Fr. Paul Kuunuba arrived at St. James last August to begin a 6-month sabbatical after achieving his Licentiate (Masters) degree in Spiritual Theology in Rome. He is completing his time with us on Jan. 30th and will be returning to his diocese of Damongo, Ghana in West Africa.

He has been a wonderful addition to the rectory with Fr. Thaddeus and Jim and always ready to participate in any activity or work that needed to be done. He is so approachable with an easy smile that supports his strong faith and close relationship with the Lord. For those who have had an opportunity to talk to him or spend some time with him, he becomes like a long-time friend so quickly. I want to thank all those who reached out to him to take him to some of the sights and sounds of the South Bay and Los Angeles and who have welcomed him into your homes. It is you who have been his teachers and mentors during his sabbatical.

Without wheels of his own, a lot of his time has been here locally, but before he leaves I will be taking him on a little sight-seeing experience this week. We will be going to Zion National Park and Bryce Canyon in Utah and the Grand Canyon in Arizona and all there is to see on the way there and back—and hopefully not too much snow and here for next weekend.

Fr. Paul will be at the Masses on January 28<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup> and outside the church after all the Masses so that you might have an opportunity to greet him and wish him well as he returns to a new assignment in his diocese. In addition to being the Vocation Director for the diocese, he will be an Associate Pastor in a parish and tasked with developing a shrine area into a Prayer Center for the diocese.







### Virtue - Practice Makes Progress

In living what the Church believes, prays, and celebrates, a look at the grace and guidance of the Catholic Virtues offers insight into what The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls, "...a map for our spiritual journey toward transformation."

Q: How does the transformative spirituality of the Gospel, the Liturgy, the examples of the Saints, and the added components of truth and beauty found in the virtues lead us toward those holy moments and holy lives that author Matthew Kelly promotes as progressively finding us becoming the best version of ourselves?

A: We can read in the catechism about additional virtues within our Catholic "toolbox."

There are *The Cardinal Virtues* of prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance.

Then there are *The Theological Virtues* of Faith, Hope, and Charity, what the catechism calls,"...the foundation of Christian moral activity."

Also in virtuous glory, we have the seven Gifts of The Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

And don't forget The Fruits of The Holy Spirit which include: Charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity. Virtue. We find that the practice of virtue does indeed make for progress along our faith journey.

St. Augustine wrote about saintly virtue within real-world lives with applicability to us now as we strive to become the best version of ourselves:

> "This is the business of our life: by effort and by toil, by prayer and supplication, to advance in the grace of God. 'till we come to the height of perfection in which with clean hearts we may behold God."

Virtue. It's at the center of the clean heart of Christian moral activity, advancing in the grace of God.

Holy moments indeed.

#### **Gospel Meditation**

When I was a kid, I remember the priest at Mass announcing, "The Lamb of God!" Frankly, it struck me as nonsense. I thought: Why in the world does God have a lamb? And where is this lamb?

John the Baptist sees Jesus coming toward him and announces, "Behold the lamb of God." His Jewish listeners knew what he meant. God's lamb is the thing that is sacrificed at the Jewish Passover and consumed by the participants. For almost a thousand years, lambs were ritually slaughtered and eaten in Jerusalem at Passover. The lamb meant sacrifice, freedom from sin, and communion with God. The Baptist is saving in effect, "This man will be ritually sacrificed and consumed so that God's people may be free from sin and united to God."

It's crucial to relate to Jesus as a friend, brother, teacher, and Lord of our lives. But we should also learn to interact with Him as our lamb of God. That means we intentionally place on him our sins, sadnesses, and hopes, and offer him to God. Then we consume him to make us free. This is what we do at every Mass.

That's why he is the Lamb of God. — Father John Muir


