Pastor's Letter

Thriving in the Lenten Season

This past week we began our 40 day Lenten Journey on **Ash Wednesday**. Lent reminds us that we are called to focus on our spiritual self.

Guidelines for Lent: Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast AND Abstinence. Catholics are called to abstain from eating meat every Friday during Lent. The obligation of **abstinence** (refraining from meat) begins at the age of 14. The rule of **fasting** (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18 and 59. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.

Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:30pm

Every Friday during Lent we will gather in the Church to journey with Christ in the Way of the Cross.

Reconciliation (Confession)

Whether you have been away for a long time or obtain these graces regularly, this will be one of the greatest blessings you'll receive while still on this earth. We'll be offering opportunities for Reconciliation every Saturday at 4 pm and special Reconciliation Services the week of March 27th.

Give it up for Lent

Giving up something we like during Lent can be a reminder of the importance of sacrifice in our lives. Every time we refrain from eating candy, going shopping, watching television, drinking alcohol, or doing something else we enjoy, we have an opportunity to express our desire to love and draw near to God.

Do something positive

Lenten penance need not be only a question of abstaining from food or drink. Now is the time to begin or reinforce something positive in your life, like regular prayer or study and prayer with Scripture. Read Matthew Kelly's book "Holy Moments". Whenever our actions are intended to fulfill the Great Commandment of loving God and neighbor, they help us live as Christians and fulfill our baptismal call. Create time and space in your routine to draw closer to God.

Lent is all about preparation: prayer, fasting, good works.



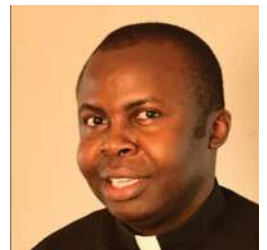

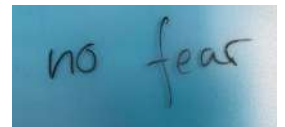

Catholic Q&A Topic: See Good News

In the classic American novel, *Tom Sawyer*, we find the young protagonist in a school competition that awards a special commemorative Bible to the student who memorizes the most Bible verses. As part of a comically insincere effort to game the competition, and with no interest at all in the teachings of the Bible, the youngster engages in some shady horse trading to acquire tickets issued for verses which have actually been memorized - but not by Tom.

The apparent winner of the competition, is asked by Judge Thatcher to name the first two apostles, whereupon Tom blurts out, "David and Goliath!"

Q: Now what does the Church teach about the authentic essence and spirit of holy scripture found within the verses of the Bible, and about our sincere study and internalization of the word of God?

A: *The Catechism Of The Catholic Church* in entry #2 teaches:

"So that this call should resound throughout the world, Christ sent forth the apostles he had chosen, commissioning them to proclaim the gospel, *teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you...*"

Catechism #1846 underscores the enduring immediacy and value of The Word:

"The Gospel is the revelation in Jesus Christ of God's mercy to sinners."

Pope Francis preached in a homily:

"Let us make room in our lives for the word of God. Each day let us read a verse or two of the Bible. Let us begin with the Gospel, let us keep it open on our table, carry it in our pocket, read it on our cell phones, and allow it to inspire us daily."

One favorite verse from this week's readings in Ephesians 1 has always produced the inspiration that the Holy Father mentioned:

"May the father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our hearts, that we may know what is the hope that belongs to his call."

The enlightenment, hope and inspiration of scripture is present and waiting to be discovered and rediscovered.

For those who feel they don't have the time or inclination to expend such effort, the Bible reminds us in Matthew 19:

"With God all things are possible."

The Bible truly enlightens the eyes of our hearts to better appreciate the hope that belongs to His call.

The Spirit leads Jesus into the desert to be tempted by the devil, and we hear this: **"He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry."**

Seems like a questionable battle preparation plan. When I fast, I usually feel grouchy at best, and at worst, like I might pass out from longing for a hamburger. Isn't it better to be well-fed and fully hydrated, especially to face spiritual struggles? Why fast?

This might help. The origin of the word "fast" means to "hold firmly." We still use it that way when we say, "I held *fast* to my original decision." We human beings are a bundle of desires which vie for our attention: food, drink, comfort, safety, sex, laughter, beauty, and so on. If we can't manage to have firm grip on them, in short order they'll have a firm grip on us. By fasting from our lower desires, we learn to firmly grip on to what is greater. Fasting leads to us to a firmer hold on our body and mind.

Jesus fasts for us. He's showing us that his grace can help us regain this firm hold of our lives, which makes it more difficult for the devil to tempt us. But take it one more step. Fasting also teaches us to finally hold fast to Jesus, the Word of God in flesh. **"Man does not live by bread alone,"** he says, **"But by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God."**

Jesus' fasting reveals his fast hold to the Father in everything. May our fasting help us to grasp ourselves more firmly, and then to hold fast to Jesus alone.

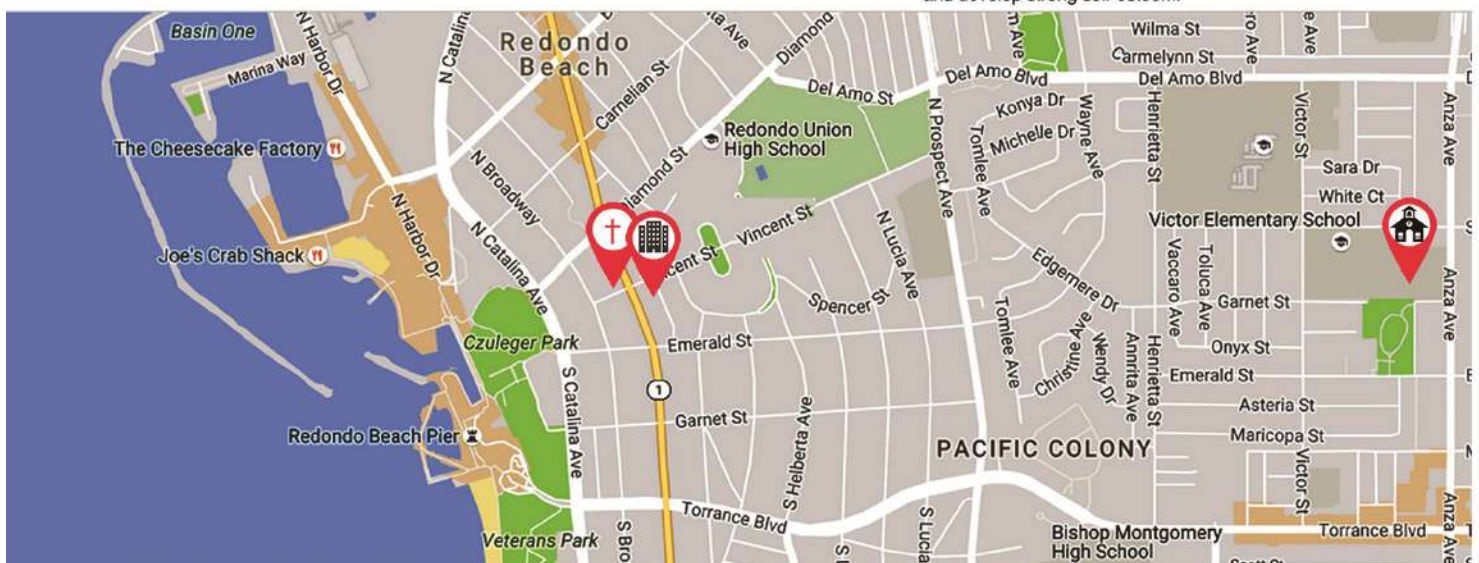
