

# Brief Examination of Conscience Based on the 10 Commandments

## 2<sup>nd</sup> - You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> - Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.

Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation (Jan. 1; the Ascension; Aug. 15; Nov. 1; Dec. 8; Dec. 25)?

Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body?

Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

#### 4<sup>th</sup> - Honor your father and your mother.

Do I show my parents due respect?

Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible?

Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

#### 5th - You shall not kill.

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?

#### 6<sup>th</sup> - You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

#### 7<sup>th</sup> - You shall not steal.

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

## 8<sup>th</sup> - You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

#### 9<sup>th</sup> - You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

#### 10th - You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

## **Extraordinary Ministers Wanted**



Detective Harris, a 35-year veteran, is currently an Officer in Charge at LAPD's Gang & Narcotics Division, specializing in the investigation of vice related crimes, including human trafficking. He has been commended for his Human Trafficking investigations which have resulted in numerous convictions in both Superior & Federal court and has been involved in the rescue of countless young women and men from a life of exploitation and human trafficking.

Erin Wilson, Journey Out – Program & Outreach Coordinator, South LAMs. Wilson has nearly a decade in anti-trafficking, working with human trafficking victims of domestic and international origins and working closely with local and federal law enforcement. Ms. Wilson provides a unique perspective in that she has seen trafficking cases from the inception of operations through the prosecution and conviction of traffickers. According to the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) The average age a child gets a phone is now 10 years; 20 to 30% of kids report being cyberbullied. NCMEC has received reports of online enticement of children on almost every digital platform.



## Catholic Q&A Topic: Forgiveness

Among the more than 10,000 Saints celebrated by the Church, two notable exemplars of lives imbued with abiding, all-encompassing *prayer* have their Feast Day this week. These two lived in the second century in the city of Edessa in what was then Mesopotamia, but there was no spiritual middle ground with these two.

St. Abraham, a wealthy nobleman who became Bishop of Edessa, and his niece, St. Mary are examples of lives marked by humility, service, charity, spirituality, a brief fall from grace, redemptive conversion, and above all, the overarching power of prayer. Their specific story is worth reading.

In reflecting upon these saints, author Rev. Alban Butler wrote:

"Oh, that we realized the omnipotence of prayer!"

**Q:** What does *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* say about prayer and its omnipotent nature?

**A:** In the instructive and spiritual realm of over 225 index entries about prayer, (some of them poetically soaring), *Catechism* #2098 summarizes prayer as part of a life in Christ:

"The acts of faith, hope, and charity, enjoined by the first commandment are accomplished by prayer. Lifting up the mind toward God is an expression of our adoration of God. We ought always to pray and not lose heart."

In this prayerful season of Christ's Passion, our Choir, in a Taizé community chant format continues to sing:

"Stay with me, remain here with me... Watch, and pray...Watch and pray..."

Pope Francis on prayer:

"When we pray, we pray to the same Father...when we pray we join the whole of the Church. Prayer makes us brothers and sisters."

Oh that we realized the omnipotence of prayer...

#### **Gospel Meditation**

Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be when he made a dead person alive. We know of three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us, spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us.

The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed and, once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others.

What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive.

Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be when he made a dead person alive. We know of three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us, spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us.

The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed and, once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others.

What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive.
