Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

Together in Mission

In the next several weekends we will be talking a bit about the Archdiocesan Together in Mission Campaign to provide for the basic needs of our poorest 60 parishes and 70 schools in the Archdiocese. Many of these are in the 'inner city' where life is complicated by so many other issues such as gangs, drugs, inadequate public schools and poverty.

During COVID, these parishes have been hit particularly hard and their need is greater than ever. Each parish is asked to give according to their own level of income.

For St. James, our goal for the 2023 Campaign is \$111,637. Each parish's goal is big, but the need to make sure the gospel is preached in the poorest and most oppressed areas of the archdiocese is big. If you have supported Together In Mission in the past, you received a donor letter in the mail a couple weeks ago. If you have not supported it in the past, there will be donor envelopes in the pews for you to use. Your gift does not have to be large and it can be paid in installments throughout the year. If we all work together we can achieve our goal.

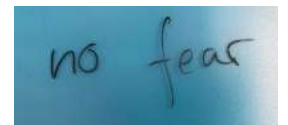
Mary, friend and mother to all, through your Son, God has found a way to unite himself to every human being, called to be one people, sisters and brothers to each other.

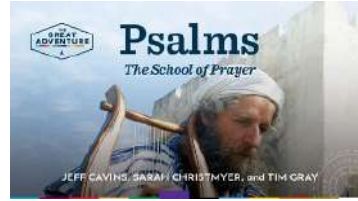

This week's topic: Sacramental Grace

In the late winter of 2009, a Saint James parishioner experienced sacramental grace first hand in the Cardiac Intensive Care Unit at Little Company of Mary Hospital.

Father Joe and Father Jim attended this open-heart surgery patient in administering the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Matthew 10 talks about the mission of the twelve with their charge to "Heal the sick." And we also read at Mass this week, in the Book of Acts, that we should, (along with the Apostle Paul), "know his will."

Q: What is God's will and Church teaching on the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick?

A: *The Catechism* #1511 says:

"The Church believes and confesses that among the seven sacraments there is one especially intended to strengthen those who are being tried by illness, the Anointing of the Sick."

The Church also talks about the entirety of these particular sacramental "last rites" including extreme unction, and confession at this tenuous time, as well as the taking of communion, or Viaticum.

According to the Second Vatican Council, the Sacraments...

"give worship to God...they not only presuppose faith, but by words and objects they also nourish, strengthen, and express it...they are called sacraments of faith..."

The parishioner thought about another object of faith in a time of challenge, namely, **music**. For example:

A song of petition and prayer- *"Make me to know your ways, O God, To you I lift up my soul..."*

Another song of petition and prayer: *"There is a longing in our hearts, O God, for you to reveal yourself to us; For healing, for wholeness, for new life, hear our prayer..."*

Another song of petition/prayer: *"Be thou my vision, O Lord of my heart; Waking or sleeping thy presence my light..."*

A song of Trust: *"O God, you search me and you know me; when I walk or lie down you are before me...ever the maker and keeper of my days..."*

A song of providence: *"I have loved you with an everlasting love...Seek the face of the Lord and long for him; he will bring you his joy and his hope..."*

And one more hymn of trust, most appropriate to a setting of anointing in a hospital bed:

"Be not afraid, I go before you always, come follow me, and I will give you rest..."

Strength for those being tried by illness and uncertainty; such are the sacraments of faith.

I recently decided to learn to cook.

As I sit at the feet of various YouTube cooking masters, I notice how much of cooking is adding ingredients that don't provide any more nourishment, like herbs and other seasonings. But man! They make all the difference because they make the meal delightful to eat and share.

Jesus calls his disciples "salt of the world." No one eats just salt. So, Christians are not meant to replace or do away with the world. They are meant to be agents of preservation and glorification.

Notice how often these days the Church seeks to preserve what is threatened: the goodness of marital and family love, the desires of young people for greatness, the value of honest work, healthy economics, and altruistic political engagement, the dignity of the poor and vulnerable.

Over and over, we say to a world who wants to throw things out, "It's worth saving! We'll preserve it! We'll show you it's wonderful."

If we can't engage the world like that, Jesus says we are the ones who get thrown out, because salt alone is worthless.

Jesus only asks us to do for others what he does for us. He is the "salt" of everything in our lives.

Is there something in your life starting to rot a bit?

Something tasting bland and boring?

Let Jesus salt it and see if you like it better.

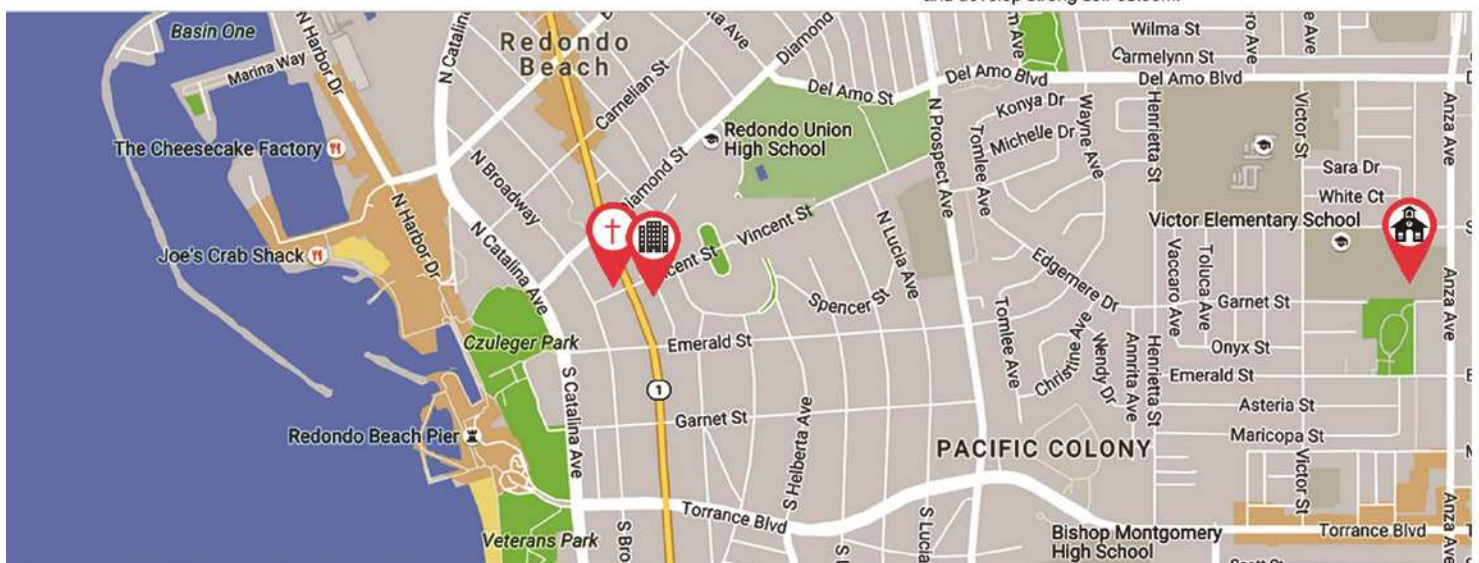
