Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James

Together In Mission Pledges Next Weekend

Together in Mission is the annual opportunity for every parish in the Archdiocese through thousands of Catholics like you to recommit to building God's kingdom and investing in our local community. About 60 of our parishes and 70 of our schools struggle to minister to their communities and others worry they may have to close their doors – doing so would affect thousands, where the need is greatest. Your gift will sustain and equip these centers of the community to stay alive today and for generations to come. Next weekend will be our Commitment Sunday for Together in Mission to move toward our commitment goal of \$112,000.

Envelopes are in the pews for your commitment and parishioners who have contributed in previous years have received letters at home. If we all work together with generous hearts we can continue to make sure the gospel is proclaimed and lived in every parish of the Archdiocese. Your generosity to this special appeal makes a huge difference for us all.

Update on Sale of Parish Center Property

After negotiating with a number of potential buyers for our property on the east side of Pacific Coast Highway (our Parish Office, Preschool and Parish Center facilities) since last summer, we finally worked out all the details and we entered into a twenty-four month Escrow on January 23rd, 2023.

At this time we have just received the recommendation of the Archdiocesan Finance Council to the Archbishop for the sale of the property and the Archbishop will be sending our request for the sale to the Vatican for approval. Our buyers have also begun a ninety day 'Due Diligence' period for their inspection and research of the property for its development. We continue to pray that all goes well on both sides and that upon the completion of this ninety day period we can begin to put into motion our own plans to prepare for the development of our new Community Campus property across the street.

We often overlook the source of these blessings and gifts from our creator. Adding a cross to our children’s and Master bedrooms can serve as a reminder of His love and mercy. It

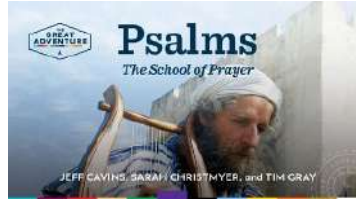

This week's topic: And the Word Was God

In a letter to Timothy, St. Paul enjoined his fellow servant in Christ to: *"Attende lectioni!"*
 Latin for "Apply thyself to reading!"

Q: What readings are we applying ourselves to at Mass in the Liturgy of the Word these days?

A: We read and considered with Father Paul, the inspirational and aspirational lessons of the Beatitudes. At an 8am Mass this week, Monsignor Mike reviewed the parable of the calming of the storm by Jesus, and previewed the raising of Jairus' daughter and the healing of the afflicted woman in the crowd who touched the cloak of Jesus.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church in #128 summarizes sacred scripture:

"There is no doctrine which could be better, more precious and more splendid than the text of the Gospel. Behold and retain what our Lord and Master, Christ has taught by his words and accomplished by his deeds."

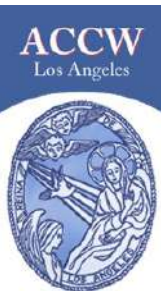
The sweetly poetic St. Therese of Lisieux who always applied herself to her readings wrote:

"But above all it's the Gospels that occupy my mind ...my poor soul has so many needs. I'm always finding fresh lights there, hidden and enthralling meanings."

It's often said that the Catholic Church lays heavy rules on her members, rules that can almost seem impossible. Mass every Sunday? No lying ever? Sexual purity *all the time*? I recently said to some non-Catholic friends that more than fifty adults were baptized at my parish at the Easter Vigil. One responded spontaneously with shock, "Why would anyone do *that*?" In other words, why would someone willingly place themselves in a system with such demanding and rigorous rules?

Of course, no one in the history of religions is more demanding and rigorous than Jesus himself. In the Sermon on the Mount, he says you have to be holier than pharisees or you're out. He says if you call someone a fool, you go to fiery Gehenna. He says you can't even look at a woman with lust or you're guilty of adultery (which was punishable by death). To top it all off, he says you can't even get divorced and re-married. Doesn't he know these are basically impossible demands? What world is he living in?

The new one, actually. He is the new world. Jesus' words aren't meant to condemn. They are meant to signal something new, a restored humanity. Jesus doesn't just give external laws; he gives us his Holy Spirit to internalize the law through love. He wants to fill us with his love. That's what the Church exists to do. Love demands extraordinary things. The "demands" of the Church only make sense because she is filled with Jesus' love. That wildly demanding love is why we are Catholic.

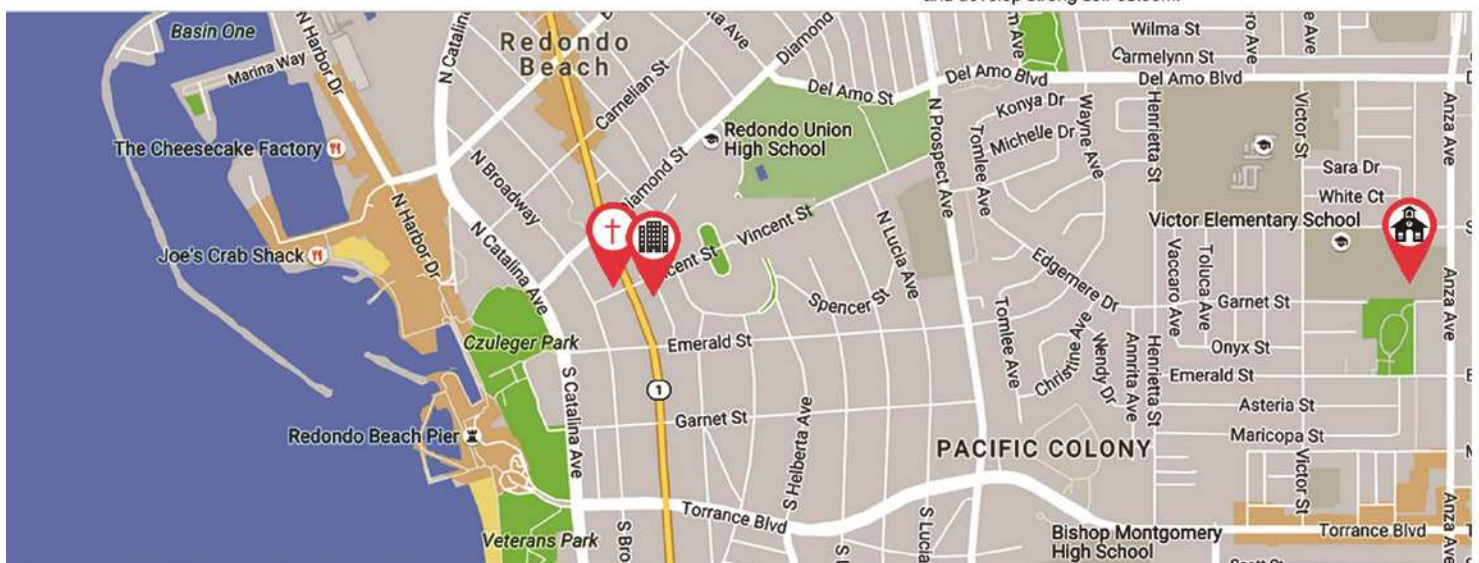
