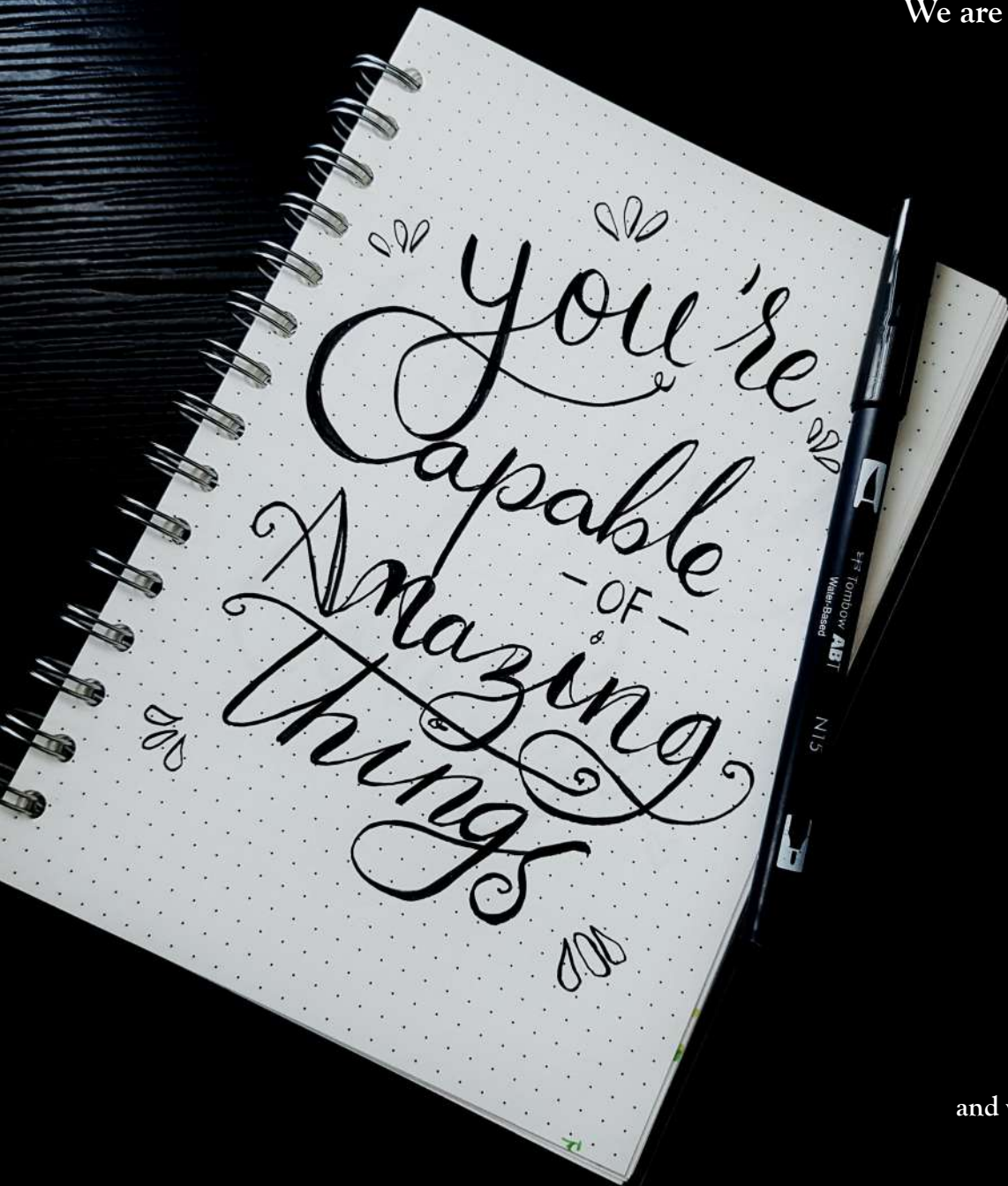

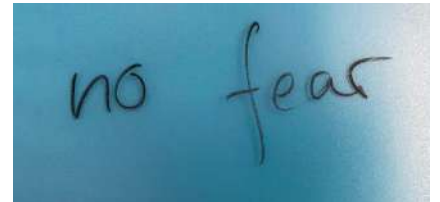

Topic: Bread of Life: Hope for the World

The Third Sunday of our Eastertide journey was absolutely replete with the kind of "holy moments" that spiritual author Matthew Kelly celebrates in his writings.

As the Choir joyously sang the dynamic hymn, "Come to the Lord," children of St. James made their way forward to their first Holy Communion, moving along their emerging spiritual path.

And the glorious interaction between the children, their beaming family members, their church instructors, catechists, priests, deacons, and pure sacramental grace combined to echo the words of the Beatitudes:

"Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God."

Q: What does *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* say?

A: In the Chapter fittingly called, "The Celebration of the Christian Mystery" *The Catechism*, among many instructional citations on the sacraments, states in Paragraph #1116:

"Sacraments are powers that come forth from the Body of Christ; actions of the Holy Spirit; masterworks of God in the new and everlasting covenant."

We read again this week about the road to Emmaus. Pope Francis, in speaking about first Communion talked about another road:

*"First Communion is,
above all,
a celebration.
We celebrate Jesus;
on the road that today leads you
to receive him in your hearts."*

As we observed, our Church on that third Sunday of Easter showed a large measure of fidelity, or faithfulness, to the liturgy of the Eucharist. It can be noted that this week also honors the Feast Day of the aptly-named St. Fidelis, born in the 14th century. St. Fidelis, who was ultimately martyred for his beliefs, said:

"I will never renounce Catholic doctrine, which is the truth of all ages."

Such enduring fidelity to Church teachings is a worthy example for parishioners who, in this time of renewing and revitalized evangelization, are engaged in the Catholic faith as both emerging disciples, like our first communicants, and later as active disciples of that everlasting covenant.

Then it may be said that we have embraced the commission given by Jesus in Mark 16:

"Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel..."

The Body of Christ...Amen, indeed.

If you had to summarize the essential core of the Christian life, what would it be? Mercy, truth, or love, perhaps? The readings today suggest another word which may surprise you. That word is *priesthood*.

St. Peter says to us, "**You are a 'chosen race, a royal priesthood...**" To be part of a priesthood is to offer a particular sacrifice in order for the community to survive and thrive. Jesus is the great high priest because he offers the one perfect sacrifice which heals and perfects the entire human race. Peter the Apostle wants us to know that all the baptized share in this priestly ministry. The whole of our lives, including every detail, is meant to become our acceptable offering to God.

The baptized exercise this priesthood in many ways, I'll mention three. At Sunday Mass, in private prayer, and in daily work. At Mass, we offer the sacrifice of our lives with that of the priest, who symbolizes Christ the Priest. In our prayer, a "morning offering" prayer is a great way to offer up all the joys and sufferings of the day to come. In our daily work, we sacrifice our time, comfort, money, and energy to do good for others. All this gives the deepest possible meaning to our lives: we share in the priesthood which saves the world. That's at the core of our faith. — *Father John Muir*

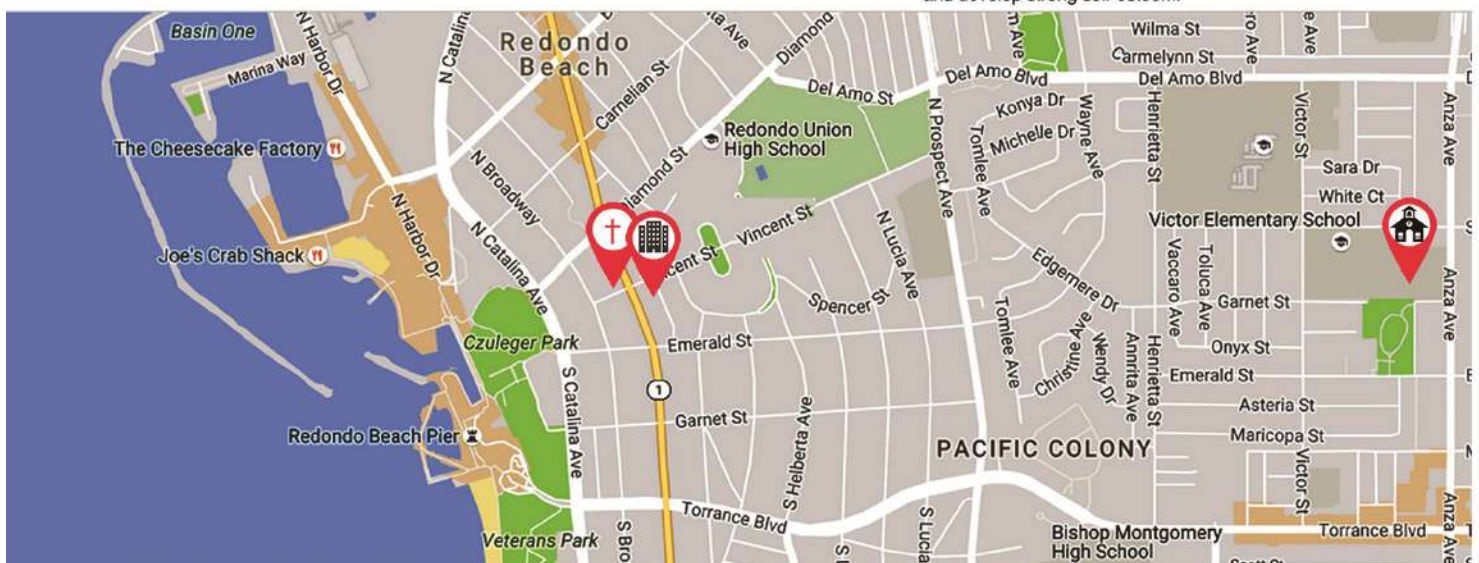
