### ALL SOULS DAY MEMORIAL MASS On Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>

Wednesday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> is **All Souls Day**. Our **7 pm Mass** is a sacred time when our community gathers as we remember and pray for our deceased relatives and friends. We invite you to join us for this Mass especially if you have loved ones who have died during the past year. For many it is a time of grace and healing by God's compassionate love.

At St. James it is also a Mass to remember in a special way and honor the 62 people who have been buried from our parish during the last year (September to September).

We will continue our All Souls Novena during the month remembering those who have died. Envelopes are located in the vestibules of the church and can be returned in the collection basket or brought to the parish office. The envelopes with your loved ones' names will be placed on our altar for the entire month of November.

### ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT

The reduction of our Sunday Offertory during the pandemic was a challenge but by deferring maintenance to our facilities and cutting other expenses we were able to provide a stable outreach and ministry program. 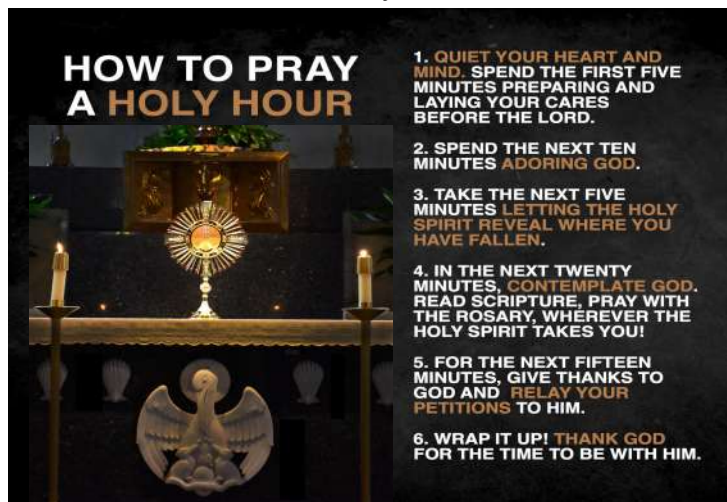

## Catholics United to Protect and Support Women, Children, and Families

### Please Vote "No" on Prop 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars.

## This Week's Topic: Say and Pray

**Q:** What form of prayer is it that:

Began in the Middle Ages; evolved from ancient practices and was originally designed for people of piety who could not read; a form of prayer that includes a formal statement, a creed, of Christian beliefs; a form of prayer noted by St. John Paul II as his favorite prayer; prayer marked by the Church for special highlighted observance and rededication in the month of October; a prayer recognized as a meditative prayer; it's a biblical prayer; a prayer recited by a large group, or individually, or in a family setting; a prayer that includes a doxology, that familiar liturgical formula of praise to God; a prayer of divine mystery; a prayer that calls upon a most gracious advocate; it's a prayer of joy and illumination, a prayer of sorrow, and glory.

What is this prayer of sighs, of mourning and weeping, wherein we, banished children of Eve, find guidance and hope along the decades of its most holy beads that honor Christ our Lord?

**A:** *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* in the section called "Expressions of Prayer" teaches in Paragraph 2708:

"Meditation engages thought, imagination, emotion, and desire. This mobilization of faculties is necessary in order to deepen our convictions of faith, prompt the conversion of our heart, and strengthen our will to follow Christ. Christian prayer tries above all to meditate on the mysteries of Christ, as in *lectio divina*, or **the rosary**.

Join us as we pray the rosary after the 8am Mass Monday through Saturday.



Barry had a life sentence in prison for doing unthinkable crimes.

He would often remark to the chaplain that he was an atheist and could not bring himself to believe in any "god." When the chaplain asked why, Barry quickly retorted that the book of Genesis speaks of God creating everything and feeling very good about it. God's creation of people and things is beautiful.

Barry continued, "If there is a God who creates something and likes what He makes and that God is good, then how could He have created someone as evil as me?"

The chaplain fell silent as tears welled up in his eyes. "God loves you too, Barry. The stuff that you did is another matter. God puts His image and likeness in each one of us, in our souls. How can God not love himself?"

God cannot despise or hate anything or anyone. He made you. Life hurt you. He is always about unconditional love and mercy. Barry found a glimmer of hope that day and was touched by love.

Zacchaeus met love incarnate in Jesus. He knew there was something special about him, and he had to see Jesus for himself. Realizing and knowing God's unconditional, penetrating love is a game-changer. Sinners don't repulse Jesus, he wants to eat with them! We can often find ourselves conflicted about how God sees us. We want to believe that He loves us, but other tapes playing in our heads convince us that this cannot be true. We carry our sins around like heavy sacks weighing on our shoulders. We are crippled.

God's divine blessing lives in each of our souls. It is our essential goodness, a free gift given to us by God. The beginnings of salvation's blessings are discovered when we begin to understand who God is, who we are, and how we are to act relative to our brothers and sisters.

We become more focused and courageous, eager to gather up all of the fragments of our lives and become whole. Zacchaeus, after meeting Jesus, finally knew who he was. He saw his sins and his potential for goodness as a blest child of God. When we allow God to meet us and touch us in such a profound way, we find what our selfishness has lost.

We are on the road to salvation.

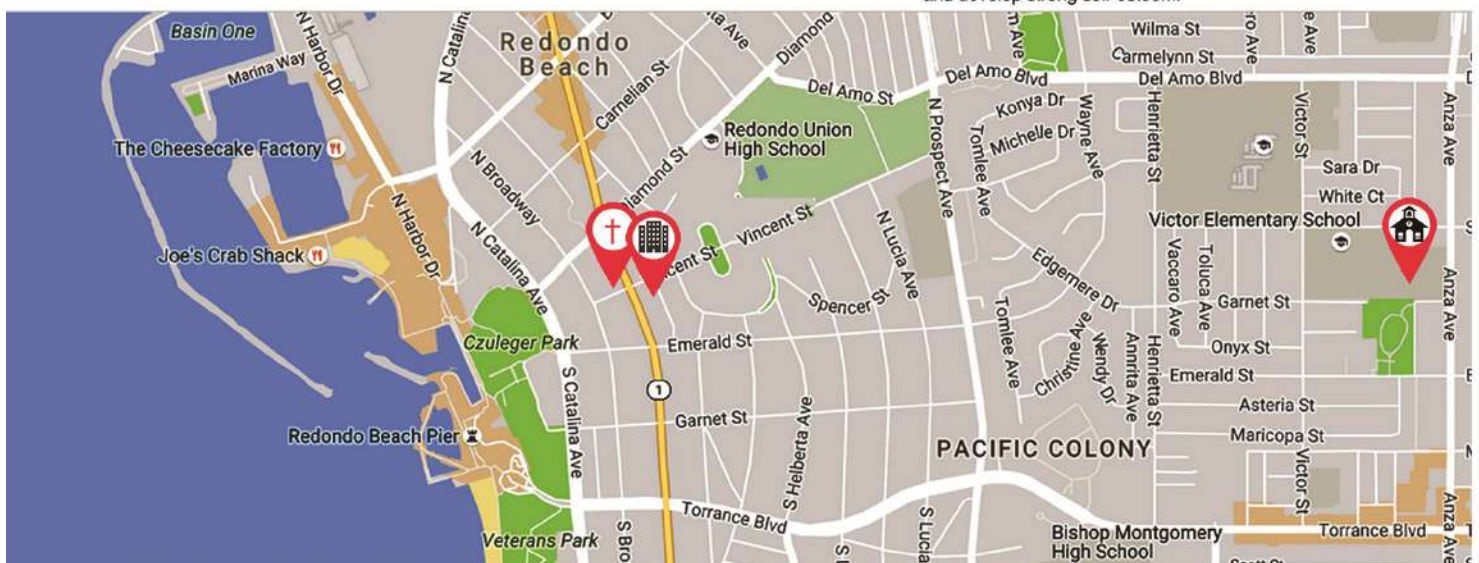
