Pastor's Letter

World Mission Sunday

In 1820 Catholics were only 2% of the U.S. population. In the 1830's with crop failures in Europe and especially in Ireland, large numbers of Europeans, many of them Catholic, arrived and with them came priests to serve their needs. By 1850, Catholics made up the largest religious denomination in the country—and these were served by priests from Europe, especially Ireland.

The United States was a "Mission" church, receiving financial aid from Rome until 1908, and it continued to rely heavily on the service of foreign-born priests.

Today in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles over 50% of the 1,000 priests (active & retired) were born in other countries. Even if we are not a 'mission' church, we certainly depend on service of priests from around the world and our pews are filled with faithful from those countries.

Next weekend we celebrate World Mission Sunday and from my ministry in the Mission Office and many trips to mission countries and Fr. Thaddeus' experience in Nigeria, we know that every parish in the world, no matter how poor, will still have a Mission Sunday collection reflecting the call EVERY Catholic has to be disciples of the Lord who live and share the message of God's love with others.

Envelopes are in the pews and this collection enables growing churches in the poorer countries of the world still considered "Mission" churches to have an opportunity to have the Gospel preached to them.

The Mission Sunday collection truly is the foundation on which these dioceses survive and your generosity is so important.

 - A phone assessment and registration forms are required before registration is complete.





Catholic Q&A Topic: The Valley of Decision

Among scripture readings this week, the places and events of human activity serve to provide a continuum to the struggles of the people of antiquity with the tragic conflict scenarios within the Holy Land today.

In Jeremiah 23 we moved among the dusty roads and roiling currents of human activity in place settings that ring familiar again today. Our focus is drawn to the ancient lands of the Philistines, echoing now across the centuries: Ashkelon, Gaza, Ashdod, and Egypt are in the news.

We hear about Judah, Zion, Lebanon and that old Arabic term for a river valley, a *Wadi,* as part of the background of chaos, violence and strife. Here, regrettably, the long- ago etched words of scripture apply today:

"The peaceful folds are devastated... a great tempest is stirring."

The Prophet Joel, among his speeches about the region's agriculture and warnings to the people to follow God's teachings, reminds the ancients and also speaks to those in residence today, that:

"The Lord dwells in Zion."

The other oracle whose words we read this week, Jeremiah, gives a prophecy about, "a nation in crisis." He was, scholars tell us, called to prophesy under the trying circumstances of the final days of the kingdom of Judah.

Q: During today's trying circumstances, what does the Catholic Church say?

A: Pope Francis invited both parties to restraint in hopes of reaching a solution to the war, and called for fraternity and dialogue.

"...we pray urgently for peace..."

The Catechism, in the applicable section called "Life In Christ" teaches that the fruits of charity, (much in need in this struggle), are joy, peace, and mercy.

In the face of complex, long-running, and seemingly irreconcilable dispute, the readings this week include a measure of essential, and quietly abiding guidance in 2 Thessalonians:

"Do not weary in doing what is right."

To the extent that prayer is truly an important part of the equation of the teachings of Christ, we may, in the face of the troubles of the Holy Land, do as the zealous Apostle Paul says in his Letter to the Thessalonians:

"...pray without ceasing."

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

With little more than a year until the United States' national elections, I find myself feeling, like many Catholics, both dread and energized.

Dread, because our democratic republic can be a messy endeavor and campaigns a long, nasty, and unedifying slog; energized, because hope for positive societal change can be enticing and engaging. As a pastor, I see similar conflicting attitudes in those whom I serve.

How can Catholics best engage our political arena in a way which is truly helpful and worthwhile?

This weeks' gospel reading offers wisdom in this regard. Jesus says,

"Render therefore to Caesar the things are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."

This riddle forces us to answer for ourselves a hidden question:

what is the relationship between political and divine authority?

Two common but false answers lead to mischief. If we answer that the two are equivalent, politics becomes our absolute authority. This happens whenever religion is slave to the state, as in the travesty of the pro-Nazi German Christian movement in the 1930s and 40s.

It also usually occurs when there is an official state religion. If we answer that the two are totally unrelated, we end up with an unchecked aggressive secularist state as we often experience now. Thus, religion becomes a weak and private pastime.

What's a better alternative? At our best, Christians hold that political authority does indeed have its own legitimate autonomy but is nested within God's all-encompassing authority.

Think, for example, of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s respect for politics while also being able to criticize unjust human laws because he recognized a higher heavenly law. In other words, Caesar owns politics — *and God owns Caesar*. So, we should allow Jesus' words to lead us to have a deep respect and willingness to peacefully engage in politics without making that engagement our religion.

We bring our faith to bear on our politics knowing confidently that Caesar isn't God — but he is indeed God's.
