Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

What a glorious celebration of our risen savior here at St. James!

Easter Masses were held at our school, our Church and the Community Campus Chapel and ensured that our entire community and visitors were able to attend an intimate encounter with our Lord. This would not have been possible without the generous outpouring of time and talent of so many of our volunteers in ministry who worked tirelessly to make this possible. We are humbled by this. There are so many of you that have helped to create and recreate this environment, liturgy and music that naming all would be impossible. So, for those that are omitted from this list, my sincere apologies and no slight is intended.

Our Liturgical ministries have helped us so much to regain our sense of unity as a faith community and especially so through Lent and Holy Week. Our Music ministry under Kevin Babuder with our choirs, cantors and musicians created a bit of heaven for us. Paula Bourke and the Environment ministry have led us through these last few weeks preparing three worship spaces to each of the liturgies. 



Detective Dana Harris, Los Angeles Police Dpt.

Detective Harris, a 35-year veteran, is currently an Officer in Charge at LAPD's Gang & Narcotics Division, specializing in the investigation of vice related crimes, including human trafficking. He has been commended for his Human Trafficking investigations which have resulted in numerous convictions in both Superior & Federal court and has been involved in the rescue of countless young women and men from a life of exploitation and human trafficking.

Erin Wilson, Journey Out – Program & Outreach Coordinator, South LAMs. Wilson has nearly a decade in anti-trafficking, working with human trafficking victims of domestic and international origins and working closely with local and federal law enforcement. Ms. Wilson provides a unique perspective in that she has seen trafficking cases from the inception of operations through the prosecution and conviction of traffickers. According to the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) The average age a child gets a phone is now 10 years; 20 to 30% of kids report being cyberbullied. NCMEC has received reports of online enticement of children on almost every digital platform.



Catholic Q&A Topic: The Empty Tomb

The Catechism calls Easter the "feast of feasts."

Related to the feast are Holy Week scripture readings from Maundy Thursday, (the word Maundy from the Latin, "mandatum," which means to give a commandment, as Jesus gave his disciples, "Love one another...")

In those readings from John 13, readings that can help to center our thoughts at the wonder of Easter, Jesus asks, after the washing of the feet:

"Do you realize what I have done for you? I have given you a model to follow."

We marvel at that model of love and service and the light of Easter, from the end of the Lenten Season, to the divinity of the Paschal Triduum, along the Octave of Easter including Divine Mercy Sunday, and throughout fifty days to Pentecost.

The Angelus magazine writes about the mercy and forgiveness of Easter. Monsignor Mike points out the humility, forgiveness and the love that God has for us as we live out the great adventure that is Easter.

Pope Benedict XVI describes Easter with words like justice, love, and truth;

> "... a breakthrough that has determined the meaning of all history."

The ethos of Easter is evident as the Church describes a criminal hanging beside Jesus,

"...who was able to see the dawn of Easter amid the clouds of Good Friday. With the little strength remaining in his own weakened body, he turned and said: 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom'. One could say a repentant sinner was the first to announce the glorious Resurrection."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church has many beautiful and insightful entries about the spiritual journey and meaning of Easter. Paragraph 658:

"Christ, the first-born from the dead is the principle of our own resurrection even now by the justification of our souls and one day by the new life he will impart to our bodies."

That particular catechism entry adds another term to the lexicon of Easter: Hope.

Gospel Meditation

A young, engaged couple sat on the couch in front of me as we chatted about their upcoming marriage.

The young lady was struggling to trust her future husband. She told me her father had been unfaithful to her mother. She said of her fiancé, "I want him to prove to me that he won't cheat on me." The young man looked at me helplessly, raised his eyebrows and shrugged his shoulders. What evidence could he possibly give to validate such a proof? Nothing. All he could do was invite her to trust him.

We all are wounded by experiences of imperfect love. We also are tempted to demand from God proof of His fidelity and goodness. We are like St. Thomas the Apostle who, on that second Sunday of Easter. demands proof of the Lord's resurrection.

"Unless I see the mark of the nail ... I will not believe."

Our science, technology and mathematics can indeed prove a great deal. But there are some things that require trusting another person. We prove promises of love only by trusting.

St. Thomas indeed saw the wounds of Jesus and believed. But there is an even greater blessing for us who simply trust Him — and all the truths the Church proclaims — because of the trustworthiness of the Risen One who speaks. This week let's trust Jesus without seeing him. — Father John Muir
