Why go to confession?

Jesus entered this world to forgive sins. Recall the words of our Lord: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him may not die but may have eternal life." (Jn 3:16)

During His public ministry, Jesus preached about the forgiveness of sins: remember the parables of the Prodigal Son (Lk 15:11ff) or the Lost Sheep (Lk 15:1ff), and His teaching that "There will likewise be more joy in heaven over one repentant sinner than over 96 righteous people who have no need to repent." (Lk 15:7)

Jesus Himself forgave sins: remember the story of the woman caught in adultery (Jn 8:1ff) or the woman who washed His feet with her tears. (Lk 7:36ff) He also taught us to pray for forgiveness in the "Our Father:" "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

His mission of reconciliation would climax in His passion, death and resurrection: Jesus suffered, died and rose to free us from sin and death. However, in His divine mercy, Jesus called the sinner to realize the sin, to repent of it, and to be reconciled with God and neighbor. Jesus wanted this ministry of reconciliation to continue. On the first Easter Sunday evening, Jesus appeared to His Apostles, "breathed on them," and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive men's sins, they are forgiven them; if you hold them bound, they are held bound." (Jn 20:21-23) From: www.ewtn.com/catholicism/library/why-go-toconfession-1028



Catholic Q&A Topic: "Thus Says The Lord"

The readings over these past weeks featured the Hebrew priestly prophet Ezekiel, whose name, Bible scholars translate as, "made strong by God." In those particular times of exile, God determined to gather the people of Israel as part of an "everlasting covenant." We read how he bade Ezekiel:

"**Prophesy** to these bones...and say to them...Hear the word of the Lord."

These powerfully prophetic scenarios of scripture are marked by divine action: "*I the Lord have spoken and will act...*"

Q: What does the Church teach about prophecy and the Prophets as part of the fulfillment of God's plan?

A: The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: "Jesus himself stood firmly within the tradition of the prophets. In the Gospel of Like he describes his mission in the world, transforming words of the Prophet Isaiah:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor... to proclaim liberty to captives...to let the oppressed go free."

Prophetic, redemptive action in the scriptures is clearly marked and animated by the power of the Holy Spirit, breathing life into the saving, transformative power of God.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church in Paragraph 64:


"Through the prophets God forms his people in the hope of salvation in the expectation of a new and everlasting Covenant intended for all, to be written on their hearts."

The prophetic books, scholars tell us, bear the names of the four major and twelve minor prophets. The terms "major" and "minor" refer to the length of their respective compositions and not to their relative importance.

Pope Francis writes about something very important:

"A prophet, brothers and sisters is each one of us who, by virtue of baptism, helps others read the present under the action of the Holy Spirit, which helps people understand God's plans and align yourselves with them."

'Do not fear, for I am with you; Do not be afraid, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, I will also help you,



I will also uphold you with My righteous right hand.' Is. 41:10

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

Lately I've been listening to a science-based podcast on healthy daily living. The host frequently discusses the wide range of health benefits of sleep. So, each night I'm trying to get more, and better, slumber, and it's helping me feel energized. So, why in the world should we follow Christ's advice this week? **'Watch therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house will come ... lest he find you asleep.**" Isn't sleep, especially at midnight and cockcrow, a good thing?

Of course, it is. But the wakefulness the Lord calls us to is a deep, personal orientation to Him. A nightly vigil is therefore a metaphor for this, but it's not just that. We should give up real sleep in order to pray, too. This difficult practice is a time-tested way to foster wakefulness of heart. When we give up sleep to pray, it focuses us. We learn that life is not an endless series of days. You and I belong to the Lord — awake or asleep, in life and in death. Sooner or later, even our need for our physical sleep will pass away. And our attentiveness to God that is, whether we are awaiting Him to meet us — will be all that matters.

May I challenge us this week and this Advent to intentionally give up at least one hour of sleep each week for prayer? Stay up later, wake up in the middle of the night, or an hour earlier, and pray. Will we be a bit more tired the next day? Yes. But we'll be amazed at the spiritual wakefulness that results, too.


