Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

Easter Brings God's Healing Love

On this Palm Sunday we join with the crowd celebrating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. "Hosanna to the Son of David" they and we shout! In the gospel we will share the way to Calvary, but we also know the end of the story is Resurrection and our salvation.

God's love, compassion and mercy for us is made real and moves our heart to celebrate a reality that the world cannot give us. This most holy week of the Church refocuses everything for us. This will be our first Sunday Mass in the Chapel, which seats 200, since we acquired the property in 2019. May our celebration of the risen Christ make us whole in mind, body and spirit. Gathered together we will celebrate the real Good News of our lives.

Remember that our 'Community Campus' parking lot is open for parking for Church every Sunday. The entrance to the lot is on Broadway, just south of Vincent Street and will be especially helpful for parking on Easter.



Even in the holy place where the See of Blessed Peter and the chair of truth was set up to enlighten the world, they have raised the abominable throne of their impiety with the iniquitous hope that the Shepherd may be stricken and the flock scattered abroad. Arise, then, unconquerable Prince, defend the people of God against the assaults of the reprobate spirits, and give them the victory. Holy Church reveres thee as its guardian and patron; it glories in thee as its defender against the malignant powers of hell; to thee God has committed the souls that are to be conveyed to the seats of the Blessed in eternal happiness. Pray, then, to the God of peace, that He may put Satan under our feet, so completely vanguished that he may no longer be able to hold men in bondage and work harm to the Church. Offer up our prayers before the Most High, so that the mercies of the Lord may prevent us, and lay hold of the dragon, the old serpent, who is the devil and Satan, and hurl him bound in chains into the abyss where he may no longer seduce the souls of men. The Easter Homily of St. John Chrysostom

If any man be devout and loveth God,

Let him enjoy this fair and radiant triumphal feast! If any man be a wise servant,

Let him rejoicing enter into the joy of his Lord. If any have laboured long in fasting,

- Let him how receive his recompense.
- If any have wrought from the first hour,
 - Let him today receive his just reward.
- If any have come at the third hour, Let him with thankfulness keep the feast.
- If any have arrived at the sixth hour,
 - Let him have no misgivings;
- Because he shall in nowise be deprived therefore.
- If any have delayed until the ninth hour,

Let him draw near, fearing nothing.

- And if any have tarried even until the eleventh hour, Let him, also, be not alarmed at his tardiness.
- For the Lord, who is jealous of his honour,

Will accept the last even as the first.

He giveth rest unto him who cometh at the eleventh hour, Even as unto him who hath wrought from the first hour.

And He showeth mercy upon the last,

And careth for the first;

And to the one He giveth,

And upon the other He bestoweth gifts.

And He both accepteth the deeds,

And welcometh the intention,

And honoureth the acts and praises the offering.

Wherefore, enter ye all into the joy of your Lord; Receive your reward,

Both the first, and likewise the second. You rich and poor together, hold high festival!

You sober and you heedless, honour the day! Rejoice today, both you who have fasted

And you who have disregarded the fast. The table is full-laden; feast ye all sumptuously.

The calf is fatted; let no one go hungry away. Enjoy ye all the feast of faith:

Receive ye all the riches of loving-kindness. Let no one bewail his poverty,

For the universal Kingdom has been revealed. Let no one weep for his iniquities,

For pardon has shown forth from the grave. Let no one fear death,

For the Saviour's death has set us free. He that was held prisoner of it has annihilated it.

By descending into Hell, He made Hell captive. He embittered it when it tasted of His flesh.

And Isaiah, foretelling this, did cry:

Hell, said he, was embittered

When it encountered Thee in the lower regions. It was embittered, for it was abolished.

It was embittered, for it was mocked.

It was embittered, for it was slain.

It was embittered, for it was overthrown. It was embittered, for it was fettered in chains.

It took a body, and met God face to face. It took earth, and encountered Heaven. It took that which was seen, and fell upon the unseen.

- O Death, where is thy sting?
- O Hell, where is thy victory?
- Christ is risen, and thou art overthrown!
- Christ is risen, and the demons are fallen! Christ is risen, and the angels rejoice!
- Christ is risen, and life reigns!

Christ is risen, and not one dead remains in the grave. For Christ, being risen from the dead,

Is become the first-fruits of those who have fallen asleep. To Him be glory and dominion

Unto ages of ages. Amen.







Catholic Q & A

Gospel Meditation

Catholic Q&A Topic: A Call to Witness

At a 10 am Mass on a gloomy, rainy Sunday, Monsignor Mike's illuminatingly insightful homily drew upon scripture readings to speak about a continuing call to witness. Pastor Mike spoke about the Lord's presence, and some of the key abiding examples of the application of the virtue of trust:

In the readings of that Sunday: Abram "went as the Lord directed him." Psalm 33 featured another call,

"Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you." In the Gospel reading, Matthew's account of the Transfiguration has the disciples trusting in Jesus as he tells them,"Do not tell the vision to anyone."

Q: What does *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* and additional scripture confirm about a call to witness, trust, and the presence of the Lord?

A: The Liturgy of the Word and that homily on that second Sunday of Lent prompts us to think about more examples of answering the call and the spirituality of trust:

The Annunciation, one of the timeless settings of answering the call and virtuous truth. Luke Chapter 7 has the trust narrative of the healing of a centurion's slave. Jesus voices amazement at such a level of faith. Finally, the Lord's angel stayed the hand of Abraham in Genesis 22, another example of the call, trust, and the presence of God.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in the section called "Life In Christ" touches on the presence:

"What faith confesses, the sacraments communicate...Christians are called to lead a life worthy of the gospel of Christ...they are made capable of doing so by the grace of Christ and the gifts of his Spirit, which they receive through the sacraments and through prayer."

We trust, and pray a prayer of thanks for our faith, the Mass, our Clergy, and the saving power of God.

No sin is new to him. No wrongdoing too great. Come to Confession and experience mercy and joy. Confession is available Saturday from 4-5 pm in Church or by calling the office for an appointment.

ABORTION

E lt's normal to grieve a pregnancy loss, including the loss of a child by abortion.

It can form a hole in one's heart, a hole so deep that sometimes it seems nothing can fill the emptiness. You are not alone... **hopeafterabortion.com**/ What's your car? Let's say it's a fancy silver Toyota. Now imagine you're having lunch in a restaurant and suddenly see two men outside attempting to steal it. You run outside and confront them. They respond, "The master has need of it." How do you respond? Would you just let them take it, and leave you without a car? I don't think I would.

Yet that is precisely what the owners of the colt on Palm Sunday do. Stunningly, and perhaps a little comically, Jesus instructs two of his disciples to commandeer a colt for him to ride. And when they hear the disciples say, **"The master has need of it**," they let them take it. Of course, Jesus *knew* they'd let it go. He gave them the grace to let go of what is rightfully theirs. The result? That colt became perhaps the most famous and important animal ever. The beast plays a role in the redemption of the world.

As Holy Week begins, Jesus perhaps will send people to you to ask for something valuable to you. Perhaps it's your car. More likely it's something like your attention, time, or energy. It's natural to resist at first. We've got things to do, after all. But if the interruption is from Jesus himself, listen to that voice which calmly says,

"The master has need of it." And simply let it go. You'll be amazed what the master will do with it. — Father John Muir


