally or mentally." It's been called, "essential to the Christian life; compatible with everyday life."

St. Therese called it: "A surge of the heart; a simple look turned toward heaven. It is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy."

Being compatible with everyday life, part of the fabric of life, you'll find it here at St. James, not only in the Sanctuary at Mass, but heartily present as part of the preliminaries at: Finance Council Meetings, Liturgy Committee Meetings, Pastoral Council Meetings, many other Parish gatherings, and at Wednesday evening Choir practice, before the first song selection reaches its downbeat.

Q: What is it?

A: This raising of heart and mind to God, mysterious and beautifully effective, is **Prayer**.

The Catechism describes the many forms and functions of prayer. One divinely beautiful form of prayer, the Prayer of Intercession is heard at Mass, which we punctuate with a plea for the Lord to, "hear our prayer." It's also the form of prayer that the Choir prays. The Apostolate Center characterizes the essence of intercessory prayer:

"Praying for others is a way of loving them. Prayer for others allows us to grow in compassion and keeps us from focusing on selfish concerns. It is characteristic of the heart attuned to God's mercy."

Prayer.

A simple look toward heaven; a surge of the Christian heart in trial and in joy; part of the wondrous mercy of God.

Ten lepers were cured.

Only one returned to give thanks. When we fall victim to entitlement, we diminish our capacity to love. Never satisfied, we walk around with outstretched arms, eagerly searching for the next thing we want so that we can acquire it ourselves. Very rarely do entitled hands hold anything to freely give away to others. Entitled hands also find it challenging to reach toward heaven in a gesture of gratitude and praise. We are often more obsessed with celebrating our victories, securing our assets, safeguarding our futures, and stacking the deck of life in our favor rather than relishing and absorbing the gift of the moment and blessings received.

Entitled people find it difficult to pray properly. When the subject of our prayer is mostly about our needs and wants, we are falling into the trap of deception.

We foolishly try to convince God that our tiny worlds are of greater importance than His. In ancient times, people would offer sacrifices to "the gods" to secure protection and favors. Our God desires mercy, not sacrifice, because He is about love and justice, not simply meeting our agendas. Every breath is a gift. Prayer, which is a celebration of that gift, acknowledges the Giver.

Prayer strengthens the bond between Giver and receiver, creating a deepening awareness that nothing I am or anything I have can exist apart from His Divine Will. It also reminds us that we have done nothing to merit the unconditional love and mercy God showers upon us. Prayer is not just about getting what I need but celebrating who I am.

For St. Therese of Lisieux prayer is

*"a surge of the heart;
it is a simple look turned toward heaven,
it is a cry of recognition and of love,
embracing both trial and joy."*

When our hearts "surge" toward God, we rush to the Source of our restoration and wholeness, knowing our longing for God's Divine embrace. Prayer is a response to God's graciousness with an act of gratitude returned by us. In prayer, we gaze upon each other in that sacred space where I give myself to God as He is, and God gives Himself to me as I am.

We cannot take another step without saying thank you.

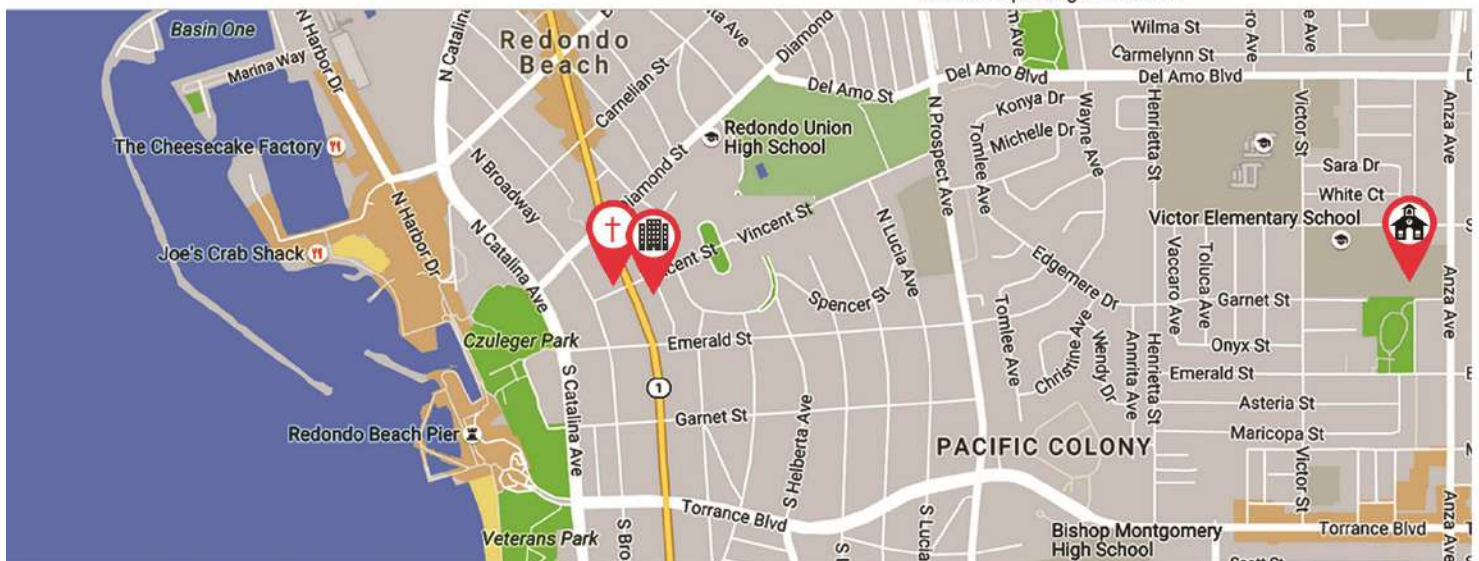
