Pastor's Letter

A Spirituality of Stewardship

The Finance Council is an important part of the stewardship of St. James to wisely and effectively use the resources and facilities of the parish. Each one of us is also called to be good stewards of our own faith and blessings we have received. The Council has asked me to say something about the spirituality of stewardship.

A tithe is a portion of our income given to our local church. Because the custom of tithing is biblical, many Christians practice it as part of their faith.

An 'offering' is often something we give from what is left over after we have met all our expenses. A 'tithe' is a specific amount that we give first before anything else.

The Bible tells us that tithing is a way to show that we trust God with our lives *and* our finances. Tithing isn't for God's benefit. He doesn't *need* our money.

Instead, tithing is meant for our benefit because

sacrificing a portion of our income reminds us that all we have is a gift from God and is about living with the attitude that we've been blessed to be a blessing to others.

Giving encourages a grateful and generous spirit and can help steer us away from being greedy or loving money too much. We should always be giving in some way of both talent and treasure.

Tithing is more of a spiritual topic than a financial one. It's not about the money—it's about the heart.

I find that using Faith Direct is my best way to give first and generously, before my other expenses, and it makes sure that I stay true to that commitment each and every month. I also find that it keeps my relationship and commitment to St James strong.

Message from the Finance Council

As you recall, we announced the financial results for last year in the bulletin a few weeks ago. Since then, we have received the results from the first quarter of this fiscal year (July through September). We have incurred a significant deficit. Here are the numbers for the last three years:

Income	\$279,700	\$264,600	\$258,000
Expenses	\$300,500	<u>\$338,500</u>	\$327,700
Net	-\$20,800	-\$53,900	-\$69,700

Thank you to all who increased your regular weekly contributions after our last announcement. Our income for the quarter this year is 7.8% less than two years ago. Our expenses are 9.1% greater than two years ago. We are trying to control expenses without the need to reduce ministries or staff, so we need your help to increase our income.

Please once again we ask that you prayerfully consider increasing your weekly contributions. This is a situation that requires the effort of many to resolve. If you can increase your contributions, please do so.

Our parish ministries continue because so many people need our help. Recurring gifts helped sustain our parish in unprecedented times, and continue to be a vital source of support for ministries that are a lifeling to these in



Catholic Q & A

Catholic Q&A Topic: Where Christ's Spirit Dwells

A man went out to do what he calls his daily "rosary walk," despite feeling a bit out of sorts and vaguely unworthy in general.

As to the Rosary, the Catholic Bishops teach that it is a Scripture-based prayer that summarizes the great mysteries of faith.

They describe the meditative ethos of the Rosary which leads one into restful, contemplative prayer. They describe the gentle repetition of these prayers which help us to enter, "into the silence of the heart, where Christ's spirit dwells."

The man looked forward to meditating on the Joyful Mysteries, or perhaps Glorious, or Luminous Mysteries, yet it was the day for the Sorrowful Mysteries. Nevertheless, he walked.

Q: What does the Church teach about the Rosary, which it describes as Marian in character, yet at heart a Christocentric prayer, which has "the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety".

Pope St. John Paul II wrote in a prescient way about a feature of the Rosary that applies acutely today:

"By its nature as an insistent choral petition... the Rosary allows us to hope that, even today, the difficult battle for peace can be won."

The Fathers and Brothers of Mary Knoll wrote:

"In prayer we bring everything to God. our struggles, our wounds, our fears, but also our joys, our gifts, our loved ones, all to God. By praying, we allow God to enter our time, to welcome and transfigure all that we experience.

> Make use of this powerful instrument. the prayer of the Holy Rosary, because it brings peace to our hearts, to families, the Church and the World."

So it is then that among the guiding beads is that unworthy man on his personally transformative Rosary walk; there is a Church Magisterium that honors the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary; and there is a contemporary world on fire that yearns for the peace of Christ as reflected within the prayerful mysteries of messianic faith history.

The Pope characterized the Rosary as "an insistent choral petition." The St. James choir sings, by way of petition, the plaintive echoes of the Rosary with words harmonically aligned to the dynamics and tonal key of those Christocentric prayers of joyful, sorrowful, luminous, and ever-glorious mysteries: "Transfigure us O, Lord."

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

Last Easter season a new convert to Catholicism at my parish asked me with a grave tone in her voice:

"Why do we call priests 'father' if Jesus says,

'Call no man on earth your father, for you have one Father, who is in heaven'?"

Thinking myself clever, I asked, "Do you think it's okay to call someone your 'teacher' or 'mister' or 'dad'?" She said, "Yes, I do." I responded, "Well, Jesus seems to forbid that, too. So, it's obviously hyperbole that he's using." She thought for a moment and declared, "Then I will stop using those words, too!" And she walked away. Not the outcome I was seeking.

We shouldn't be too hasty in dismissing this complaint voiced by many non-Catholics. The expression "father" for ordained priests is not honorary for the individual man.

The priest's fatherhood doesn't begin or end in him at all. Rather, the title "father" indicates that he is a sacramental sign of God's Fatherhood revealed in Jesus. I can tell you, as a very unworthy bearer of that title, we should give and receive that title with some trepidation (because of God's awesomeness) and with a little sense of humor (because of the lowliness of the men with the title).

The longer I'm a priest, the more I'm comfortable with people not using the title "father" and just calling me "John." After all. only God is Father in the truest sense.

At the same time, Jesus has brought the Father close to us, very close. We honor this closeness in some men with the title "father."

Who are the priests in your life whom Christ has sent to you?

How wonderful that Christ has surrounded us with humble signs of his Father's love.

It's good to celebrate that love with gratitude for the priests in our lives.
