Only Jesus can be our center.





The Easter Homily of St. John Chrysostom

If any man be devout and loveth God,

Let him enjoy this fair and radiant triumphal feast! If any man be a wise servant,

Let him rejoicing enter into the joy of his Lord.

If any have laboured long in fasting,

Let him how receive his recompense.

If any have wrought from the first hour,

Let him today receive his just reward.

If any have come at the third hour,

Let him with thankfulness keep the feast.

If any have arrived at the sixth hour,

Let him have no misgivings;

Because he shall in nowise be deprived therefore.

If any have delayed until the ninth hour,

Let him draw near, fearing nothing.

And if any have tarried even until the eleventh hour,

Let him, also, be not alarmed at his tardiness.

For the Lord, who is jealous of his honour,

Will accept the last even as the first.

He giveth rest unto him who cometh at the eleventh hour, Even as unto him who hath wrought from the first hour.

And He showeth mercy upon the last,

And careth for the first;

And to the one He giveth,

And upon the other He bestoweth gifts.

And He both accepteth the deeds,

And welcometh the intention,

And honoureth the acts and praises the offering.

Wherefore, enter ye all into the joy of your Lord; Receive your reward,

You sober and you heedless, honour the day!

Rejoice today, both you who have fasted

And you who have disregarded the fast.

The table is full-laden; feast ye all sumptuously.

For the universal Kingdom has been revealed.

By descending into Hell, He made Hell captive.

Detective Dana Harris, Los Angeles Police Dpt. Detective Harris, a 35-year veteran, is currently an Officer in Charge at LAPD's Gang & Narcotics Division, specializing in the investigation of vice related crimes, including human trafficking. He has been commended for his Human Trafficking investigations which have resulted in numerous convictions in both Superior & Federal court and has been involved in the rescue of countless young women and men from a life of exploitation and human trafficking.

Erin Wilson, Journey Out – Program & Outreach Coordinator, South LAMs. Wilson has nearly a decade in anti-trafficking, working with human trafficking victims of domestic and international origins and working closely with local and federal law enforcement. Ms. Wilson provides a unique perspective in that she has seen trafficking cases from the inception of operations through the prosecution and conviction of traffickers. According to the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) The average age a child gets a phone is now 10 years: 20 to 30% of kids report being cyberbullied. NCMEC has received reports of online enticement of children on almost every digital platform.

Catholic Q&A Topic: Keeping The Covenant

At a local resort, a man found a lost wallet which contained cash, credit cards, and a hotel room key. This real-world scenario prompts object lessons about the actionable presence of our faith.

Now we're in a week where scripture readings include Deuteronomy 13 with the words:

"The Lord your God is testing you...his commandments you shall keep..."

And Genesis 17 ,"...keep my covenant to the thousandth generation..."

Q: In light of those scripture readings, and in facing the realities of daily life, what does the Catechism reflect in matters of doing what is right, not just with a found wallet, but across a life of faith?

A: The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in Paragraph #2510, with beautifully essential terminology: "The golden rule helps one discern, in concrete situations, whether or not it would be appropriate to reveal the truth to someone who asks for it."

Catechism #1785: "In the formation of conscience, the Word of God is the light for our path, we must assimilate it in faith and prayer and put it into practice...guided by the authoritative teaching of the Church."

The Catechism, #1966, talks about the Beatitudes as the New Law which we read about in Matthew's Gospel. The Catechism says about the Sermon on the Mount: "This sermon contains all the precepts

needed to shape one's life... the perfect way of the Christian life."

Pope Francis said in 2015:

"Let us remember the Golden Rule, do unto others as you would have them do unto you. This rule points us in a clear direction. The yardstick we use for others will be the yardstick which time will use for us."

Now as to our man with the wallet, putting his Catholic faith into practice he saw that clear direction that the Holy Father spoke about. Honoring that holy covenant, and in the spirit of the golden rule, the man turned in the wallet to the hotel, and continued his life, pointed in the right direction, ready to face more concrete situations, confidently honoring the beatitudes of a faith that serves to light the path.

Gospel Meditation

"When Jesus had risen, early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons." (Mark 16:9)

Popular Catholic piety sometimes posits that the newly risen Jesus appears first to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a happy thought, but it's simply not what the scriptures report. We are told quite directly that he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, "out of whom he had driven seven demons."

Why would the gospel writer remind us of this unsavory detail of Mary's past? Historians tell us women were not qualified to give legal testimony. On top of that, to be possessed by not just one, but seven demons, is unsavory and terrifying. What damage had they done to her? What did she do to allow herself to be home to such evil? It doesn't seem to matter. Jesus chose Mary Magdalene to be the first one who saw him risen from the dead. He decided she was qualified.

Do you think that you are disqualified from seeing and announcing the risen Jesus because of your past demons?

Maybe they are the demons of despair, confusion, self-hatred, pride, addiction, failure, boredom, laziness, or other sins. Well, don't. In the light of the Risen Jesus, all these past demons make our witness that much more believable — only if we allow ourselves to be touched by the liberating hand of Christ, just as Mary Magdalene did. — Father John Muir
