Pastor's Letter

ALL SAINTS DAY Wednesday, November 1st –A Holy Day of Obligation Masses at 8 am, Noon, 4:15 and 7 pm

In the early days of the Church the Christians were accustomed to solemnize the anniversary of a martyr's death for Christ at the place of martyrdom.

In the fourth century during the persecutions by the Roman emperor Diocletian, the number of martyrs became so great that a separate day could not be assigned to each. The Church, feeling that every martyr should be venerated, appointed a common day for all.

These celebrations formed the beginning of All Saints Day when we remember and honor the lives and witness of saints, known and unknown, who have blessed and strengthened the church throughout the centuries.

ALL SOULS DAY, Thursday, November 2nd Masses at 8 am, Noon, and 7 pm-Memorial Mass

Our 7 pm Memorial Mass is a sacred time when our community gathers as we remember and pray for our deceased relatives and friends. We invite you to join us for this Mass especially if you have loved ones who have died during the past year. For many it is a time of grace and healing by God's compassionate love.

At St. James it is also a Mass to remember in a special way and honor the 45 people whose funerals were held at our parish during the last year (September to September).

We will continue our All Souls Novena during the month remembering those who have died. Envelopes are located in the vestibules of the church and can be returned in the collection basket or brought to the parish office. The envelopes with your loved ones' names will be placed on our altar for the entire month of November.



Catholic Q&A Topic: The Valley of Decision

At the beginning of Mass we settle in, preparing as the celebrant intones," to celebrate the sacred mysteries." In concluding the celebration of the Mass we are sent to "love and to serve the Lord," often with the addendum: "...by loving and serving one another."

Q: What are these sacred mysteries, and how exactly do we serve the Lord and one another?

A: To come to a better understanding of these questions and other subjects of faith, we have *The Catechism of the Catholic Church.* The first encyclical issued by Pope Francis back in 2013 was titled Lumen Fidei, Latin for "the light of faith." That factor and imagery of illuminative insight can be applied to our *Catechism.*

This valuable source offers,"... a complete summary of what Catholics throughout the world believe...celebrate...pray... and live by...*The Catechism* draws upon the Bible, the Mass, the Sacraments, Church tradition and teaching, and the lives of the Saints."

In addressing the two particular questions mentioned above, an example of catechetical illumination and insight is found in *The Catechism* in Chapter Two, "The Celebration of the Christian Mystery." Within that discussion of the sacramental celebration of the Paschal Mystery, one can better consider the sacred mysteries and how sacramental grace empowers us to love and to serve one another as part of practical application of faith in action.

Pope St, John Paul II called *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, " A sure norm for teaching the faith; a special gift."

The *Catechism,* a true light of faith. Words to live by in a Q&A world.

What Is Advent?

Advent is a period of spiritual preparation in which many Christians make themselves ready for the coming, or birth of the Lord, Jesus Christ. Celebrating Advent typically involves a season of prayer, fasting, and repentance, followed by anticipation, hope, and joy.

Many Christians celebrate Advent not only by thanking God for Christ's first coming to Earth as a baby, but also for his presence among us today through the Holy Spirit, and in preparation and anticipation of his final coming at the end of the age.

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

In our secularized culture, we all struggle with belief in God, at least to some degree.

An atheist man named Robert Bridges once wrote to his friend, the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, asking how he could possibly learn to believe in God. Hopkins pithily responded: "Give alms." Would that help someone tempted by atheism today, like you and me?

I think so, and here's why. This week Jesus speaks of love for God and neighbor. These dual commands were nothing new when Jesus used them to sum up the Jewish law. What is new is the way he links them together in mutual dependency. In Jesus, God and man have become one. Human-love and God-love are now inseparably married forever.

The newness of the God-man means that there is now a permanently counter-intuitive way into the knowledge and love of God: love of our neighbor.

To experience charity is to know God.

That's what Hopkins was getting at for his friend. How we treat our fellow human beings is inseparable from faith in God.

Do you want to have a stronger sense of God's loving presence and goodness?

Commit to serving someone today and this week. Love him or her. Don't wait for love for God to appear in your heart before loving others. Jesus has united divine and human love.

If you want to believe more in God, give alms.

When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and stars that you established —

What is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?

Yet you have made him little less than God, and crowned him with glory and honor.

> You have given him dominion over the works of your hands, you have put all things under his feet ... Psalm 8


