

#### Pastor's Letter

#### Corpus Christi—The Body of Christ

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. St Paul in his letter to the Corinthians today says: "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf."

St. Paul, in this earliest of documents, affirms the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is not just a nice remembrance, it is the Body and Blood of Christ, sacrificed once and yet truly present to us. He also reminds us that when we gather as a faith community Christ is also truly present in us—we are the Body of Christ.

What an awesome experience it is to know that we are so intimately connected to the God of all creation. We are precious and loved beyond all our imagining. We have a hard time seeing such great love for us as we know too well all our faults and brokenness. And yet, God calls us into such intimacy, giving us hope and purpose and a strength we could never have on our own.

From now to next June we will be reflecting more deeply on this gift of Eucharist and of Christ present in our midst.

Next Sunday as we celebrate Fathers Day we invite our families to join together as a family for Mass. We celebrate the gift of our fathers and those who are father figures for us and pray for an outpouring of grace upon them that they might continue to witness God's protecting and loving care for us. #### Catholic Q & A

#### **Topic: Ordinary Time**

**Q:** We meet and worship now in liturgical Ordinary Time. Why is it designated *Ordinary* Time?

**A:** Ordinary Time makes up most of the liturgical year in the Catholic Church.

Ordinary time is called ordinary not because it is common, but because the weeks of Ordinary Time are ordered; from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word "order."

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops describes Ordinary Time as,

"a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ.
The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of our Lord,
Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is, living the life of Christ."

**Q:** Clerical vestments worn during Ordinary Time are green in color. What does the color green symbolize?

A: The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that Green symbolizes hope, life, and anticipation during a season that is,

"focused on the Lord's three-year public ministry,
His teachings and miracles;
a reminder that the mission of the church
is to share the hope and life
of Christ with the world."

Sources tell us that the first person to systematize Roman Catholic liturgical color schemes was Pope Innocent III, pontiff from 1198 to 1216, who named four liturgical colors at that time:

- white,
- red.
- black, and
- green.

Ordinary Time.

It's a season of the extraordinary and the uncommonly divine, wrapped in shades of green, representing an ecclesial mission that celebrates sharing, hope, and life.

#### **Gospel Meditation**

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "we, though many, are one body." Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic. It's our participation of love in the one we love. — Father John Muir
