



#### Advent—Your Last Advent on Earth

"Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. It is like a man travelling abroad. He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his work, and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch. Watch, therefore, you do not know when the lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to all: Watch!" - Mk. 13:33-37

Waiting is not always so easy. If you lack patience, like me, you probably want whatever is going to happen to just happen already.

So, to make the time pass more easily, and because it is prudent and wise, we make preparations. Then when the event finally happens our fate is unveiled, the preparation ends. Either you have prepared well for that moment, or you realize that your actions didn't prepare you at all.



Advent comes every year. So, unlike events in our lives that only happen once, we have been through Advent many times before. Even though this is the case, when Christmas arrives, many of us will think we missed it again and next year will be the year we really get into Advent. Of course, not to sound morbid, but there is no promise of next year. What if you knew this was your last Advent ever?

I read a book some years ago about how to live your life as if you only had one year to live. The author said that doing this provides incentive for a real commitment to living life to its fullest. You notice things for the first time. You make those plans that you always put off. You tell people what you always wanted to say.

I hope all who read this have many wonderful years ahead of them. However, let's approach this Advent like it is our last. I bet Christmas will seem that much sweeter. And who knows, we may find a new and improved way to live all year long.

**Idea:** Buy two advent wreathes. If you do not have one, place one on your table and use it. Give the second one away to a friend. If you already have one, give them both away.

**Take time to Reflect:** If I only had 1 year to live, what would be the top 3 changes in my life to make?

#### Catholic Q & A

#### The Choices We Make for Christ

In a 10am homily, Father Paul talked about The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, on this day commonly referred to as the Feast of Christ the King; or Christ the King Sunday. It is on this day that Christians are again encouraged to recognize and to invoke with renewed spiritual vigor, Jesus as Savior, choosing always to follow him.

**Q**: How does prayer, the mission of the Church, and the spiritual choices we make help to shape our journey of faith?

**A:** Father Paul's exhortation called on each of us to "cast our vote" for Jesus and to, with a full heart, choose to follow Christ's teachings as central to a Catholic life.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches:

"The invocation of the holy name of Jesus is the simplest way of praying always...this prayer holds fast to the word and brings forth fruit with patience...following the way of the cross...who by his holy Cross has redeemed the world."

Father reminded us that we will soon begin a new liturgical year. That may be a good time to rededicate ourselves to the Saint James Mission Statement. A mission statement is defined as a formal set of guidelines, a summary of the aims and values of an organization. Our particular, divinely -inspired organization, the Holy Catholic Church and St. James Parish has within its mission, (well-worth re-reading and implementing systemically across all Parish activity as a North Star of authentically consistent litmus-testing reference standards of faithful action,) these actionable, Christ the King level words:

" ...nourishing the faith and commitment of its active members..."

Once again as part of that Christ the King-centered choice, we are familiar with a traditional prayer of gratitude which touches on the choices that we make for Christ ,which Father Paul preached about:

"May my faithful stewardship bear witness to the love of Christ in my life...in Jesus' name."

Or as our Choir invokes the name of Jesus, through the music that helps to nourish the faith:

"I will choose Christ, I will choose love, I choose to serve. I give my heart, I give my life, I give my all to you. As a servant he calls to me...you must serve too..."

And so we once again renew this faith, these choices, this mission, by the grace of Christ the King.

#### **Gospel Meditation**

We can embrace and relish each moment of our lives as a sacred sacrament or nonchalantly and robotically attend to what life presents.

We have our feet in two worlds. One is holy and sacred, and the other is profane and secular.

Which one has the greater claim on us?


To what do we devote most of our energy?

We can easily be consumed with the particular demands and essentials of daily life: family, work, obligations, and the like, that we don't really notice anything more than what is right before us. We become masters at "doing" and neglect our need to "savor." Jesus reminds his friends that "as it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away."

While certain things require our daily attention, we cannot become so consumed with them that we fail to see the larger picture of what is coming. For the Christian, Advent is the time to pause, reflect, and savor. It is a time to see life as a sacrament of the moment and not just an investment in secular interests, pleasures, and personal obligations. It is easy to get distracted, lazy, preoccupied, and tired. Apathy can quickly wreak havoc on the most dedicated of souls. Whatever we can do this Advent season to be more attentive, focused, alert, and watchful will serve us well. It will make us eager and well-prepared to meet our Lord when he comes. It is for certain that he will come.

Who made me? What is my purpose? What will happen to me when I die?

These are pivotal questions that, in life's busyness, we hardly find time to ask and answer. They define who we are, and the answers we provide serve as guideposts and anchors in the seas of our lives. Advent is the perfect time to make friends with our souls. It is a time to perk ourselves up, open our eyes, ears, and hearts and seek God's presence in the simple moments of our lives. God is with us. Ask God to grant you a deeper appreciation for His presence and the gift of attentiveness.


