Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

World Mission Sunday

From my 16 years serving as Associate Director and Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, I worked closely with missionary bishops and priests. I travelled each year to mission dioceses around the world in support of our Lay Mission-Helpers Association sending lay professionals to volunteer their services overseas.

My office today reflects the impact of those mission experiences. It was a unique and wonderfully enriching experience that most priests never have.



World Mission Sunday is the single most important collection for the support of the 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and parts of Latin America, supporting the proclamation of the Gospel, the building of the church, and service to the poor.

Please Vote "No" on Prop 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars.

Prop 1 isn't needed. Sadly, California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation, but with reasonable limits on late-term abortions — which will still be allowed without the amendment for the life and health of the mother. Prop 1 destroys this common-sense limit.

This Week's Topic: Gratitude

This week, in both secular and spiritual settings, the concept of being thankful is front and center to a distinct degree. For example, rereading the 1719 classic story of castaway Robinson Crusoe, for sheer reading pleasure, one also revisits, amid the pages of an engrossing literary tale, several weighty key themes, including a major theme regarding religion and God's providence. The protagonist comes to the realization that despite his early Christian upbringing, he had never thought to thank God for allowing him to survive the trauma of his amazing experiences. Alone on an island, our hero begins to feel transformative, saving gratitude, finding the light of hope in the word of God.

It happens that our spiritual journey this week also has much to present about authentic gratitude; gratitude for a present, living God.

Q: What does our faith say about giving thanks?

A: *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* has many teachings about gratitude, including Paragraph 2648: "Every joy and suffering, every event and need, can become the matter for thanksgiving which, sharing in that of Christ, should fill one's whole life."

In a homily on an early Sunday morning, Father Jim talked about the thematic components of the Mass, including gratitude. The very word Eucharist, "the central act of Christian worship", comes from the Greek for thanksgiving. We are also thankful for the recent course of treatment that Father Jim received; treatment that was challenging but effectively promising along his road of recovery and good health. Thanks be to God.

In a General Audience, Pope Francis said that Catholics can change the world by being "bearers of gratitude." He called the virtue of thankfulness, "a hallmark of an authentic Christian life."

We read again this week about the ten lepers, only one of which was a bearer of gratitude.

So it is that we find joy in being thankful for each other, thankful for our faith, our Church, our ability to help those in need, thankful for our clergy, our healthcare providers, for teachers, for music, for baseball, for our post-pandemic outlook, for God's saving grace, for harvest festivals and as the Irish Bishops say, in an elemental way, thankful for "the rocks and the trees."

Our Choir sings many songs of thanks including a Henry Smith piece, "Give Thanks" based on a 17th century German Canon in beautiful D Major tones, popular in modern wedding settings:

"Give thanks with a grateful heart, Give thanks, thanks for the Holy One. Give thanks because He's given Jesus Christ, His Son."

Another reading from this week, highlighting thankfulness, comes from one of Paul's letters to the settlement at Thessalonica. Here we find terms, simple and true, applicable to a fictional Robinson Crusoe on an island, and to that real communion of believers here at St. James and around the world, who live a thankful and authentic Christian life: 1 Thessalonians Chapter 5:

"In all circumstances, give thanks."

There is a thing called "false piety."

It is when we wear a religious disguise of devotion, attend to our obligations, and outwardly abide by rules while being inwardly unkind, uncharitable, and exclusive.

Wearing the right clothes, saying the proper prayers, being in sacred places, and reading devotional books, those exhibiting false piety craftily try to control others using the pretense of love. The Pharisees, consistently criticized by Jesus, are prime examples. Thinking they are superior to others, they foolishly believe they are better positioned with God and more worthy of God's attention.

Forming an exclusive "club," they divide things between "mine" and "yours" and "us" and "them."

They quickly criticize and point out flaws and errors in rituals and thinking. Conformity becomes the first commandment and control is the game's name. The requirements for "club membership" are clear: do what we do, think what we think, and believe what we believe.

Attempting to control others using the lure of "status" or "salvation," they seduce others into thinking that conformity is the only way to holiness. Clinging to "my beliefs," "my parish," "my way of thinking," they fail to see the more significant relationship with God that is veiled in all of these superficial rules and practices.

Shallow, hollow, and empty vessels, they gloss over the more important virtues of justice, mercy, faithfulness, and forgiveness. Sparkling clean on the outside, but dirty on the inside. Spiritual arrogance is a grave sin. It alienates and hurts the little ones, those considered "least" in the kingdom.

God knows no favorites.

Everyone belongs regardless of whether you are an official, bona fide member. Sometimes membership may be a detriment to actually living the Gospel if you're joining the team for the wrong reasons. The genuinely humble ones may not appear to be overly "pious." They may not know all of the proper prayers or abide by all of the correct rituals, but they know that they are broken and need mercy. There is no shame in being broken. In fact, many things need to be broken in order to be what they truly are! There is a reason Jesus told us to pray in private. It's only between you and God. It is nobody else's business.

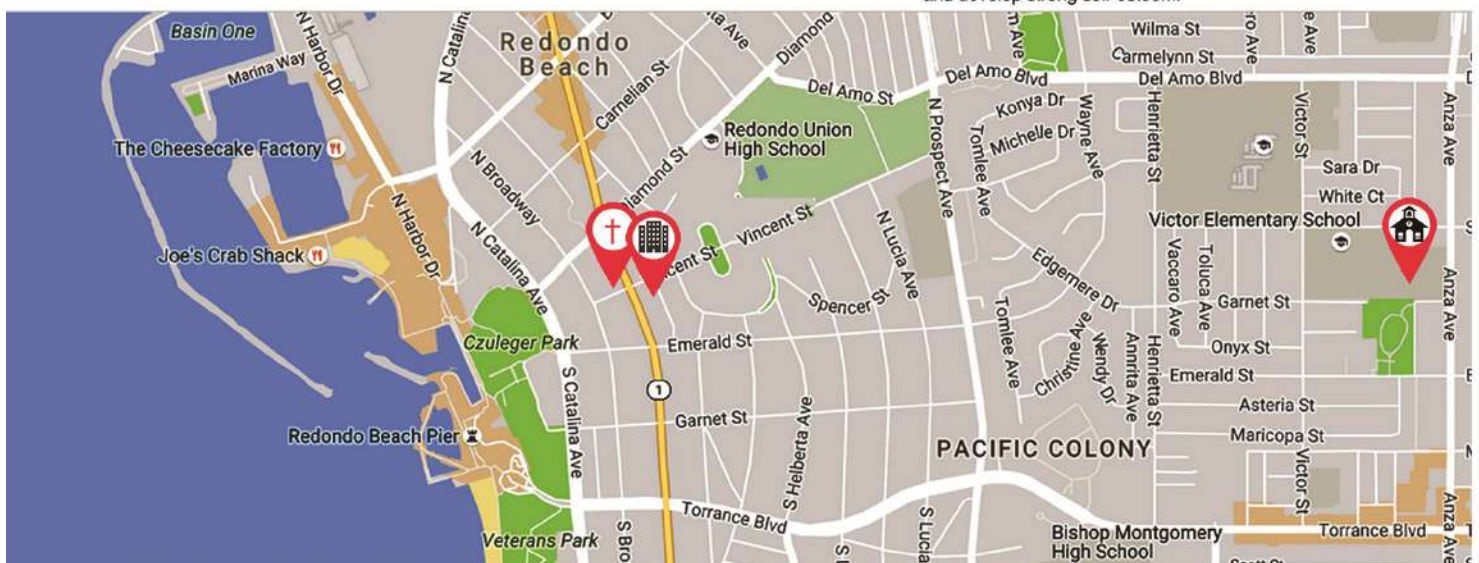
