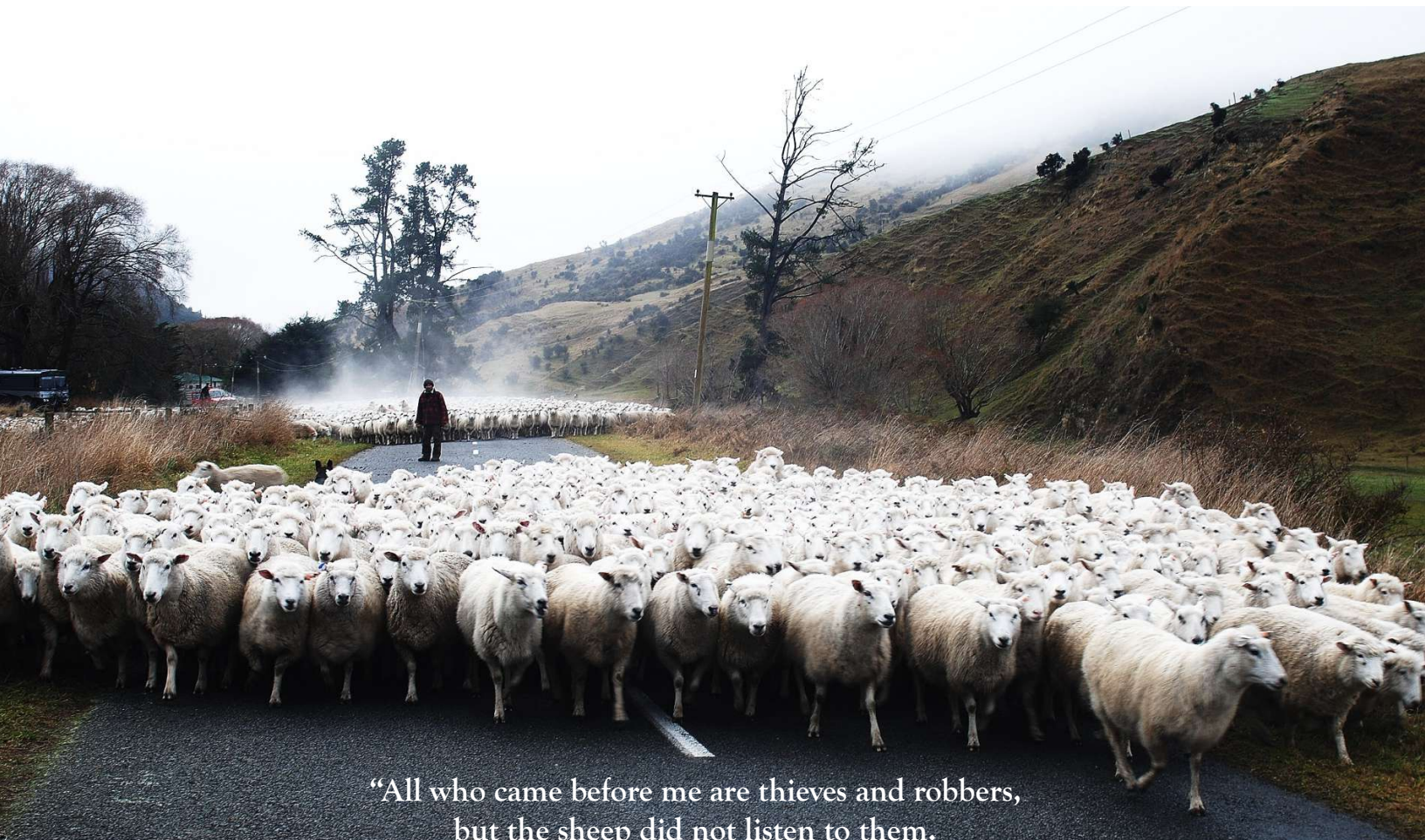

Examination of Conscience Before Confession

"I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents, than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance." Lk 15:7

The Ten Commandments:

I. I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange gods before me.

- Have I denied the existence of God?
- Have I rejected the Catholic faith, associating myself formally with another religion?
- Have I received communion at a non-Catholic service? Have I engaged in superstitious or occult practices?

II. You shall not take the Name of the Lord our God in vain.

- Have I used the name of God in cursing or blasphemy?
- Have I failed to keep the vows or promises that I have made to God?
- Have I spoken about the Church, the saints, or sacred things with irreverence, hatred or defiance?
- Have I watched television or movies, or listened to music that treated God, the Church, the saints or sacred things irreverently?

III. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.

- Have I set aside time each day for personal prayer to God?
- Have I missed Mass on Sunday or other Holy Days of Obligation or habitually come late to and/or leave early from Mass?
 - Have I waited one hour after eating before receiving Holy Communion?
- Have I received a sacrament while in the state of mortal sin?
- Did I do unnecessary shopping and business on Sunday and the other Holy Days of obligation?

IV. Honor your father and mother.

- If still under the care of my parents, did I obey all that they reasonably asked of me?
- Have I neglected the needs of my parents in their old age or in their time of need?
 - Do I live in humble obedience to those who legitimately exercise authority over me?
- Have I provided for the religious education and formation of my children for as long as they are under my care?

V: You shall not kill.

- Have I procured, performed, cooperated or advised another in the intentional killing of an unborn child through abortion?
- Have I seriously considered or attempted suicide?
 - Have I unjustly inflicted bodily harm on another person? Have I afflicted another person with verbal or emotional abuse?
 - Have I failed to forgive?
- Have I harbored hatred, anger, or resentment?



Maybe you grew up Catholic.

Maybe you think of yourself as Catholic.
Maybe you haven't been to church in awhile.
Or you are worried that you won't be welcomed here.

And maybe it feels awkward and scary to take that first step.

Questions. Doubts. Yearning.
But not sure for what.

Welcome home.

- Am I prejudiced or have I unjustly discriminated against others because of their race, color, nationality, gender or religion?
- Have I gotten drunk or abused other drugs?
- Do I endanger my health by not eating right, exercising?

VI. You shall not commit adultery.

IX. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.

- Have I committed adultery, having sexual relations with someone who is married, or with someone other than my spouse?
- Have I committed fornication, having sexual relations with someone of the opposite sex when neither of us is married?
 - Have I committed sodomy, having sexual relations with someone of the same sex?
 - Have I raped someone?
- Have I committed masturbation (impurity with self), using my sexual organs for my own sexual pleasure?
- Have I engaged in sexual foreplay reserved for marriage?
 - Have I used artificial means of birth control?
- Have I undergone an operation to render myself sterile for contraceptive purposes?
- Have I willfully entertained impure thoughts?
- Have I purchased or used pornography in any form?
 - Have I watched movies and television that involves sex and nudity?
- Have I listened to music or jokes that are harmful to purity

- Have I purposely dressed immodestly?
- Am I living in a valid and licit marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church?
- Have I given scandal by living with a member of the opposite sex without the benefit of marriage?

VII. You shall not steal.

X. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

- Did I take something that doesn't belong to me?
- Did I deface, destroy, or lose another's property without making restitution?
- Did I cheat on a test, on my taxes, or in business?
 - Have I squandered money in compulsive gambling?
- Do I contribute my time, talents, and money to support the poor, my parish, and the work of the Church?

VIII. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

- Have I deceived another by lying?
- Am I guilty of passing on gossip?
- Am I guilty of detraction, destroying a person's reputation by telling others about his faults for no good reason?

The "Fund" provides emergency help to persons who have nowhere else to go. The Fund is not a replacement or supplement for welfare or other forms of public assistance. It does not support persons' living needs on a continuing basis. Rather the Fund acts to solve immediate, pressing problems: food, lodging for the night, emergency medical care, rent to tide over a financial crisis or a utility bill to keep the water or heat turned on for the week. Persons may apply for assistance to the Fund through their parishes. The parishes are immediately reimbursed by the Fund for the disbursement so it is possible for every parish to provide in this way for sisters and brothers in need.

Erin Wilson, Journey Out – Program & Outreach Coordinator, South LAMs. Wilson has nearly a decade in anti-trafficking, working with human trafficking victims of domestic and international origins and working closely with local and federal law enforcement. Ms. Wilson provides a unique perspective in that she has seen trafficking cases from the inception of operations through the prosecution and conviction of traffickers.

According to the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) The average age a child gets a phone is now 10 years; 20 to 30% of kids report being cyberbullied. NCMEC has received reports of online enticement of children on **almost every digital platform.**

Topic: Scriptures Opened, Hearts Burning

Seeing the people gathering at Easter brought to mind that day in the old walled town of Jericho, when those seeking Jesus gathered in such numbers that one diminutive resident, Zacchaeus, had to find his worship space among the limbs of a Sycamore tree.

Luke's Gospel tells us that by such faith Jesus responded:

"...today salvation has come to this house."

Easter Sunday at St. James Parish found our own house of worship filled with the faithful; each finding their space to witness and celebrate the resurrection.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church in #1199:

"It is in these churches that the Church celebrates public worship to the glory of the Holy Trinity, hears the word of God, and sings his praise, lifts up her prayer,

and offers the sacrifice of Christ sacramentally, present in the midst of the assembly."

Q: What additional form of adoration of the Holy Trinity in the Easter Season and throughout the liturgical year does *The Catechism* endorse?

A: The Rosary. *The Catechism* identifies the Rosary as *"the epitome of the whole Gospel...the Church loves to pray in communion with the Virgin Mary to magnify with her the great things the Lord has done for her..."*

The Catechism refers to the meditative prayer that the Rosary engenders:

"Meditation engages thought, imagination, emotion, and desire... and strengthens our will to follow Christ. Christian prayer tries, above all, to meditate on the mysteries of Christ."

Among the meditative decades of the Holy Rosary we move along the prayers from the Sorrowful Mysteries to the Glorious Mysteries, among which we celebrate especially at Easter. Pope Francis wrote:

"The Rosary...involves meditating on the episodes of Christ's life from his birth to his death and resurrection...in meditating on the mysteries ... we are helped to assimilate the Gospel so that it shapes our lives."

It is said, *"To recite the Rosary is nothing other than to contemplate with Mary, the face of Christ."*

It's a face we fully celebrate at Easter, the face that Zacchaeus first saw from that tree, and the face we seek reflected in one another, here in our house of salvation and in our daily lives.

I recently rescued a dog. She's a terrier and rather adorable. And she's crazy about me. She could spend all day with me. But I'm a pastor at a parish and sometimes I leave her at the front desk of the church office. She constantly amazes me by her ability to distinguish between my voice and that of everyone else. If I say one word, even if I'm hidden around a corner, she'll sprint toward me and jump up into my arms.

This week the readings focus our attention to the *voice* of the risen Jesus Christ. Comparing his disciples to sheep and himself to a shepherd, he says, **"They recognize his voice."** He speaks to us and wants us to respond. When we hear his voice, we follow. Throughout this coming week, we will experience many interior promptings to receive God's love, and to love Him in return. That's his voice. Follow it into the safe and tender arms of Christ.

By contrast, some voices we will hear do not convey God's concern and love for us, but rather produce fear, despair, and other harmful mischief. Jesus calls these voices those of robbers. Does an idea or thought make it harder for you to love God? If so, run away. Let it go. It is most likely not the voice of the Risen Lord. Keep waiting for him to speak. You will recognize his voice. Then run to him as fast as you can. — *Father John Muir*

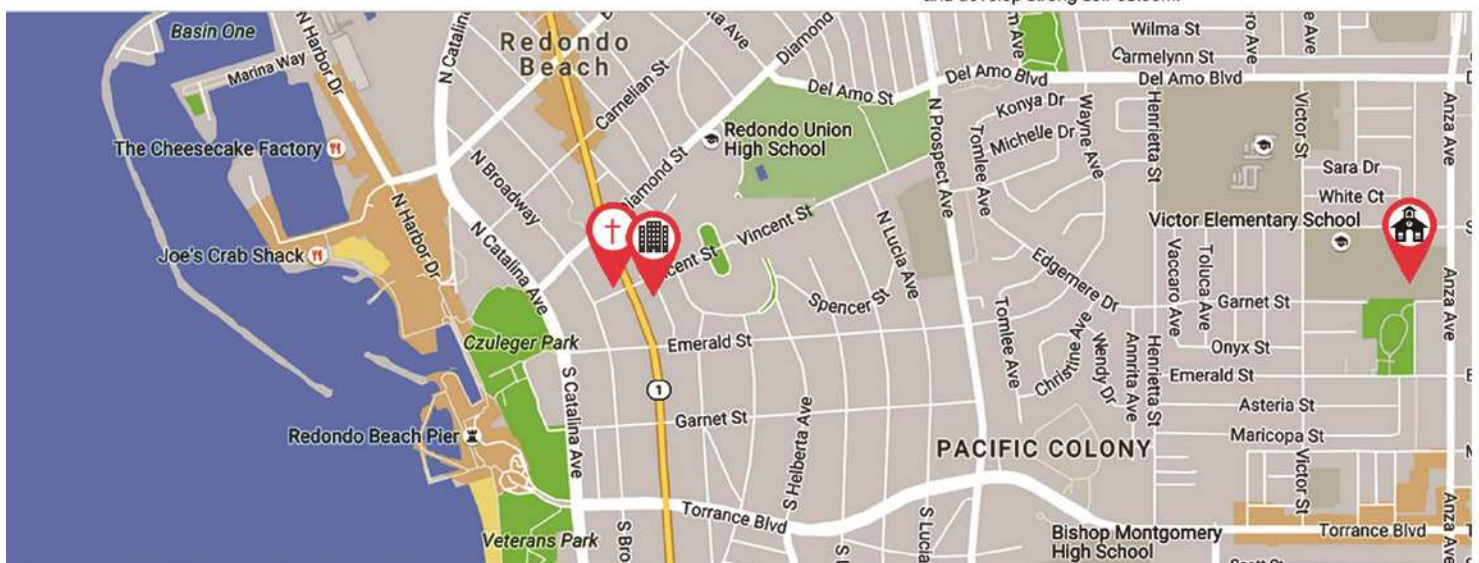
