Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

On Receiving Eucharist from the Chalice

As the pandemic subsides a bit the question is being asked of me on a regular basis about when we will be able to receive from the chalice again. For me as well, it does seem so strange to be the only one to receive Communion from the chalice. It has been discussed by the Council of Priests with Archbishop Gomez and the feeling is that while most of the precautions used during Covid have been set aside, we need to wait more to see what might happen next.

Both the history and theology of receiving the precious Body and Blood of Christ under both species of bread and wine is long and complicated. From the earliest days of the Church the faithful received Communion under both species of the bread and wine. This practice was standard in the Church until the 12th century. Over the centuries, under the concern for being in the state of grace, the community reception from the chalice faded. In the mid 1300's the bubonic plague certainly put an end to it.

By the time of the Council of Trent in 1545, the Council taught that Christ is sacramentally (and equally) present under each species, and therefore if a person receives only one species, Christ is fully present and nothing is lacking.

While the pandemic has caused us to temporarily set the use of the Chalice aside for the health and safety of all, and it has certainly caused me to become more conscious of my reception of the Body and Blood of Christ from the chalice in the species of wine. Each time I receive from the chalice I continue to do so in the name of each of you and of the entire community of the Church, affirming the act of Christ in His gift of His Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity for the salvation of us all.

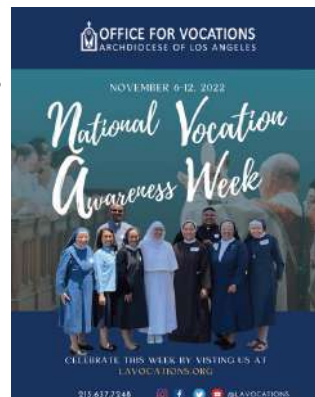
We encourage the celebration of votive Masses for vocations, the dedication of Holy Hours or Rosaries to vocations, and for our priests and religious to share their stories with the community.



Please Vote "No" on Prop 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars.

This Week's Topic: Sainly Ways

A parishioner marks several notables among her favorite Saints, including St. Anne, who biographers say "humbly adored the divine will," and St. Charles Borromeo, whose life epitomized what John the Baptist proclaimed in the desert: "...He must increase, but I must decrease."

Q: What lessons abound from these and all the Saints who lived lives of zealous, timeless faith ?

A: St. Charles and St. Anne led lives that took them along the four-step road to Canonization: from *Servant of God*, to being designated by the Church as *Venerable*, to step three, being named *Blessed*, to achieving the final level, *Sainthood*. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* says that if you want to learn about the saints that you'll be learning about holiness.

St. Charles, as Archbishop of Milan in the later part of the 16th century, founded schools for the poor and seminaries for clerics. During the plague he remained on the frontlines with the poverty-stricken. *The Catechism* teaches about charity as a work of love, as a theological virtue, as a beacon of hope and fruit of the Holy Spirit. St. Charles' biographers hold that he was resolute in fulfilling the "everyday demands of God."

St. Anne, the spouse of St. Joachim was, "chosen by God to be the mother of Mary, His own blessed Mother on earth." Anne took Mary, when the child was three years old, into the Temple, having vowed her daughter to God. Biographers hold St. Anne as a shining example of divine vocation, sacrifice, and one who honored the call of God.

So we observe our obligation at All Saints, marveling at the incredible saintly faith journeys, journeys of purity, or sometimes dissolute lives, that underwent conversion, reaching supreme levels of faith, and sometimes martyrdom. We read the scriptures of the day about striving for holiness. We contemplate Paul's Letter to Titus where he admonishes in this week's readings in the spirit of sainthood, that the faithful should "devote themselves to good works, which are excellent and beneficial to others."

Pope Francis summarizes for us: *"The saints are precious pearls ...they provide a fascinating commentary on the Gospel. Their lives are like a catechism in pictures, an illustration of the Good News that Jesus brought to humanity...the universal call to holiness..."*

As we strive to answer the holy will of God as Saint Anne, and to resolutely fulfill every duty demanded by God as St. Charles exemplified, we continue to address the litany of saints with hope:

"All you holy men and women pray for us."

Facing her 50th birthday and recently diagnosed with Type-2 Diabetes, Rebecca was at a crossroads.

Realizing that she had neglected her health and fitness over the years and allowed herself to gain significant weight, she felt poorly about who she had become.

While it was easier to give in to temptation and the gratification received from food, her family needed her, and she desired a long life. She had an image of the person she could become. She wanted to be more trim, focused, disciplined, and healthy. She liked what she saw in her mind and set out on a journey to create it. With great effort, she succeeded and accomplished her goals. When we have a goal ahead of us, we are more apt to do whatever is necessary to get it.

Is heaven a goal you want to achieve?

Our popular images and metaphors to describe heaven can leave some people wondering if this is something they want for all eternity. Living like an angel, wearing white robes, meeting St. Peter, and reconnecting with loved ones are all welcome notions to some extent.

But do they really inspire and captivate us enough to want to dramatically change how we live our lives?

Heaven's reality is more profound than any human image or idea can fathom. Even though we believe in a bodily resurrection, heaven is more about attaining union with God. To achieve heaven is to attain eternal happiness and fulfill all desire. How do we awaken within us an ardent and passionate desire for heaven?

St. Isaac of Ninevah counsels,

"Enter eagerly into the treasure house that lies within you, and so you will see the treasure house of heaven, for the two are one and the same, and there is but one single entry into them both. The ladder that leads to the kingdom is hidden with you, and is found in your own soul. Dive into yourself and in your soul you will discover the rungs by which to ascend."

Our souls are made to be eternal. Once we discover our true selves and are captivated by the wonder of who we really are, we will unleash our unwavering desire for a lasting union with our Creator. Heaven is about who we are. "For seeing you, our God, as you are, we shall be like you for all the ages." ©LPi

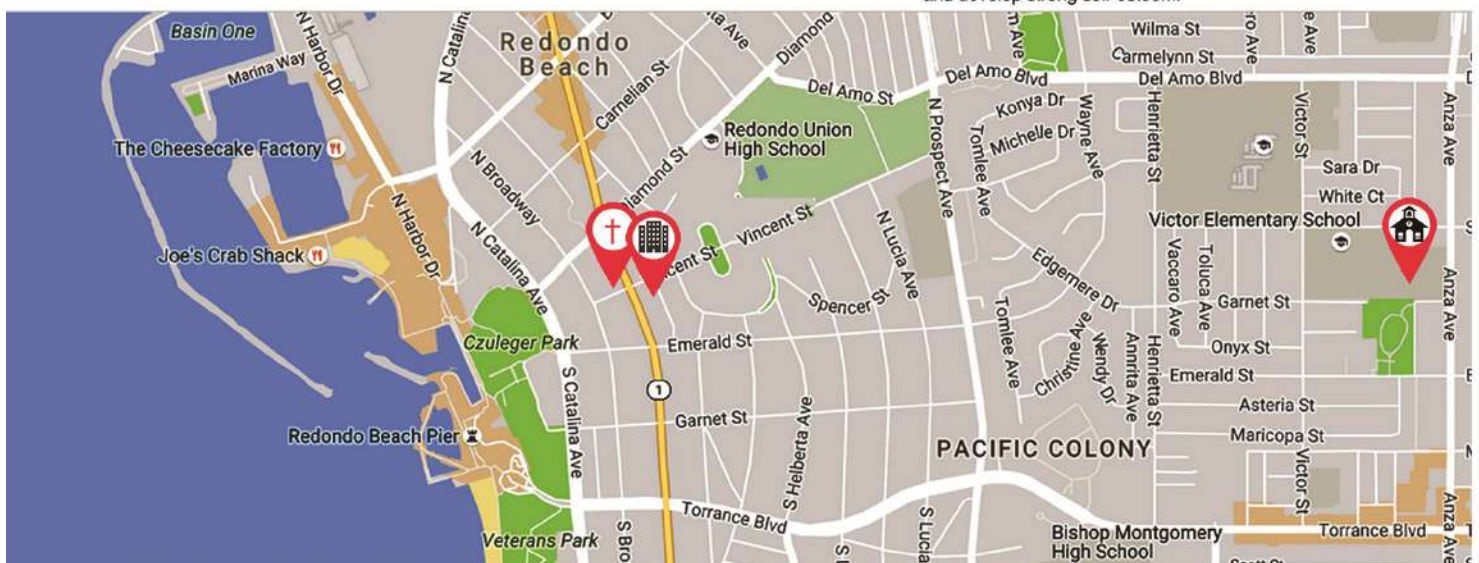
