Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

Feast of Christ the King

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King.

This feast day falls on the last Sunday of the Liturgical year, the Sunday before the beginning of **Advent**.

The feast is a relative newcomer to the liturgical calendar; it was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, when he wrote the encyclical *Quas Primas*.

Here, he lays out the different understandings of kingship that Jesus Christ possesses.

Pius XI also explains how Christians ought to live as a result of Christ's kingship:

"He must reign in our **minds**, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ.

He must reign in our **wills**, which should obey the laws and precepts of God.

He must reign in our **hearts**, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone.

He must reign in our **bodies and in our members**, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of Apostle Paul, as instruments of justice unto God."

As we end this church year we remember that each Sunday we have followed the Gospel of Matthew and followed Jesus as He calls each of us into that deeper relationship with Him. He calls us also to be his disciples to the world.

Why go to confession?

Jesus entered this world to forgive sins. Recall the words of our Lord: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him may not die but may have eternal life." (Jn 3:16)

During His public ministry, Jesus preached about the forgiveness of sins: remember the parables of the Prodigal Son (Lk 15:11ff) or the Lost Sheep (Lk 15:1ff), and His teaching that "There will likewise be more joy in heaven over one repentant sinner than over 96 righteous people who have no need to repent." (Lk 15:7)

Jesus Himself forgave sins: remember the story of the woman caught in adultery (Jn 8:1ff) or the woman who washed His feet with her tears. (Lk 7:36ff) He also taught us to pray for forgiveness in the "Our Father:" "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

His mission of reconciliation would climax in His passion, death and resurrection: Jesus suffered, died and rose to free us from sin and death. However, in His divine mercy, Jesus called the sinner to realize the sin, to repent of it, and to be reconciled with God and neighbor. Jesus wanted this ministry of reconciliation to continue. On the first Easter Sunday evening, Jesus appeared to His Apostles, "breathed on them," and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive men's sins, they are forgiven them; if you hold them bound, they are held bound." (Jn 20:21-23) From: www.ewtn.com/catholicism/library/why-go-toconfession-1028



Catholic Q & A

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

Catholic Q&A Topic: Where Angels Sing

In his 10am homily, Monsignor Mike was offering the lessons of Matthew's parable of The Ten Virgins with its moral messaging about being spiritually awake and ready, internally and externally in faith, as we become actualized as "co-heirs of eternal life," as we hear in the Eucharistic Prayer.

Q: What does *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* teach about this religious process and ethos of preparation?

A: The Catechism reflects the scriptural writings of Matthew about being "ready" and "staying awake." There are the pages about judgment and inheritance of the kingdom, "...for the least brothers of mine...you did for me."

What follows is the unfolding of the plan of preparation in subsequent readings such as: The Passion and Resurrection; The Conspiracy Against Jesus; The Betrayal by Judas; Preparations for the Passover; The Agony In the Garden; The Arrest of Jesus; Jesus Before the Sanhedrin; Peter's Denial of Jesus; Jesus Before Pilate; The Sorrowful Mysteries; The Resurrection; and the Commissioning of the Disciples.

We, as disciples, also read in the Catechism about further preparation:

"When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming."

So we are awake and ready for the dawn of Advent in continuing preparation of self and of our neighbor. We await and will honor and observe the O Antiphons, these prayerful anthems which precede and succeed the Psalms and songs of the season which the Catechism describes as, Advent or "ad venire", Latin for "to come."

The O Antiphons call attention to what is coming. The Church teaches that we be ready and awake to the wonders of the divine plan of God amid the purple and the rose vestments of our Priests and the purple of the first candle, symbolizing the Prophecy; the second purple candle called the Bethlehem Candle, representing faith; the third candle in pink, a liturgical color of joy called the Shepherd's Candle; and the fourth candle of purple called the Christ Candle representing the life of Christ.

As we prepare for Christmas by way of the events and liturgy of Advent, one Antiphon says:

"Give peace, O Lord, to those who wait for you. Hear the prayers of your servant..." We are ready. In May 2023, for the first time in almost three quarters of a century, a monarch was crowned in England. A few days later a friend of mine scoffed, "What a waste of time and energy! What is the point of a king?"

I'm a proud American who wants neither theocracy nor monarchical restoration. I like our democratic republic. But the coronation of King Charles reminded me of something needed in every person and community: confidence in the future. The king's most basic role is to symbolize the unity of the nation. In England, the parliament members handle many of the practical duties of governance. But the king or queen can do what they cannot: embody in a single person the reality and future of a whole nation. To say, "this is our king" is to say, "we exist as a community, and we have a future." Kingship isn't primarily about the power of one person or family. It's about the enduring identity and unity of the whole.

To say Christ is our King is to say we exist as a people. We are *one in him*. We are, and we will be as long as he is. And since he will be our risen king forever, together we have a future filled with hope. Even the best countries will finally fall. But Christ and his Church will endure forever. What good news! It's not a waste of time to crown a king. We do it all the time. Let's be sure to crown the right one — the one whose kingdom never ends.
