We are planning a Christmas Party on Dec. 9th from 1-2:30pm in Kavanagh Hall.


We will have food for everyone and Santa will be there with toys for the children. We are asking your generosity in the following areas:







Catholic Q&A Topic: Fidei Depositum: Deposit of Faith

The Catechism of the Catholic Church was prepared and written over a period of six years. The development of the catechism has been described as, "intense work...in a spirit of fervent zeal." Pope John Paul II characterized it as.

"... a means to fulfill the mission of the Church."

Q: What is that designated Mission, and by extension, our own personal mission as good Catholics?

A: In his preface to *The Catechism*, the Pope addressed not only the Cardinals, Archbishops, Bishops, Priests and Deacons, but also directed the explanation and instruction of the faith to "all the People of God."

"Guarding the Deposit of Faith is the Mission which the Lord entrusted to His Church, and which she fulfills in every age."

That Deposit of Faith, a doctrine of the faith and pastoral norms, is set forth throughout *The Catechism*.

Here are just three broadly thematic mission-setting excerpts:

Paragraph # 2105 - Christians are called to be the light of the world. By evangelizing, the Church works toward the infusion of the Christian spirit into communities."

#1912-The common good is always oriented towards the progress of persons...founded on truth, built up in justice, and animated by love.

#1970-The Law of the Gospel requires us to put into practice the words of the Lord; to love one another as he has loved us.

Among this week's Bible readings is the Hebrew prophet Ezekiel whose emphasis on the spiritual aspects of his age lends itself to the mission that the Vatican Council refined in *The Catechism* and adheres as part of the teachings of Scripture which guides those striving to be good Catholics; for example:

Ezekiel 18.5 says that if a person, "...is righteous and does what is lawful and right,,,follows my statutes and is careful to observe my ordinances acting faithfully...such a one shall surely live, says the Lord God."

Paul's long Letter to the Romans, Chapter 13, beautifully and poetically sums up a prescriptively clear and enduring doctrine for the faithful:

"Love is the fulfillment of the law."

Many of the those spiritual elements such as Church Mission, personal mission, and an abiding deposit of faith across the ages, along with other aspects of the universal church are ensconced in *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, which describes itself as that which, "...draws on the Bible, the Mass, the Sacraments, Church tradition and teaching, and the lives of the saints."

Pope John Paul II reassuringly called *The Catechism*, "A sure norm for teaching the faith"

Armed accordingly, the spiritual journey continues. May our zeal be fervent.

Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

When I was a kid, I hated playing Monopoly because my siblings and friends always seemed to win.

But worse was how it happened. Scared to risk my fake money on buying properties, I'd hold on to it. My opponents hungrily bought up the various real estate squares on the board. Then, inevitably, my poor, low-equity self would land on their spots, pay them rent, and my money would drain to zero. It seemed so unfair. The rich get richer, and the poor get poorer. I had to learn that monopoly money is meant to be spent. I was scared to lose some of it. So, I lost all of it.

How do we see what we possess?

Jesus' parable about the talents is not really about economics but about the investability of everything he entrusts to us. How marvelous that everyone in the fable who places talents in the open market doubles their investment. The only one who doesn't is the man who fearfully buries his one talent. Jesus' success strategy for us seems to be, whatever we have, *get it out of our possession*. Risk it as quickly and as fully as we can.

You and I have precious gifts.

We have valuable things to invest — time, talents, treasure.

The Lord invites us to be brave and even somewhat reckless, to give as much away as possible. If we give it away in the direction of love and truth, it will grow. If we hold on to it in fear, the little we have will be taken away.

Let me challenge you this week: find something in your life you're holding on to, and risk it by giving it away.

It won't double if you hold on to it.
