Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

Financial Settlement Received for St. James School

Please see the letter in this bulletin from the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, our school principal, Mrs. Noreen Maricich and myself. We have just received a check from our insurance carrier for \$1,019,263 and a check from the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet for 300,000. This is a much greater settlement than we expected, and we are grateful to the legal and audit departments at the Archdiocese for their extensive efforts in support of St. James and the generosity of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet.

Mrs. Maricich and I have almost completed the formation of a 15 member advisory committee to help establish a plan for the wise use of these funds to provide for our school now and for the future. This committee is made up of current and past teachers, current and past parents, past students and a member of the parish Pastoral Council and Finance Council.

The funds will be invested for exclusive use of St. James School under the direction of the Archdiocesan Finance Council. They have a successful track record managing the investment funds of the Archdiocese, all parishes and schools, the seminary, cemeteries and other entities.

We are grateful for this settlement and look forward to the opportunities this provides for our school, its staff and school families, both now and into the future.

Altar Servers are Back !!

We are so happy that we are able to begin the ministry of our Altar Servers assisting at our Sunday Masses again. After our COVID safety break we will begin information and training sessions. This is a wonderful ministry for our children to be able to experience the Mass up close and participate in our worship in a way that allows them to have a greater knowledge and appreciation of our faith and their relationship with Jesus Christ.

Two Information Sessions will be available next week and interested students in Grade 5 or higher should attend just one of the meetings with a parent/guardian.

The Information Sessions will be on **Sunday, October 16th** from **2-3 pm** and **Saturday, October 22nd** from **10-11 am** in the Church.

Dear Members of the St. James School Community:

We are writing to you as important members of our St. James family, to advise you of financial compensation arrangements that have been concluded to address the losses that were incurred at the School.

The School has received \$1,019,263 from coverage provided by insurers for the Archdiocese and the School. In recognition of their long-standing commitment to Catholic education in the Archdiocese, the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, who served the school from its founding in 1918, are making a restricted, voluntary gift to the School. The gift of \$300,000 is to be utilized exclusively for long term tuition assistance. As a result, the School is receiving a total of \$1,319,263 to be used for its ongoing mission.

In consultation with the Archdiocese, Monsignor Meyers, as Pastor and Noreen Maricich, as Principal, will be forming a small advisory committee from the School community, including current and former staff, parents and students. The committee will be asked to consider and propose a strategic long-term plan for the effective use of all these funds, including the tuition assistance gift from the Sisters. The goal will be to use the funds to recognize the School and its educational legacy and to support and enhance the School and its staff, facilities and program for future generations of students and families. This will be a careful and prayerful process. Until the funds are used for the designated purposes, they will be segregated and invested.

We trust and pray that this will close a difficult chapter for the School community and the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet and will provide a positive outcome for the future as the committee considers the long-term uses for the funding. We deeply appreciate the restricted gift and participation by the Sisters and the professional efforts by many in recovering the insurance funding for the School.

Please keep all current and past students, staff, and families in your thoughts and prayers as they work to embody and reflect the School mission and commitment to our community.

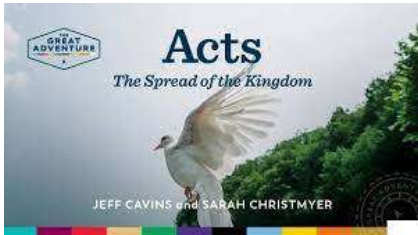

Please Vote "No" on Prop 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars.

Prop 1 isn't needed. Sadly, California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation, but with reasonable limits on late-term abortions — which will still be allowed without the amendment for the life and health of the mother. Prop 1 destroys this common-sense limit.

This Week's Topic: Faith in Action

Less than two weeks after undergoing successful minor surgery, a St. James parishioner slowly entered Church for the Sunday 6:30 Mass, anxious to express thanks for God's beneficence, as well to fulfill the precepts of the Third Commandment.

Trying to get to Mass on time, the parishioner realized that the School Support Envelope that was in hand was now missing. Walking back to the car, scanning the ground in the still pre-dawn light; no envelope.

Back across the parking lot and into the Church where Monsignor was already seated for the first reading.

Late for Mass, in continuous, dull postoperative pain, and frazzled by circumstances including a lost personal check floating in the ether somewhere, it was time to go home and search and retrace steps.

No luck. Going back for the 8am Mass, worried and not in the proper worship disposition, the parishioner was not particularly anxious to hear the Good News that surely couldn't overcome the bad news of the morning. Monsignor Mike was walking by just before Mass. An usher and the parishioner asked about checking the collections for that envelope. No luck in that search effort.

Yet, the readings of that day with Father Paul presiding, did prevail.

Reading 1 from the minor prophet Habakuk aligned in a major way with the words, "...why must I look at misery?"

Then, in the reading of Paul's letter to Timothy, we were reminded that,

God gave us a spirit that included self-control."

The Gospel reading from Luke spoke about having faith, the size of a mustard seed..." It was decided internally now to simply have faith that things would work out for the good; no need to move mountains or mulberry trees; and there was a reading about, "harden not your heart..."

Later that Sunday afternoon, Monsignor took the time to contact the parishioner that, indeed, the envelope was found on the ground near the Silent Auction booth. Faith. Later that day at home, the same parishioner picked up a notebook which had on its cover a quote from Matthew 19: "With God, all things are possible."

Q: What does *the Catechism* say?

A: Paragraph 131: "*And such is the force and power of the Word of God that it can serve the Church as her support and vigor and the children of the Church as strength for their faith, food for the soul, and a font of spiritual life.*"

Brendan wouldn't stop.

He continued nagging his mom to let him have a little more time with his phone. He knew the rules but wanted to finish a game and text a few more friends. He begged, had a temper tantrum, pleaded, screamed, pouted, and used every means he could think of to get Mom to change her mind. Mom had a busy day and was tired.

At first, she held her ground. Then, her son's persistence got the best of her, and she caved.

"Brendan, you can have 30 more minutes and no more!" she retorted. Brendan's determination paid off. He won.

Is this how it works with God too?

If we want something enough and feel it is our due, does our persistence allow us to eventually get our way?

Judging God by human standards, it would seem so. But is this the way God works?

It gets a bit confusing when Jesus tells his disciples to "pray always without becoming weary" and then further tells them how God will "secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night."

If we catch God at the right time, when he's having a weak moment, then our tenacity ought to pay off. What we want, we will get. Really?

Sadly, the way many approach prayer suggests that this is precisely how it goes.

Good parents set boundaries and offer proper discipline. They learn the art of being steadfast when presented with determined minds and wills. They know what is best and, at times, have to say "no." God is always there with His full attention and unconditional love showering itself upon us. God also knows what is best.

And, as with any good parent, the one constant that is always available and never withheld is love. We can be as persistent and determined as we want if what we are seeking is God's love. We are never a bother and requests for God's love are never denied. This is the prayer of the heart. Desiring God alone and not only what we want God to do for us places this love relationship foremost in our minds, hearts, and souls. God is never bothered by this prayer. As we breathe in and exhale out, the Divine Life freely flows.

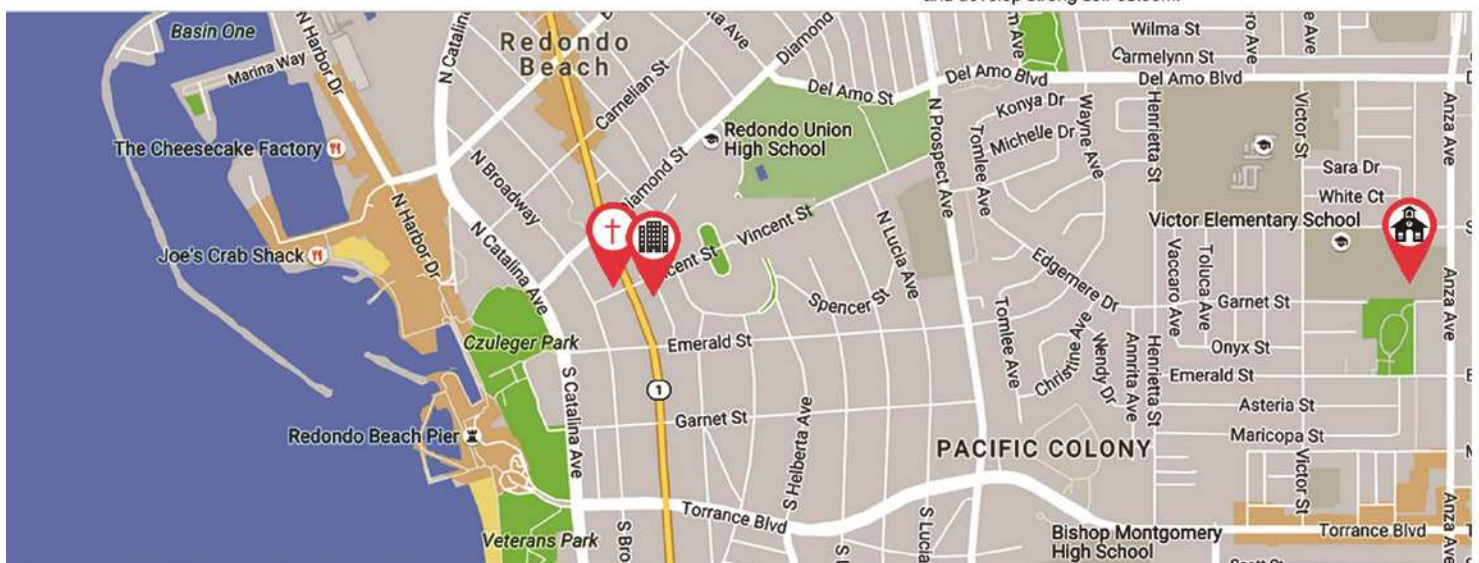
