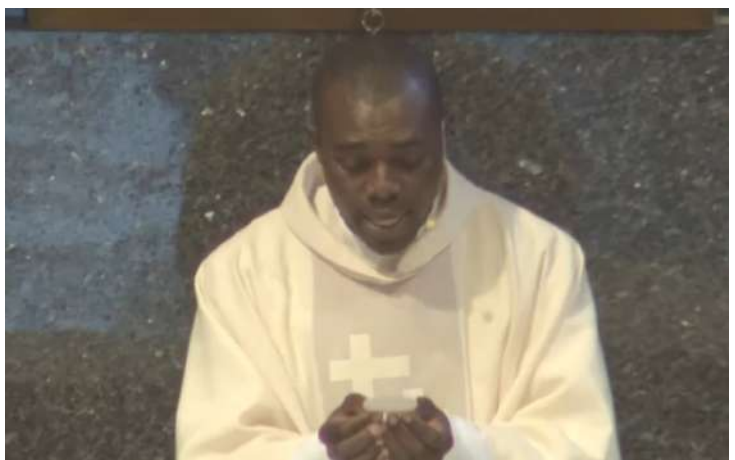

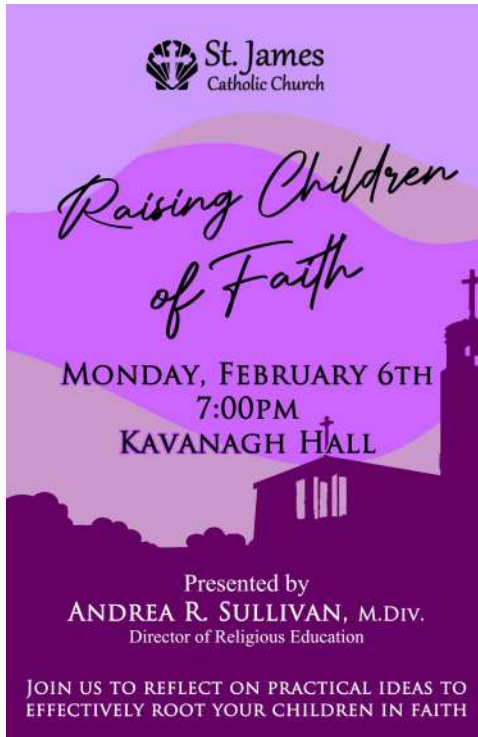

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Leaving the confessional, the penitent stepped out of the Church and into a mid-January light rain.

Q: What feelings were present amid the spiritual graces just experienced?

A: It rang true that the sacramental exercise of confession and contrition culminating in absolution is truly efficacious, as it states in the *Catechism*. There was also a certain lightness of spirit and an awareness of a sort of corrective course-correction of life. He thought briefly about the Holy Rosary and the Fourth Luminous Mystery; the Transfiguration.

The Saint James Choir sings about a related piece of music that describes wondrous change:

*"Transfigure us, O Lord, transfigure us, O Lord,
Break the chains that bind us,
speak your healing word..."*

Pope Francis writes extensively and cogently about the Sacrament of Reconciliation:

"The confessor's final absolution is a very powerful medicine for the soul and also for everyone's psyche. Everyone needs forgiveness, that is, to feel that they are loved as children by God the Father."

Matthew Kelly in his book, *Holy Moments*, writes in Part Two, in essence, about sacramental grace and transformative forgiveness:

"So, don't let your past rob you of your future. You are more than the worst thing you have ever done. God is never more than one choice away. It only takes one Holy Moment, (as in the confessional), to shift the momentum of your life in the right direction. The choice is yours."

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* gives us, among the teachings about the Sacraments, entry #1116:

"Sacraments are powers that come forth from the Body of Christ, which is ever-living and life-giving. They are actions of the Holy Spirit at work in his body, the Church. They are 'the masterworks of God' in the new and everlasting covenant."

The Sacrament of Reconciliation. Confession. God's healing word...

**No sin is new to him.
No wrongdoing too great.
Come to Confession and
experience mercy and joy.
Confession is available Saturday
from 4-5 pm in Church or by calling
the office for an appointment.**

In my parents' bedroom there were on the wall two photos of my mom and dad from their early adulthoods. The photo of my mother entranced me when I was a boy. I loved looking at it, even though I saw her in daily life. Something about that picture captured her perfectly. It was an image of the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength that enveloped me from the start of my life. It was an icon of the woman who fed, taught, and encouraged me. I felt a deep pride that I came from such beauty.

The beatitudes of Jesus are a kind of self-portrait. But it is a strange picture. At first, the blessings of being poor, mourning, and hungering and thirsting for righteousness may seem bizarre or, worse, a religious delusion. Who wants to look like that? But if we look again, we begin to see the characteristics of Jesus' form. He becomes poor and fills it with his riches for us, he weeps and mourns for us, and fills it with his joy, he hungers and thirsts for us to be righteous, and so satisfies us. And so on. It's the way he appears on the cross.

Perhaps we should put on our bedroom room walls the words of the beatitudes next to a crucifix of the Lord Jesus. Then we can do what the beatitudes are designed for, to gaze at the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength of the one who is our origin, and who is with us every day. And little by little, we'll start to look like him.

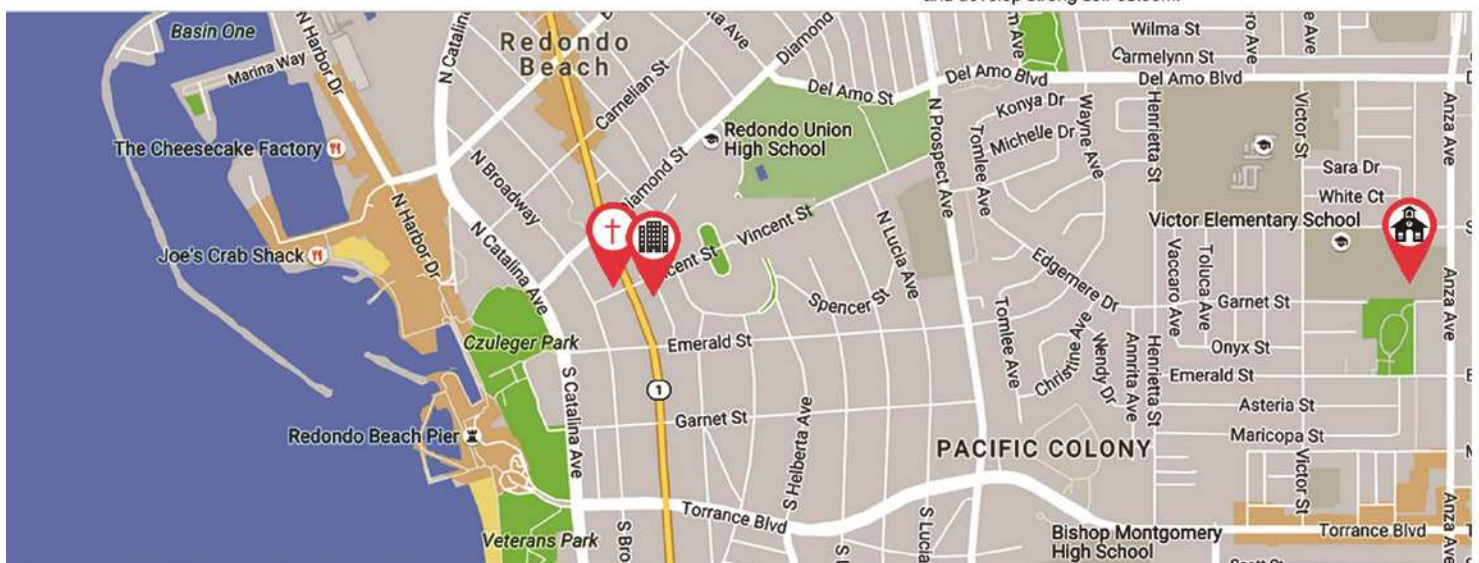
