Pastor's Letter

World Mission Sunday

In 1820 Catholics were only 2% of the U.S. population. In the 1830's with crop failures in Europe and especially in Ireland, large numbers of Europeans, many of them Catholic, arrived and with them came priests to serve their needs. By 1850, Catholics made up the largest religious denomination in the country—and these were served by priests from Europe, especially Ireland.

The United States was a "Mission" church, receiving financial aid from Rome until 1908, and it continued to rely heavily on the service of foreign-born priests.

Today in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles over 50% of the 1,000 priests (active & retired) were born in other countries. Even if we are not a 'mission' church, we certainly depend on service of priests from around the world and our pews are filled with faithful from those countries.

Next weekend we celebrate World Mission Sunday and from my ministry in the Mission Office and many trips to mission countries and Fr. Thaddeus' experience in Nigeria, we know that every parish in the world, no matter how poor, will still have a Mission Sunday collection reflecting the call EVERY Catholic has to be disciples of the Lord who live and share the message of God's love with others.

Envelopes are in the pews and this collection enables growing churches in the poorer countries of the world still considered "Mission" churches to have an opportunity to have the Gospel preached to them.

The Mission Sunday collection truly is the foundation on which these dioceses survive and your generosity is so important.



Catholic Q&A Topic: And The Word was God

Among Scripture readings this week is Psalm 19: "...the law of the Lord is perfect, refreshing the soul." *Q*: What does the Church teach about sacred scripture and soulful refreshment?

A: Pope Francis quotes Biblical scholar and translator St. Jerome:

"Catholics today must heed the advice that Jerome unceasingly gave to his contemporaries, Read the divine Scriptures constantly; never let the sacred volume fall from your hand."

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops offers study points for experiencing the Bible. Here, 10 excerpts:

The Bible isn't a book. It's a library, a collection of 73 books. Know the genre of the book you are reading.
Know what the Bible is: God's truths that we need for

the sake of our salvation.The Old Testament relates to the New. Together they help us to better understand God's plan.

4. You do not read alone. Catholics join all of the faithful, (as St. James Priests teach), putting God's Word into practice.

5. We read with a goal to ask, "What is God saying to me?"

The Catechism, Paragraph #95, helps to explain the soulful and the foundational tenets of a profession of faith:

"It is clear, therefore that in the supremely wise arrangement of God, Sacred Tradition, Sacred Scripture, and the **Magisterium**, (the teaching arm of the Church), are so connected that one cannot stand without the others. Working together, each in its own way, under the action of the one Holy Spirit, they all contribute effectively to the salvation of souls."

In a preface to *The One Year Bible Catholic Edition*, (a wonderful resource), Pope St. John Paul II wrote, in answer to the question, "Why Read The Bible?" : **From the word of Jesus we learn the very nature of God...*

*From the word of Jesus we know our eternal destiny.. *From the word of Jesus we learn true dignity, only found in the life of grace...

*From the word of Jesus we learn how we must behave...

*From the word of Jesus we know His presence, the truths of faith, the Eucharist; the manifestation of love..." As our choir sings:

"In the beginning was the word, and the word was with God, and the word was God." Refresh your soul.

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

I confess that I have a soft spot for the scary things Jesus says because they are usually ignored.

But there's gold in them thar hills, if we have courage to look. This week Jesus gives us a terrifying warning in his parable about the king who gives a marriage feast for his son and promptly goes berserk when people don't respond. The point: those who do not properly respond to God's generous invitation will face totally devastating consequences. The invitees who don't show up get their city burned to the ground. The poor homeless man is tortured for not wearing the correct clothes. Scary indeed.

Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following him? No, because that is certainly not how he treats anyone in the Gospels. A better view is this: to Jesus, your life *matters*. The universe is not an empty wasteland where anything goes. It is a theater of love offered and either accepted or rejected. How easy it can be to glide through life thinking my life doesn't make a difference. But it does. It really does.

This should not only be sobering but exhilarating. The positive side of the negative in Jesus' scary parables is the thrill and joy that he is inviting us, therefore our lives matter a great deal. There *is* a reason to get up in the morning. God's generous love is relentlessly calling us. True, obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us and those around us. But how wonderful must the consequences of our 'yes' be?


