## St. James Settlement Advisory Committee Seeks Parishioner's Input

As published in our October 16<sup>th</sup> bulletin, St. James School received an insurance settlement of \$1,019M for losses that were incurred at the school as well as a \$300K gift from the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet to be used exclusively for long term tuition assistance.

The St. James Settlement Advisory Committee is a small group that meets the requirements of the settlement agreement. It has been assembled to begin the process of determining the current and future needs of our school and the best use of the insurance settlement.



# Spiritual Servants, Companions, Guardians, and Messengers

In a homily which was a catechesis on Angels, Pope Francis referred to the words of the Nicene Creed:

"I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen."

**Q:** What does the Church say about Angels, these unseen guardians that Pope Francis called, "companions along the journey?"

**A:** The Catechism of the Catholic Church in Paragraph 334 teaches:

"The whole life of the Church benefits from the mysterious and powerful help of angels."

The *Catechism* goes on to highlight angels, present since creation and active throughout the history of salvation:

...there at the closing of the earthly paradise; protecting Lot; saving Hagar and her child; staying Abraham's hand over his son, Isaac; announcing the birth of Christ; and protecting Jesus as he was tested in arid deserts.

Angels are invoked in funeral liturgy: "In Paradisum deducant te angeli... May the angels lead you into paradise..."

Paragraph 336 is particularly comforting to each of us as we maneuver through the world:

"Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd...surrounded by their watchful care and intercession..."

#### Angels.

In Latin *angelus*, in Greek, *aggelos*; from the Hebrew for "one going or one sent; messenger."

Pope Francis said that "the existence of angels is willed by an act of God's eternal love."

As we ponder and viscerally appreciate this angelically divine love, we hear the musical strains of our angelic Choir who, in beautifully ethereal dynamics, sings about the presence of things unseen:

#### "...And I know that there are angels, all around..."



## **Gospel Meditation**

Many make it their life's ambition to determine precisely when the world will end.

By reading the signs of the times, consulting scripture, or looking to prophetic predictions that are sometimes centuries old, they claim a certain credibility in being able to do so. Is all that necessary to know?

Even when his disciples pointedly ask him this question, Jesus does not directly answer. While the end will inevitably come, Jesus points out that there is a lot we need to do first: remain faithful, face persecution, endure suffering, face wars and insurrections, and give testimony.

Human beings tend to focus their energies on the wrong kingdom. Consumed with all of the things we have built and seeking to preserve them, we forget that we belong to a different kingdom, the Kingdom of God.

All of the "stuff" we have constructed will be taken away. All that will remain is God's kingdom. Which kingdom do we prefer?

We answer that question by honestly looking at where we invest most of our time and energy. What matters to us as we embrace a new moment or day in our lives? If our relationship with God, the strength and integrity of our souls, and the steadfastness of our character are of utmost importance, then it matters little when the physical end will come. We will have what we need to persevere, endure, and confront whatever comes our way. Jesus cautions that we do not allow ourselves to be overwhelmed or overly terrified by the agonies and disappointments of the world. Although we may be apprehensive and uncertain when faced with complex challenges, God is with us. We will receive the inspiration we need to forge ahead.

God is a God of salvation and new beginnings.

Whether we consider the daily unfolding of our earthly lives or our eternal ones to come, God never leaves us with dead ends. There is always hope, and there is always something new to come. As Julian of Norwich reminds us, "God made us, God loves us and God keeps us." This wisdom holds true whether life is stable and profitable or challenging and uncertain. If we remember this simple truth, we will be ready regardless of the day or the hour.
