Pastor's Letter

Dear St. James Community,

This has been a challenging time at St. James School following the recent administrative restructuring announcement.

While some parents have expressed their support, others have expressed concerns.

This letter is being offered to help address questions and clarify concerns that have been brought to my attention regarding our school.

Most importantly, our school philosophy statement reminds us that we are committed to excellence in Catholic education.

This has five distinct goals...

religious development, academic achievement, commitment to community service, personal and social development and physical and cultural developments.

I want to assure you that there is no thought of closing the school.

St. James School has strong operational vitality, ensuring its ability to fully staff each grade and to provide a quality education and formation for all of our students.

Still, I am saddened to hear that some of our teachers have expressed that they may choose not to return for the coming school year.

I hope and pray that our teachers know that we value their experience and contributions and that they will consider continuing serving our students and school community at St. James.

The renewal process at the end of each school year is used to determine our staffing needs and ensure that we are **fully staffed for the coming school year**.

We will continue to meet with our teachers to address their concerns and determine their annual contract renewals.

I pray that together we can take the best steps forward for our teachers, students and our school community.

As an update to the leadership search process that I previously shared in my letter of May 24th, our preliminary search committee for **school principal has already conducted initial interviews** with several candidates.

Once semifinalists are identified, additional members of the community including current parents and staff will assist in conducting interviews. Ultimately, in keeping with Archdiocesan protocols, the expanded search committee will narrow down and recommend at least two candidates for my consideration.

With the Holy Spirit's guidance I am confident that through this process we will be able to select a qualified principal to lead the school community forward.

There have also been questions regarding the insurance settlement received in October 2022.

The funds are in a restricted school account for the current and future needs of the school.

As mentioned in the letter to the school community in October of 2022 when the settlement was reached, a Settlement Fund Advisory Committee was established and has been meeting regularly since November 2022.

The committee, which is comprised of **current and past teachers**, **current and past parents**, **past students**, **and members of the Pastoral and Finance Councils**, is working to provide recommendations that will serve as a guide for the best use of these funds for now and the future of the school.

By conducting a survey among school families, staff, and parishioners the committee set out to understand the needs of the school (e.g. facilities, curriculum, staffing, technology and reparation).

The responses varied but have helped to identify some initial opportunities. Thus far, **\$72,169 was allocated toward new lunch tables and umbrellas and termite abatement.**

Additionally, they have recommended utilizing funds for **upgrading the aging play structure.**

The committee will continue to meet and evaluate other short and long-term needs that will be addressed with the remaining balance.

While I understand that this is a challenging time, I am hopeful that we can continue to work together to best serve the students of St. James School.

Our school has always been dedicated to forming our children and families in our Catholic faith and values while also providing excellence in education.

I look forward to welcoming our families, new and old, and continuing to build upon the strong traditions of St. James School as we move into the 2023-24 school year.



Avoid a Social Engineering Scam

Social engineering is a scam where a cybercriminal attempts to trick someone into taking an action against their own best interests.

Usually, the action results in the victim providing confidential information (like their login information) or installing malware on their computer.

Most social engineering attacks have four common traits, which signal a far higher likelihood of a scam if all are present.

Roger Grimes, KnowBe4's Data-Driven Defense Evangelist, advises asking yourself these four questions to help you avoid becoming a victim:

- 1. Did the message arrive unexpectedly?
- 2. Is it the first time the sender has asked you to perform the requested action?
- 3. Does the request include a stressor, such as "you need to do this now"?
- 4. Can performing the request harm your interests?

If you answer "yes" to all of them, you should go out of your way to confirm the request is legitimate. Use a trusted method like calling or texting the sender before taking any action.

Not every message with these four traits is absolutely a social engineering scam.

Our email inboxes, voicemail and postal mailboxes are full of unexpected requests; that is life.

But when these four traits are present, stop, look, and think before you act!

Topic: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was God...

Each Sunday, at the beginning of Mass we prepare ourselves to "...celebrate these sacred mysteries..."

Q: What is one area of preparation that we address?

A: We consider and meditate upon the Word of God.

To that end, in his homily last Sunday, Monsignor Mike was referencing the mysteries of the ascension. Monsignor also touched, in scriptural allusions, Paul's proclamation of the Good News to the Gentiles in Corinth, that isthmus area in ancient Greece.

He described not only the narrative of this section of the Acts of the Apostles and their evangelistic effort, but he also underscored the fact that sacred scripture is the inspired word of God, indeed;

...the very voice of God.

Pope John Paul II, in an Address given in the summer of 1995 on a World Day of Prayer spoke along the lines of Pastor Mike's insightful homily:

"Sacred Scripture is a sure guide, when welcomed, and meditated upon in the church. Coming to know the events involving the major figures of the Bible, and above all, the reading of the gospels provide moments of unexpected insights."

The Catechism has many entries about the dynamism of Sacred Scripture:

"... the study of the sacred page should be the very soul of sacred theology."

Sacred Scripture, then, features historicity, by virtue of its actuality of persons and events; Christian direction; spiritual insight; and divine inspiration.

The very voice of God...

St. Michael Prayer St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle; be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

Gospel Meditation

The Most Holy Trinity

In my experience, one of the peculiarities of being a man is the somewhat unlikely ability to look into the mirror, no matter how out of shape he may be, and declare with full confidence: "Looking good, buddy!" Ask a man. He'll probably confirm it.

Therein lies a mystery. You might think I refer to man's ability to deceive himself or his propensity toward vainglory. But in this case, I refer to the mystery of a healthy and proper sense of self-love. We human beings (both men and women) have the utterly weird ability to look at ourselves as if we were another. Then we tend to love this "other." Then, somehow, that love becomes a bond between the two. We are three and yet one.

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. We ponder anew that God in His unity is a play of multiplicity: Lover, Beloved, and shared Love. Or, as we also proclaim, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If we allow it, this mystery heals our temptation toward self-hatred and destruction. We all know how awful it is to look into the mirror and not know the person we see, or, equally bad, to know and hate who we see. Jesus, the Son of God, draws us into the dynamics of authentic self-knowledge and self-love. Perhaps we could ask the Holy Trinity this Sunday to teach us to truly look at ourselves and to properly love who we see looking back . — *Father John Muir*


